## INTRODUCTION

### Coverage

Presented in this publication are revenue freight commodity statistics reported by the under-noted class 1 and 2 common carrier railways operating in Canada:

Commodity data contained herein have been reported in accordance with the Canadian Freight Commodity Statistics Classification adopted January 1, 1957, and are based on cumulative monthly returns relating to the period January 1 to December 31, 1965.

A "common carrier", as referred to in this series, means any railway which holds itself out to the general public to transport passengers and or goods for compensation.

The terms used in the column headings of this report reflect the following provisions of the instructions to the carriers:

"Originated or loaded" indicates: (a) Revenue freight originated directly on the road of the respondent, including that received from private, non-reporting industrial sidings; (b) freight not previously given line haul transportation, received from switching roads connecting with the respondent; (c) Imports at lake or ocean ports; (d) Freight reshipped following milling or fabrication at some point in transit.

"Received from U.S. Rail destined to Canadian points" means: Traffic destined to Canadian points received from United States rail connections or transported across the border by the respondent.

"Received from U.S. rail destined to U.S. points" means: Receipts from United States rail connections destined to points in the United States (overhead traffic).

"Terminated or unloaded" means: (a) Freight terminated directly on the road of the respondent, including that delivered to private, non-reporting

industrial sidings and grain unloaded at interior, lake and coastal elevators for export; (b) Freight delivered to switching roads connecting with the respondent where there was no further line haul; (c) Exports at lake or ocean ports; (d) Freight unloaded for milling or fabrication at some point in transit.

"Delivered to U.S. rail connections" means: (a) Traffic delivered to United States rail connections or transported across the border by the respondent; (b) Deliveries to United States rail connections of freight originated in the U.S. and moved overhead through Canada.

Railways operating between Canada and the United States for purposes of this report consider that portion of their line south of the border a U.S. rail connection. Thus, freight crossing the International Boundary, whether received from or delivered to another railway at that point or transported by the respondent, is reported as receipts from or deliveries to U.S. rail connections. Freight interchanged between common carrier railways in Canada does not appear in these statistics since this traffic is included as loaded and unloaded on the respondents' line and would, if repeated result in a duplication.

The net movement of commodities, as presented in Tables 14 and 15 is the difference between the total tonnage loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail, and the total tonnage unloaded in Canada and delivered to U.S. connections. If, for instance, loadings and receipts in the Western Provinces exceed tonnages unloaded and delivered in that area, the difference must have been carried eastward, either for unloading in the other provinces or for delivery to U.S. rail connections at junction points east of Manitoba. A reversal of this situation would indicate a net movement into the area from points east.

Traffic originated and terminated in Newfoundland by the Quebec North Shore and Labrador Railway, which in previous years was included with Quebec data, is included with Newfoundland freight in this report. Also, traffic carried by Canadian Nationals' Great Slave Lake Railway operation, formerly included in Alberta, and traffic of the White Pass and Yukon Railway, previously shown with British Columbia traffic, are now presented in a separate geographic breakdown and headed, "Yukon and Northwest Territories". Previous year tonnages for the above noted areas have not been restated, and therefore caution should be exercised in making year-to-year comparisons.

Among work stoppages which adversely affected Canadian railway operations during the year 1966 was one in the trucking industry in Ontario which occurred throughout the period January to April. A strike of machinists and iron workers in Northeastern Quebec slowed iron ore movements in July and an express freight handlers walkout in

Toronto and Montreal during August took its toll in that department. A national rail strike occurred in Canada between August 26 and September 2 and on the West Coast, Pacific Great Eastern operations were halted for nearly a month, beginning the latter part of September. A strike at the Algoma Steel Mills in December affected operations of the Algoma Central Railway.

### Summary

The volume of freight handled by railway lines in Canada during 1966 reached an all-time record of 214,381,060 tons, an increase of 4.5 per cent over the previous high established in 1965, and 8.1 per cent over 1964 which was also a notably good year for the railways.

Increased movements were recorded in three of the five commodity groups. Products of agriculture registered the largest percentage increase at 16.0 per cent while products of forests were up 8.3 per cent and manufactured and miscellaneous items rose 5.5 per cent. Animals and products declined 6.5 per cent and products of mines were down 0.3 per cent. Less-than-carload freight declined 21.4 per cent.

