During 1965 the Arnaud Railway and the Wabush Lake Railway in Quebec and Newfoundland, respectively, were added to the list of reporting companies.

Commodity data contained herein have been reported in accordance with the Canadian Freight Commodity Statistics Classification adopted January 1, 1957, and are based on cumulative monthly returns relating to the period January 1 to December 31, 1965.

A "common carrier", as referred to in this series, means any railway which holds itself out to the general public to transport passengers and or goods for compensation.

The terms used in the column headings of this report reflect the following provisions of the instructions to the carriers:

"Originated or loaded" indicates: (a) Revenue freight originated directly on the road of the respondent, including that received from private, non-reporting industrial sidings; (b) freight not previously given line haul transportation, received from switching roads connecting with the respondent; (c) Imports at lake or ocean ports; (d) Freight reshipped following milling or fabrication at some point in transit.

"Received from U.S. Rail destined to Canadian points" means: Traffic destined to Canadian points received from United States rail connections or transported across the border by the respondent.

"Received from U.S. rail destined to U.S. points" means: Receipts from United States rail connections destined to points in the United States (overhead traffic).

"Terminated or unloaded" means: (a) Freight terminated directly on the road of the respondent, including that delivered to private, non-reporting

industrial sidings and grain unloaded at interior, lake and coastal elevators for export; (b) Freight delivered to switching roads connecting with the respondent where there was no further line haul; (c) Exports at lake or ocean ports; (d) Freight unloaded for milling or fabrication at some point in transit.

"Delivered to U.S. rail connections" means: (a) Traffic delivered to United States rail connections or transported across the border by the respondent; (b) Deliveries to United States rail connections of freight originated in the U.S. and moved overhead through Canada.

Railways operating between Canada and the United States consider that portion of their line south of the border a U.S. rail connection. Thus, freight crossing the International Boundary, whether received from or delivered to another railway at that point or transported by the respondent, is reported as

receipts from or deliveries to U.S. rail connections. Freight interchanged between common carrier railways in Canada does not appear in these statistics since this traffic is included as loaded and unloaded on the respondents' line and would, if repeated, result in a duplication.

The net movement of commodities, as presented in Tables 13 and 14, is the difference between the total tonnage loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail, and the total tonnage unloaded in Canada and delivered to U.S. connections. If, for instance, loadings and receipts in the Western Provinces exceed tonnages unloaded and delivered in that area, the difference must have been carried eastward, either for unloading in the other provinces or for delivery to U.S. rail connections at junction points east of Manitoba. A reversal of this situation would indicate a net movement into the area from points east.

Summary

The volume of freight handled by railway lines in Canada during 1965 was an all-time high of 205,197,196 tons, an increase of 3.5 per cent over the previous record of 1964 and 9.4 per cent over 1956 which was also a notably good year for the railways.

Increased movements were recorded for three of the five carload commodity groups. Products of mines registered the largest percentage increase at 8.4 per cent; manufactured and miscellaneous items were up 7.5 per cent; and products of forests rose 3.8 per cent. Products of agriculture declined 14.9 per cent and animals and products were down 12.1 per cent.

Less-than-carload freight with a 28.5 per cent increase reversed the downward trend established during recent years. Most of the 1965 increase was attributable to the Canadian National Railways.

In 1965 rail freight traffic was up over the previous year in seven of the ten provinces. Newfoundland rail movements more than tripled those of 1964, due mainly to the addition of Wabush Lake Railway statistics in that province. British Columbia with increased movements of forest products ranked second, increasing 8.0 per cent. Rail traffic in Manitoba rose 6.8 per cent; Nova Scotia was up 5.0 per cent; Ontario 4.2 per cent; Quebec 2.0 per cent and New Brunswick 1.8 per cent. Rail movements in Saskatchewan fell 9.3 per cent; Alberta 3.8 per cent and Prince Edward Island 0.5 per cent.

Products of Mines

Rail movements of iron ore rose 8.7 per cent to 38,906,329 tons during 1965 with the Wabush Lake and Arnaud Railways being mainly responsible for the increase. Iron ore accounted for 42.5 per cent of all mine products carried by rail and 69.1 per cent of the mineral total moved in the Province of Quebec, Canada's largest producer of iron ore.

