## INTRODUCTION

Presented in this publication are revenue freight commodity statistics reported by the under-noted class 1 and 2 common carrier railways operating in Canada:

The franchises and other properties of the Wabash Railroad Company were leased to the Norfolk and Western Railway Company effective October 16, 1964. This report therefore includes statistics covering the Wabash Railroad for period January 1 to October 15, 1964 and statistics for the Norfolk and Western Railway for the period October 16 to December 31, 1964.

Commodity data contained in this report have been reported in accordance with the Canadian Freight Commodity Statistics Classification adopted January 1, 1964 and are based on cumulative monthly returns relating to the period January 1 to December 31, 1964. Certain corrections not appearing in figures published for each month of the year are included herein.

A "common carrier" as referred to in this series means any person who holds himself out to the general public to transport passengers and or goods for compensation.

The terms used in the column headings of this report reflect the following provisions of the instructions to the carriers:

"Originated or loaded" indicates: (a) Revenue freight originated directly on the road of the respondent, including that received from private, non-reporting industrial sidings; (b) Freight not previously given line haul transportation, received from switching roads connecting with the respondent; (c) Imports at lake or ocean ports; (d) Freight reshipped following milling or fabrication at some point in transit.

"Received from U.S. Rail destined to Canadian points" means: Traffic destined to Canadian points received from United States rail connections or transported across the border by the respondent.

"Received from U.S. rail destined to U.S. points" means: Receipts from United States rail connections destined to points in the United States (overhead traffic).

"Terminated or unloaded" means: (a) Freight terminated directly on the road of the respondent, including that delivered to private, non-reporting

industrial sidings and grain unloaded at interior, lake and coastal elevators for export; (b) Freight delivered to switching roads connecting with the respondent where there was no further line haul; (c) Exports at lake or ocean ports; (d) Freight unloaded for milling or fabrication at some point in transit.

"Delivered to U.S. rail connections" means: (a) Traffic delivered to United States rail connections or transported across the border by the respondent; (b) Deliveries to United States rail connections of freight originated in the U.S. and moved overhead through Canada.

Railways operating between Canada and the United States consider that portion of their line south of the border a U.S. rail connection. Thus, freight crossing the International Boundary, whether received from or delivered to another railway at that point or transported by the respondent, is reported as

receipts from or deliveries to U.S. rail connections. Freight interchanged between common carrier railways in Canada does not appear in these statistics since this traffic is included as loaded and unloaded on the respondents' line and would, if repeated, result in a duplication.

The net movement of commodities, as presented in Tables 13 and 14, is the difference between the total tonnage loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail, and the total tonnage unloaded in Canada and delivered to U.S. connections. If, for instance, loadings and receipts in the Western Provinces exceed tonnages unloaded and delivered in that area, the difference must have been carried eastward, either for unloading in the other provinces or for delivery to U.S. rail connections at junction points east of Manitoba. A reversal of this situation would indicate a net movement into the area from points east.

### Summary

A continued high level of economic prosperity coupled with increased improvements in both selling and producing transportation service accounted for a record high volume of traffic handled by railways in 1964. The total of 198,336,565 tons of revenue freight carried by lines in Canada surpassed by 5.7 per cent the previous peak recorded in 1956.

Increased movements were general in all five groups of carload commodities with agricultural products showing the largest percentage increase over the previous year at 21.9 per cent. Mine products rose 18.7 per cent; manufactures and miscellaneous items were up 12.5 per cent; forest products 11.6 per cent; and animal products 8.7 per cent. Less-than-carload traffic with an 11.5 per cent drop continued a well established downward trend. This decline, however, is attributable to the expansion of new intermodal transportation techniques introduced several years ago by the railways for the integrated handling of L.C.L. and small express package freight for which separate volume statistics are not presently available.

In 1964 rail freight traffic showed increases over 1963 in all provinces. Percentage-wise, Alberta led the way with a 30.9 per cent jump, mainly due to heavier loadings of agricultural and mineral products. Quebec, with increased movements of mine products followed with an increase of 22.7 per cent and Saskatchewan with heavier movements of grain was up 18.7 per cent. Rail traffic in New Brunswick and Ontario was up 15.0 per cent in each case; British Columbia rail traffic rose 7.2 per cent; Manitoba 6.0 per cent; Prince Edward Island 5.6 per cent; Newfoundland 4.8 per cent; and Nova Scotia 1.3 per cent.