Rail freight traffic increased in seven of the ten provinces. Newfoundland rail movements more than tripled those of 1965 due mainly to larger movements of mine products resulting from inclusion of Q.N.S. & L. Newfoundland traffic (see note under "Coverage"). Saskatchewan with increased movements of products of agriculture ranked second, increasing 23.7 per cent. Rail traffic in Alberta, rose 9.2 per cent despite the removal of N.W.T. operations of the Great Slave Lake Railway. Manitoba was up 7.8 per cent; British Columbia, rose 3.6 per cent; New Brunswick 2.5 per cent and Ontario 1.0 per cent. Rail movements in Quebec fell 15.3 per cent (see note under "Coverage"); Prince Edward Island declined 11.8 per cent and Nova Scotia traffic was down 4.1 per cent.

### Products of Agriculture

Rail movements of agricultural products rose 16.0 per cent over 1965 to 35,217,899 tons. Wheat was the largest single agricultural product in 1966, up 27.6 per cent from the previous year. Saskatchewan accounted for 58.6 per cent of the 1966 wheat movement and Alberta contributed 21.5 per cent of this commodity.

### Products of Forests

Pulpwood at 8,760,906 tons was the largest single forest product moved by rail in 1966, up 21.9 per cent from the previous year. Ontario and Quebec together accounted for 25.6 per cent of the pulpwood movement. The movement of lumber, shingles and lath in Canada declined 3.5 per cent to 6,576,590 tons from 6,814,319 with the greater portion of this traffic originating in British Columbia.



### Manufactures and Miscellaneous

Fertilizer, which includes potash movements, was the largest single manufactured item carried by rail in 1966, and totalled 5,598,909 tons, up 30.7 per cent from the previous year. Of the total movement of this product 56.2 per cent originated in Saskatchewan. Other significant increases in manufactured and miscellaneous items were: road, fuel and petroleum residual oils, (4,268,041 tons); manufactured iron and steel, (3,578,900 tons); wood-pulp, (3,815,162 tons); and newsprint paper, (4,890,793 tons).

### Animals and Products

Livestock movements by rail in 1966 declined 6.3 per cent to 333,399 tons. Cattle and calves was the largest class in the livestock category in 1966, accounting for 250,370 tons or 75.1 per cent of the total. This compared with 246,183 tons or 69.2 per cent of the 1965 animal aggregate. Products of animals carried in large volume included fresh meats (475,056 tons) and hides, skins and pelts (120,926 tons).

### Products of Mines

Although products of mines on the whole declined 0.3 per cent to 91,203,351 tons, iron ore loadings continued to increase over the year, up 0.9

per cent over 1965. Iron ore accounted for 43.0 per cent of all mine products carried by rail the greater portion of which was in Quebec; Canada's largest producer of this commodity.

Bituminous coal continued to rank second in tonnage but declined 0.5 per cent to 10,041,095 tons over the previous year. Other significant decreases occurred in: copper-nickel ore and concentrates; gravel and sand; stone and rock; broken, ground or crushed; and crude gypsum.

### Commodity Ratios

A division, by weight, of total rail freight tonnages in 1966 was as follows: products of agriculture accounted for 16.4 per cent of all rail carload traffic; animals and products, 0.6 per cent; products of mines 42.5 per cent; products of forests 9.2 per cent; manufactures and miscellaneous, 30.7 per cent and l.c.l. freight 0.5 per cent. While the above noted percentages are based on data containing United States to United States traffic moving through Canada, Chart 1 shows a ten-year ratio pattern of commodity movements by rail excluding these overhead intransient movements. Duplications resulting from traffic interchanged between Canadian carriers are also excluded.