Bituminous coal continued to rank second in tonnage among mine products, up 4.3 per cent to 10,595,436 tons. Other commodities showing significant increases were: copper-nickel ore and concentrates movements; zinc ore and concentrates; stone and rock: broken, ground and crushed and sulphur. Crude gypsum moved by railways dropped 3.7 per cent to 4,709,639 tons.

Manufactures and Miscellaneous

Newsprint paper was the largest single manufactured item carried by rail in 1965, totalling 4,628,567 tons, up 6.1 per cent from the previous year. Of the total movement, 51.9 per cent of the tonnage originated in Quebec and 28.7 per cent in Ontario, and most of this total was delivered to United States rail connections for delivery outside of Canada.

Other significant volume movements in the manufactures and miscellaneous class were fertilizers, mainly potash, (4,557,508 tons); fuel, road, and petroleum residual oils, (4,158,560 tons); wood-pulp, (3,538,009 tons); manufactured iron and steel, (3,380,289 tons). Scrap iron and scrap steel showed the largest percentage increase over 1964, rising 31.8 per cent to 2,188,911 tons. Over half the 1965 rail movement of this commodity took place in Ontario. Animal and poultry feed carried in freight cars declined 5.7 per cent to 1,314,328 tons.

Products of Forests

Pulpwood at 7,187,141 tons was the largest single forest product moved by rail in 1965, up 19.3 per cent from the previous year. Ontario and Quebec together accounted for 59.4 per cent of the movement originating in Canada. Lumber, shingles and lath on the other hand declined 5.2 per cent to 6,814,319 tons from 7,191,072. The greater portion of these items originated in British Columbia.

Products of Agriculture

Products of agriculture declined 14.9 per cent from 1964 to 30,347,156 tons. Increased grain shipments resulting from new wheat sales to Russia during the latter part of 1965 were not able to offset declines registered earlier in the year. Thus wheat tonnages at 17,153,702 tons dropped 18.9 per cent from the earlier year. Saskatchewan accounted for 56.8 per cent of the 1965 wheat movement and Alberta originated 20.2 per cent.

Other significant decreases in agricultural products occurred for barley, down 16.8 per cent; wheat flour down 17.8 per cent and mill products down 20.2 per cent.

Animals and Products

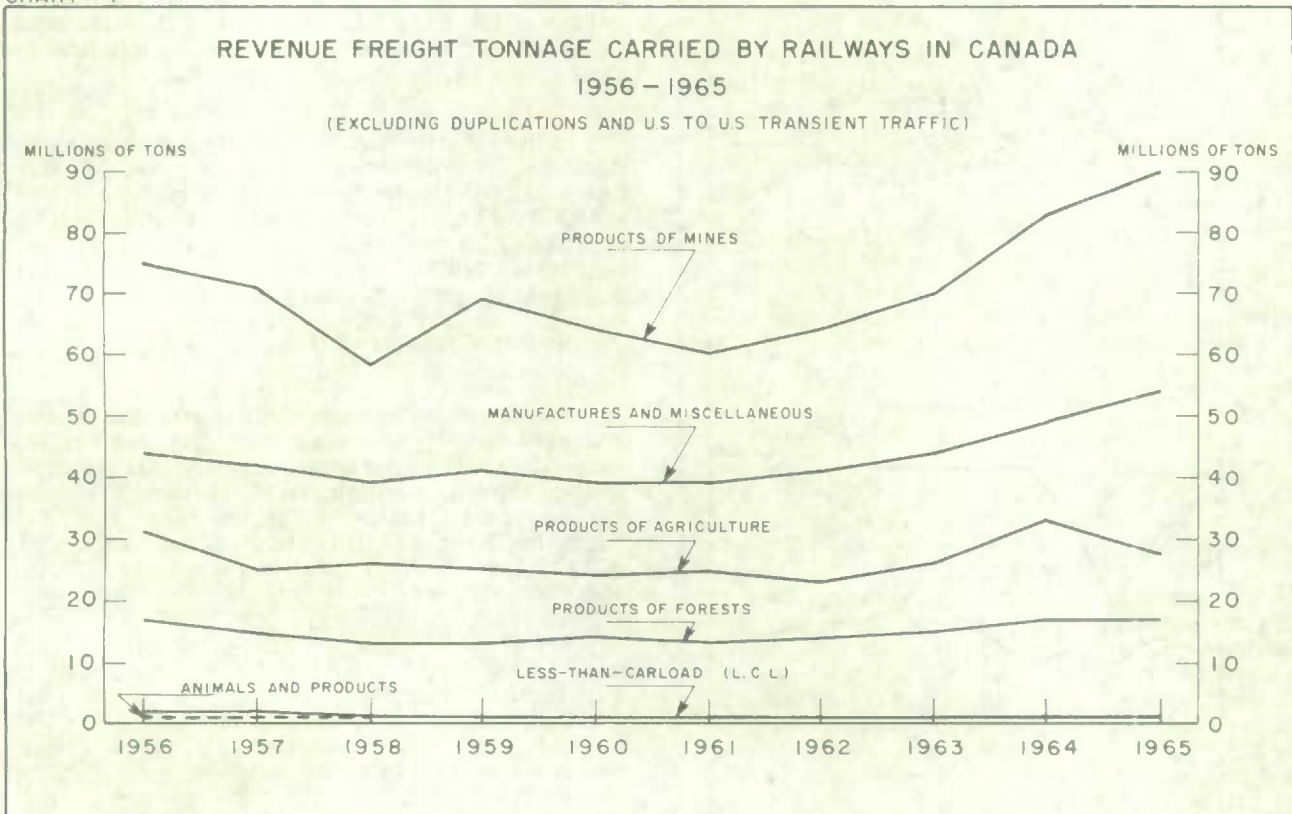
Livestock movements by rail in 1965 declined 1.9 per cent to 355,721 tons. Cattle and calves were the largest class of the livestock category in 1965,