### Products of Agriculture

Wheat was the largest single agricultural commodity carried in 1964. A bumper crop and large exports to the U.S.S.R., Western Europe and the

Orient, boosted Canadian rail shipments of wheat to 21,153,235 tons, up 29.6 per cent from 1963. Loadings in Saskatchewan accounted for more than half the total wheat movement by rail, up 3,103,989 tons or 31.9 per cent over the previous year. Alberta loadings increased 56.7 per cent but movements originating in Manitoba declined 1.0 per cent from 1963.

Other significant volume movements of agricultural products included barley, (2,706,816 tons); wheat flour, (1,859,956 tons); oats, (1,229,384 tons); and corn, (1,036,602 tons). Flaxseed registered the greatest percentage increase over 1963, rising 78.7 per cent to 655,169 tons. Nearly half of the 1964 movement was loaded in Manitoba, more than double the amount loaded in that province a year earlier.

### Products of Mines

Due mainly to heavier consumer demands and increased over-all mineral production, rail shipments of mine products in Canada were up 18.7 per cent in 1964 to 84,366,675 tons. Iron ore represented 42.5 per cent (35,807,313 tons) of this total, 75.5 per cent of which was reported in the Province of Quebec, Canada's largest producer of iron ore. The gain of 29.3 per cent in iron ore movements in 1964 over 1963 reflected the record set by Canadian iron ore producers in that year and heavier exports to the United States.

Other mine products registering significant increases in 1964 included bituminous coal; gravel and sand; stone and rock and crude gypsum. Fluxing stone and raw dolomite showed the largest percentage gain over 1963 with movements totalling 571,399 tons from 77,614. Over half the 1964 rail movement of this commodity took place in Ontario.



**Manufactures and Miscellaneous**

Newsprint paper at 4,361,162 tons was the largest single manufactured item carried by rail in 1964, up 9.2 per cent from the previous year. Of the 1964 total newsprint movement, 53.6 per cent of the tonnage originated in Quebec, 29.2 per cent originated in Ontario and 6.5 per cent was loaded in British Columbia. Most of the newsprint paper was delivered to United States rail connections for destination outside Canada.

Among other principal commodity movements by rail in the manufactures and miscellaneous class were miscellaneous fuel, road, and petroleum residual oils (3,882,369 tons); fertilizer, including potash (3,693,232 tons); and woodpulp (3,430,735 tons). Manufactured iron and steel registered the largest percentage increase over 1963, rising 34.9 per cent to 3,328,765 tons. Movements in the Province of Ontario accounted for more than half the iron and steel total. Gasoline carried by railway tank cars dropped 5.4 per cent in 1964 to 2,759,633 tons.

**Products of Forests**

Lumber, shingles and lath of the forest products group was the commodity classification carried in largest volume in 1964, totalling 7,191,072 tons, up 4.2 per cent from 1963. Nearly 65.0 per cent of the lumber, shingles and lath movement originated in British Columbia. Pulpwood continued to rank second in rail tonnage among forest products, increasing 24.3 per cent to 6,021,990 tons in 1964. Ontario and Quebec together accounted for over 64 per cent of the originating movement.

Other forest product classifications moved in large volume included logs, butts and bolts (2,558,199 tons) and veneer, plywood and built-up wood (989,329 tons).

**Animals and Products**

Rail livestock movements increased 12.7 per cent in 1964 to 362,527 tons with cattle and calves accounting for the largest portion at 231,713 tons. Most of the domestic livestock movement appeared to be from West to East with 103,820 tons terminating in Ontario. Animal products carried by the railways in large volume included fresh meat (641,320 tons) and hides, skins and pelts (124,058 tons). Butter movements increased 41.2 per cent over 1963 and registered the largest percentage gain in the animal products group.

**Commodity Ratios**

A division, by weight, of total rail freight tonnages in 1964 was as follows: products of agriculture accounted for 18.0 per cent of all rail carload traffic; animals and products, 0.8 per cent; products of mines 42.5 per cent; products of forests 8.9 per cent; manufactures and miscellaneous, 29.3 per cent and L.C.L. freight 0.5 per cent. While the above noted percentages are based on data containing United States to United States traffic moving through Canada, Chart 1 shows a ten-year ratio pattern of commodity movements by rail excluding such overhead intransient movements. Duplications of traffic interchanged between Canadian carriers are also included.