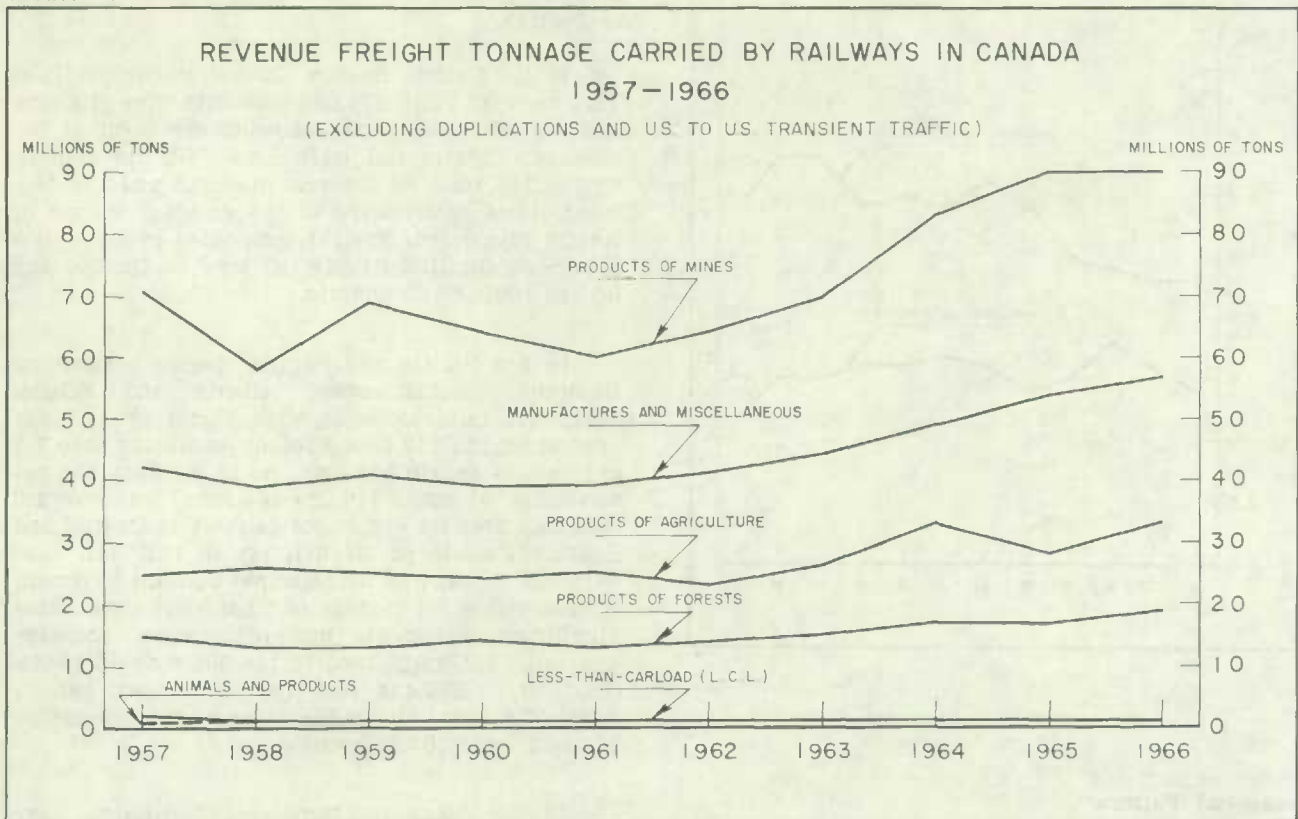
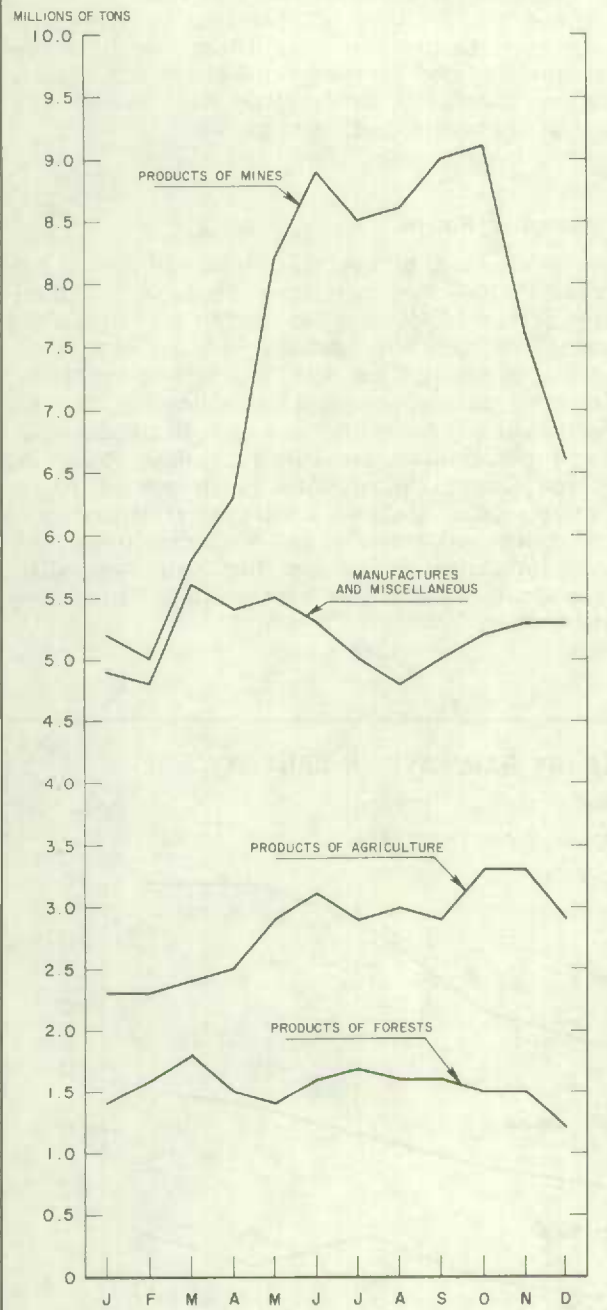