amounting to 246,183 tons in contrast to 231,713 tons in 1964. Other animal products carried in large volume by trains included fresh meat (507,986 tons) and hides, skins and pelts (126,826 tons).

Commodity Ratios

A division, by weight, of total rail freight tonnages in 1965 was as follows: products of agriculture accounted for 14.8 per cent of all rail carload traffic; animals and products, 0.7 per cent; products of mines, 44.6 per cent; products of forests, 8.9 per cent; manufactures and miscellaneous, 30.4 per cent and L.C.L. freight 0.6 per cent. While the above noted percentages are based on data containing United States to United States traffic moving through Canada, Chart 1 shows a ten-year ratio pattern of commodity movements by rail excluding such overhead intransient movements. Duplications resulting from traffic interchanged between Canadian carriers are also included.

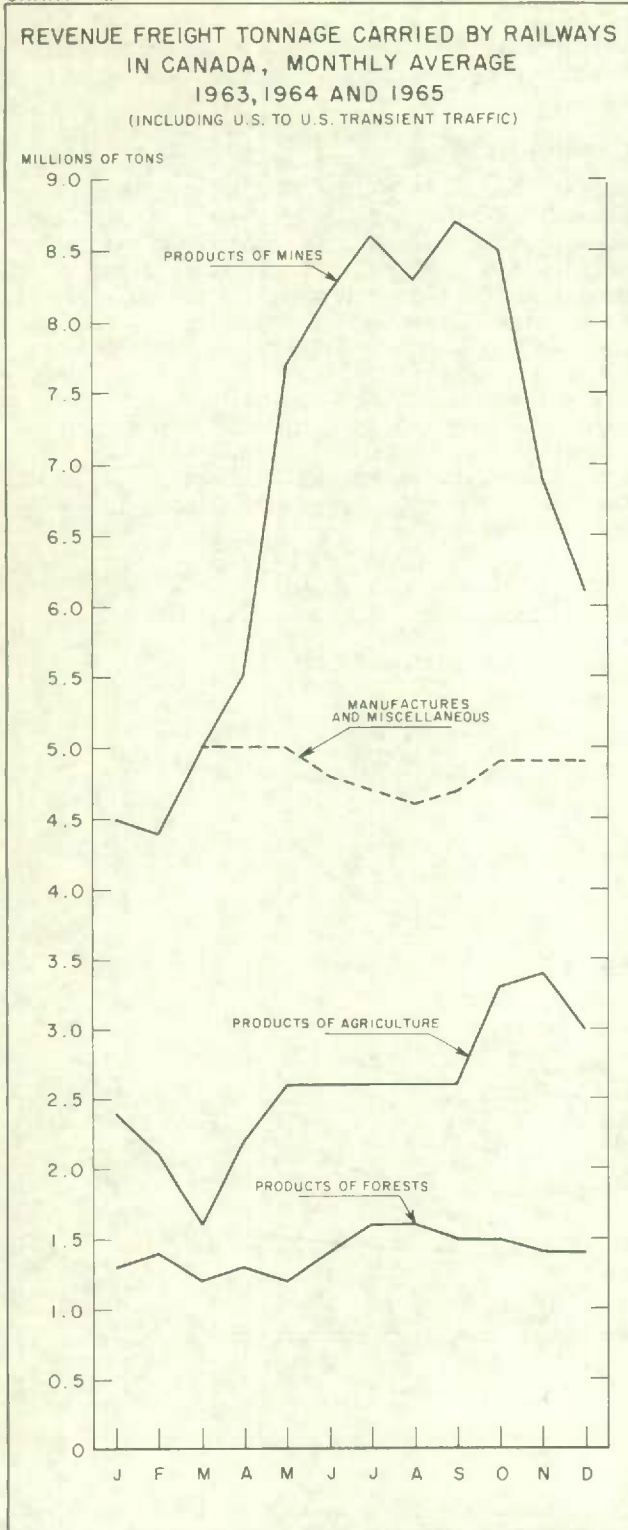
Seasonal Pattern

The seasonal pattern of rail freight traffic in Canada is most significant with respect to products of mines. The greater volume of traffic moving by rail between April and October, as shown in Chart 2, bears a relationship to the St. Lawrence Seaway navigation season. Increased vessel movements from St. Lawrence River ports (Montreal and below) during recent winter months has aided the railways

in maintaining a fairly high level of traffic during the November — March period.

Similar correlations normally occur in the patterns of agricultural and manufactured movements and seaway shipping. Unusually heavy exports of grain during recent crop seasons, however, has tended to push monthly average rail tonnages of agricultural shipments higher than usual during the fall months.

Regional Synopsis

On a provincial basis, rail freight carried in 1965 showed increases in seven of the ten provinces. Tonnages originated in the Atlantic Region, com-

prising Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick (including loadings from local industry, receipts from water imports and U.S. rail) aggregated 21,928,984 tons, an increase of 19.8 per cent over the previous year. Tonnages terminated during the same period in the Atlantic Region (including unloadings for domestic consumption, water exports and deliveries to U.S. rail connections) totalled 19,949,597 tons, up 8.1 per cent. The resulting net movement of 1,979,387 tons to other provinces was a reversal of the 1964 situation when a net movement of 161,293 tons was received from other provinces. The inclusion of iron ore loadings of the Wabush Lake Railway in Newfoundland was mainly responsible for the pattern change in 1965. Other commodities moved outward included potatoes, bituminous coal, and woodpulp.