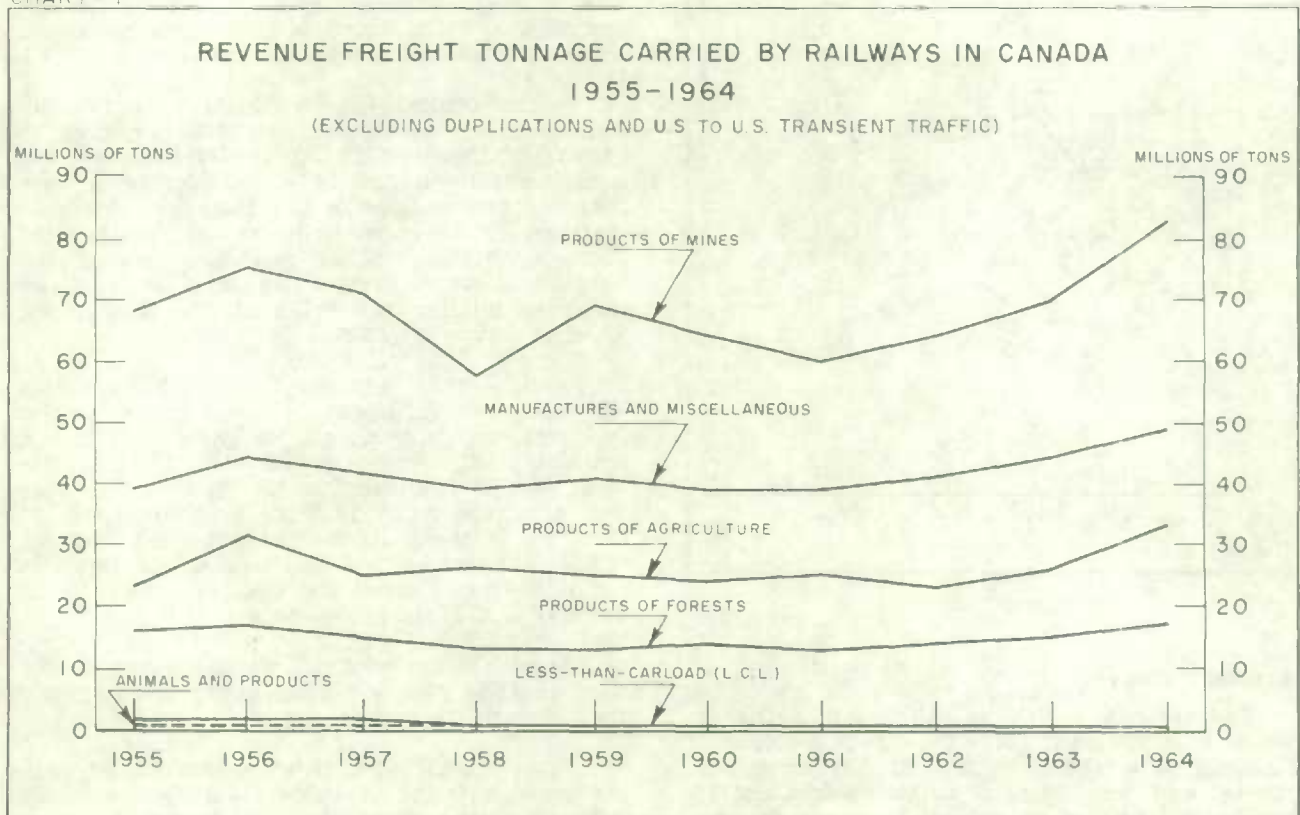
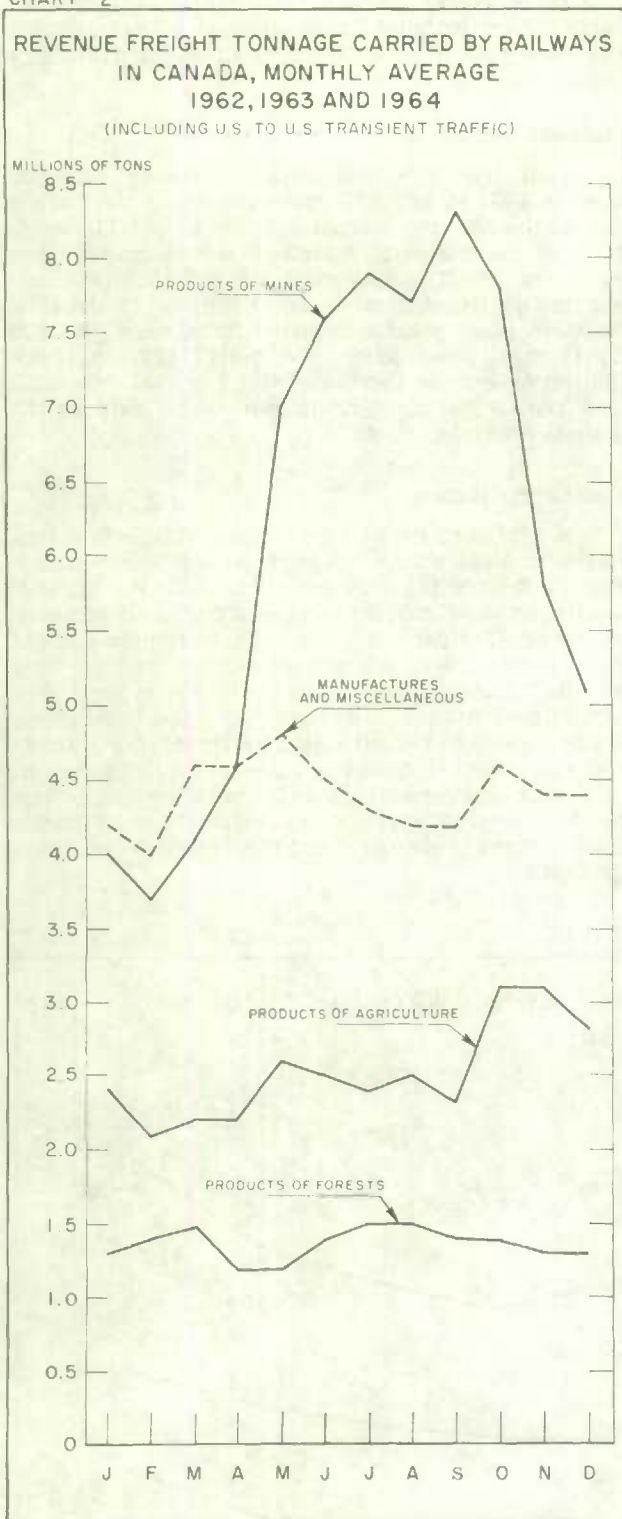