### Seasonal Pattern

The greater volume of traffic moving by rail between April and October as shown in Chart 2, bears a certain relationship to the St. Lawrence

Seaway navigation season. Increased vessel movements from St. Lawrence River ports (Montreal and below) during recent winter months have aided the railways in maintaining a fairly high level of traffic during the November-March period.

The seasonal pattern of rail freight traffic in Canada is most significant with respect to products of mines, but similar correlations normally occur in the patterns of agricultural and manufactured movements and seaway shipping. Unusually heavy exports of grain during recent crop seasons, however, has tended to push monthly shipments higher than usual during the fall months.

### Regional Synopsis

Tonnages originated in the Atlantic Region, which comprises Newfoundland (including Labrador), Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick and which includes loadings from local industry, receipts from waterborne imports and U.S. rail connections, aggregated 31,223,733 tons, an increase of 42.4 per cent over the previous year. Tonnages terminated during the same period in the Atlantic Region (including unloadings for domestic consumption, waterborne exports and deliveries to U.S. rail connections) dropped only slightly to 19,927,740 tons. As a result, a net outward movement of 11,295,993 tons was recorded. Iron ore was the main commodity outbound from the area with potatoes and bituminous coal ranking second and third, respectively.

In the Central Region, Quebec traffic declined 15.3 per cent to 46,977,996 tons with mine products and manufactured goods showing the greatest decreases. Ontario rail traffic rose 1.0 per cent to 69,282,245 tons, with forest products and manufactured items contributing to the greatest volume of freight originated. Freight terminated in these two provinces totalled 61,685,726 tons in Quebec and 85,896,150 tons in Ontario.

In the Prairie and Pacific Region comprising Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia, rail shipments were higher by 11.7 per cent at 66,155,233 tons. Freight terminated rose 7.3 per cent to 46,900,549 tons. As in the past, the net movement of goods (19,254,684 tons) was outward from this area for export, for delivery to Central and Eastern Canada or for delivery to U.S. rail connections. Wheat was the principal outward movement in 1966 with a net tonnage of 12,360,095 tons. Other significant movements included: lumber, shingles and lath, 2,222,322 tons (2,186,806 tons in 1965); fertilizer, 1,290,424 tons (974,060 tons); barley, 1,283,332 tons (1,228,806 tons); and woodpulp, 773,602 tons (703,607 tons).

In the Yukon and Northwest Territories, mine products accounted for 91.2 per cent of tonnage originated. The principal commodities moved were: zinc ore and concentrates, lead ore and concent-

rates, asbestos and other ores and concentrates. Manufactured goods were the main commodities contained in the return movements to those areas.

Revenue freight received from United States rail connections in 1966 destined to points in

Canada amounted to 11.4 million tons, up 0.2 per cent from the previous year. The most significant rail imports were: phosphate rock, 1,621,061 tons; industrial sand, 807,613 tons; coke 768,622 tons; scrap iron and scrap steel, 566,127 tons; bituminous coal, 443,057 and anthracite coal, 410,695 tons.