In the Central Region (Quebec and Ontario) originating traffic rose 2.0 per cent to 55,461,155 tons and 4.2 per cent to 68,579,104 tons, respectively, in 1965. Manufactured goods showed the greatest increase in Quebec while mine products and manufactured goods contributed to the greater volume of rail freight in Ontario. Freight terminated in these two provinces totalled 60,774,094 tons in Quebec and 80,768,100 tons in Ontario.

In the Prairie and Pacific Region comprising Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia, rail shipments were lower by 0.1 per cent at 59,227,953 tons. Freight terminated in the Western Provinces, on the other hand, increased 5.1 per cent to 43,706,864 tons. As in the past, the net movement of goods (15,521,089 tons) was outward from this area for delivery to Central and Eastern Canada or for delivery to U.S. rail connections.

Wheat was the principal commodity moved eastward in 1965 with a net movement of 8,852,411 tons. Other significant eastward movements included: lumber, shingles and lath, 2,186,806 tons (2,348,128 tons in 1964); barley, 1,228,806 tons (1,207,515 tons); fertilizer, 974,060 tons (758,224 tons); oats, 777,088 tons (563,199 tons) and woodpulp, 703,607 tons (644,543 tons).

Freight entering the Prairie and Pacific Region from points East consisted for the most part of manufactured products. Among the most important of these, tonnage-wise, were: manufactured iron and steel, 399,281 tons; newsprint paper, 287,970 tons; passenger automobiles, 269,200 tons; food products in cans and packages, 245,038 tons and miscellaneous manufactured items 450,084 tons.

Revenue freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada amounted to 11.3 million tons, up 21.0 per cent from the previous year. The most significant rail imports were: phosphate rock, 1,365,611 tons; coke, 769,325 tons; scrap iron and scrap steel, 765,206 tons; industrial sand, 710,966 tons; bituminous coal, 638,641 tons; vehicle parts, 497,111 and anthracite coal, 433,894 tons.