### Seasonal Pattern

The seasonal pattern of rail freight traffic in Canada is most significant with respect to products of mines. The marked increase in mineral movements between April and October, as shown in Chart 2, bears a relationship to the St. Lawrence Seaway

navigation season. Increased sailings from St. Lawrence River ports during December to March of the past two years, has provided a greater opportunity for winter exports and for the continuation of movements by rail during those months.

Normally, similar correlations occur in the patterns of agricultural and manufactured products and seaway shipping. However, the sale to Russia of a record 228 million bushels of wheat during the 1963-64 crop season pushed monthly average rail tonnages higher than usual in the October, November and December periods on the chart.

The seasonal pattern of forest products is somewhat opposite to that of agriculture.

### Regional Synopsis

On a provincial basis, rail freight carried in 1964 showed increased movements in all provinces. Tonnages originated in the Atlantic Region, comprising Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick (including loadings from local industry, receipts from water imports and U.S. rail) amounted to 18,301,010 tons, up 5.0 per cent over 1963. Tonnages terminated during the same period in the Atlantic Region (including unloadings for domestic consumption, water exports and deliveries to U.S. rail connections) totalled 18,462,303, an increase of 10.4 per cent. The resulting net movement of 161,293 tons from other provinces was a reversal of the 1963 situation when a net movement of 704,982 tons was delivered to other provinces. The items mainly responsible for the pattern change in 1964 were increased shipments into the Atlantic Region of wheat, chemicals and fertilizer. Commodities which moved outward included potatoes, sea food, bituminous coal, and crude gypsum.

In the Central Region (Quebec and Ontario) originating freight increased 22.7 per cent to 54,367,186 tons and 15.0 per cent to 65,832,170 tons, respectively, in 1964. Mine products were primarily responsible for the increase in Quebec loadings, while mine products and manufactured goods contributed to the greater volume of rail freight in Ontario. Freight terminated in these two provinces totalled 51,829,735 tons in Quebec and 56,491,138 tons in Ontario.

In the Prairie and Pacific Region comprising Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia, commodity movements by rail were higher, increasing 16.5 per cent on the whole to 59,841,199 tons. Freight terminated in the Western Provinces was also higher, up 10.6 per cent to 41,600,781 tons. As in the past, the net movement of goods (18,240,418 tons in 1964) was outward from this area for delivery to Central and Eastern Canada or for delivery to U.S. rail connections.

Wheat was the principal commodity moved eastward in 1964 with a net movement of 11,503,971 tons; most of this was for export.

Other significant eastward movements of western produce included; lumber, shingles and lath, 2,348,128 tons (2,263,703 in 1963); fertilizer,

758,224 (499,666); woodpulp, 644,543 (590,158); flaxseed, 395,786 (185,317); bituminous coal, 270,255 (113,983); and gravel and sand, 89,757 (395).

Freight entering the Prairie and Pacific Region from points East consisted for the most part of manufactured products. Among the most important of these, from a tonnage standpoint, were manufactured iron and steel, 340,459 tons; passenger automobiles, 219,977 tons; newsprint paper, 270,564 tons; food

products in cans and packages, 224,405 tons; and miscellaneous manufactured items, 384,429 tons.

Revenue freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada amounted to 9.4 million tons, the same as in the previous year. The most significant rail imports were: phosphate rock (1,123,266 tons); scrap iron and steel (521,797 tons); bituminous coal, (497,912 tons); industrial sand, (412,828 tons) and coke, (410,986 tons).

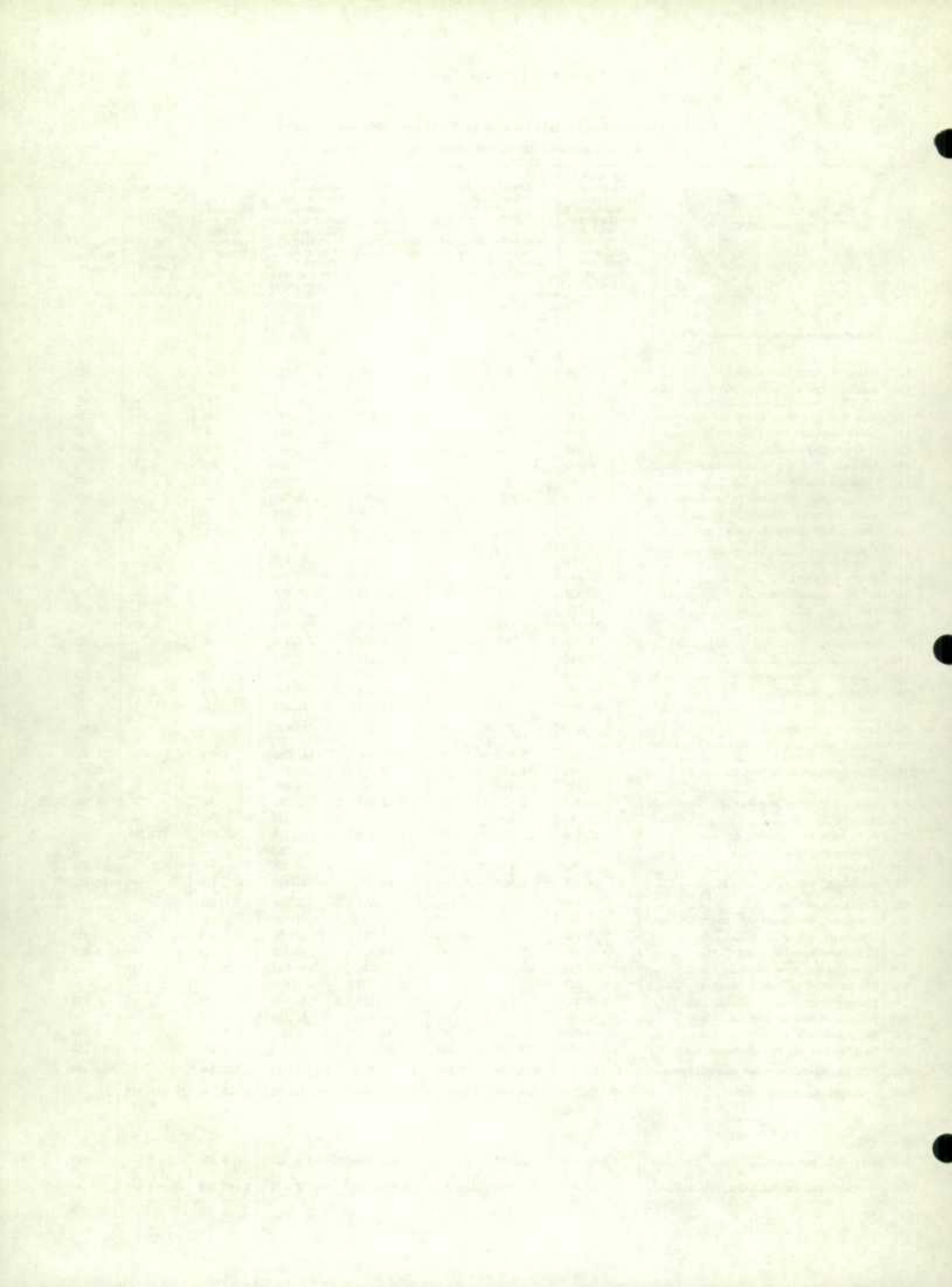

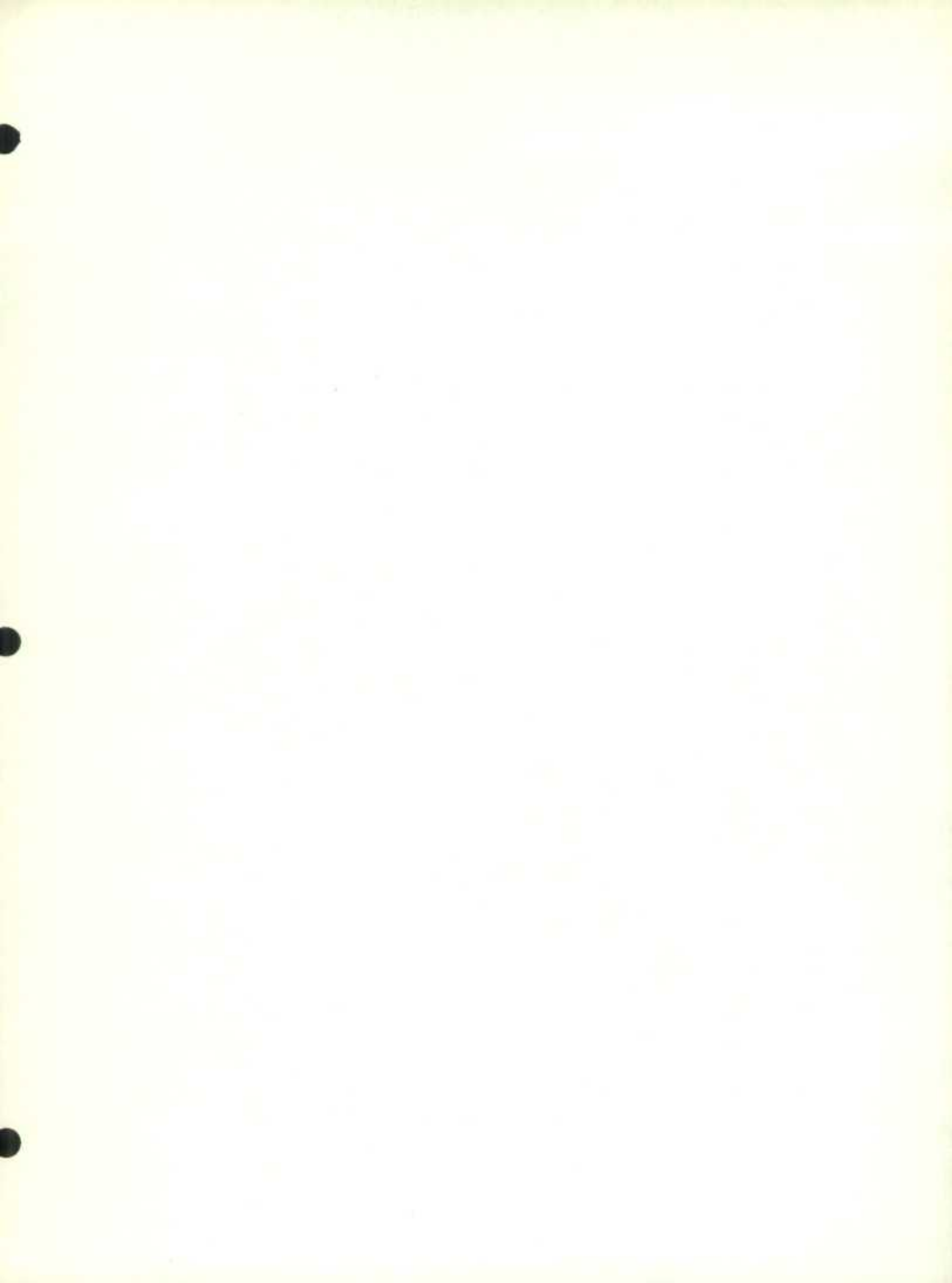
