Coverage

Presented in this publication are revenue freight commodity statistics reported by the under-noted class 1 and 2 common carrier railways operating in Canada:

Commodity data contained herein have been reported in accordance with the Canadian Freight Commodity Statistics Classification adopted January 1, 1957, and are based on cumulative monthly returns relating to the period January 1 to December 31, 1967.

A "common carrier", as referred to in this series, means any railway which holds itself out to the general public to transport passengers and or goods for compensation.

The terms used in the column headings of this report reflect the following provisions of the instructions to the carriers:

"Originated or loaded" indicates: (a) Revenue freight originated directly on the road of the respondent, including that received from private, non-reporting industrial sidings; (b) freight not previously given line haul transportation, received from switching roads connecting with the respondent; (c) Imports at lake or ocean ports; (d) Freight reshipped following milling or fabrication at some point in transit.

"Received from U.S. Rail destined to Canadian points" means: Traffic destined to Canadian points received from United States rail connections or transported across the border by the respondent.

"Received from U.S. rail destined to U.S. points" means: Receipts from United States rail connections destined to points in the United States (overhead traffic).

"Terminated or unloaded" means: (a) Freight terminated directly on the road of the respondent, including that delivered to private, non-reporting

industrial sidings and grain unloaded at interior, lake and coastal elevators for export; (b) Freight delivered to switching roads connecting with the respondent where there was no further line haul; (c) Exports at lake or ocean ports; (d) Freight unloaded for milling or fabrication at some point in transit.

"Delivered to U.S. rail connections" means: (a) Traffic delivered to United States rail connections or transported across the border by the respondent; (b) Deliveries to United States rail connections of freight originated in the U.S. and moved overhead through Canada.

For purposes of this report railways operating between Canada and the United States consider that portion of their line south of the border a U.S. rail connection. Thus, freight crossing the International Boundary, whether received from or delivered to another railway at that point or transported by the respondent, is reported as receipts from or deliveries to U.S. rail connections. Freight interchanged between common carrier railways in Canada does not appear in these statistics since this traffic is included as loaded and unloaded on the respondents' line and would, if repeated, result in a duplication.

The net movement of commodities, as presented in Tables 14 and 15, is the difference between the total tonnage loaded in a given area and received from U.S. rail, and the total tonnage unloaded in Canada and delivered to U.S. connections. If, for instance, loading and receipts in the Western Provinces exceed tonnages unloaded and delivered in that area, the difference must have been carried eastward, either for unloading in the other provinces or for delivery to U.S. rail connections at junction points east of Manitoba. A reversal of this situation would indicate a net movement into the area from points east.

Summary

The volume of freight handled by railways in Canada during 1967 declined by 2.3 per cent to 209,453,356 tons from the all-time high of 214,381,060 tons established in 1966.

Reduced movements were recorded for two of the five major commodity groups with products of agriculture registering the largest decrease at 16.4 per cent. Manufactured and miscellaneous items fell 0.4 per cent.

Volume increases of 4.8 per cent were recorded for forest products; 0.7 per cent for animals and products; and 0.5 per cent for mine products.

Less-than-carload freight was down 29.6 per cent from 1966 and 37.6 per cent from the previous five year average.

Geographically, rail freight traffic declined in six of the eleven designated areas. In Manitoba movements decreased 17.8 per cent; in Saskatchewan

11.6 per cent; in Nova Scotia 10.1 per cent; in Ontario 3.9 per cent; in Quebec 0.9 per cent and in New Brunswick 0.2 per cent. Freight traffic moved by rail in the Yukon and Northwest Territories increased 17.3 per cent; in Newfoundland tonnage rose 13.1 per cent; in Prince Edward Island 12.8 per cent; in British Columbia 6.7 per cent and in Alberta 2.0 per cent.

Products of Agriculture

Reduced exports of wheat to the Soviet Union and China in 1967 was an important factor in the 26.8 per cent drop in rail movements of that commodity and the resulting net decline of 16.4 in all agricultural products. Based on the preceding five-year average (1962-66) rail shipments of wheat in 1967 were down 10.9 per cent. Saskatchewan contributed just over three fifths of the wheat loaded by rail in 1967 compared with 58.6 per cent in the previous year, whilst Alberta with 21.5 per cent of all loadings remained about the same as in 1966.

Manufactures and Miscellaneous

Despite a reduction in the overall rail movement of manufactured and miscellaneous commodities, fertilizers (including potash) increased 8.3 per cent to 6,456,404 tons. There were also larger volume movements of fuel, road and petroleum residual oils and woodpulp. Manufactured iron and steel products, on the other hand, dropped 13.2 per cent and newsprint paper was down 1.4 per cent.

Products of Forests

Pulpwood, at 9,802,254 tons, continued to be the largest single forest product moved by rail, increasing 11.9 per cent over 1966. Ontario and Quebec together accounted for 57.6 per cent of the total pulpwood movement. Rail shipments of lumber, timber and lath declined 4.4 per cent to 6,284,206 tons from 6,576,590 with the greater portion of this traffic originating in British Columbia.

Animals and Products

Livestock movements increased 3.6 per cent to 345,566 tons with cattle and calves accounting for 75.0 per cent of this total. Products of animals carried in large volume included fresh meats (510,668 tons as compared to 475,056) and hides, skins and pelts (111,238 tons in contrast to 120,926).

Products of Mines

Carryings of iron ore at 41,731,623 tons were 6.3 per cent above those of 1966 and remained the largest single commodity in the mines category. Movements of iron ore accounted for 45.5 per cent of all mine products moved by rail, with the greater portion of loadings taking place in Quebec, the main producing area.

Bituminous coal continued to rank second in tonnage although in 1967 rail loadings of this commodity declined 4.3 per cent to 9,611,002 tons.

Volume increases were recorded for copper nickel ores and concentrates while gravel and sand; stone and rock; and crude gypsum registered declines.

Commodity Ratios

A division, by weight, of total rail freight tonnages hauled in 1967 was as follows: products of agriculture accounted for 14.1 per cent of all rail carload traffic; animals and products 0.7 per cent; products of mines, 43.8 per cent; products of forests, 9.9 per cent; manufactures and miscellaneous, 31.3 per cent and l.c.l. freight 0.3 per cent.

Seasonal Pattern

The greater volume of traffic moving by rail between April and October as shown in Chart 2,

Note: The above commodity ratios are based on data containing United States to United States traffic moving through Canada while Chart 1 shows a ten-year ratio pattern of commodity movements by rail excluding these overhead intransient movements. Duplications resulting from traffic interchanged between Canadian carriers are also excluded in the chart.

is influenced by the main St. Lawrence Seaway navigation season although increased vessel movements from St. Lawrence River ports (Montreal and below) during recent winter months have aided the railways in maintaining a fairly high level of traffic during the November-March period.

Seasonal patterns in rail freight traffic in Canada are most evident with respect to products of mines, but also normally occur in the patterns of agricultural and manufactured movements. Unusually heavy exports of grain however, have tended to push monthly rail shipments higher than usual during the autumn.

Regional Synopsis

Tonnages originated in the Atlantic Region, which comprises Newfoundland (including Labrador), Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick and which includes loadings from local industry and receipts from waterborne imports and U.S. rail connections, aggregated 31,949,950 tons, an increase of 1.3 per cent over the previous year. Tonnages terminated during the same period in the Atlantic Region (including unloadings for domestic consumption, waterborne exports and deliveries to U.S. rail connections) dropped 8.9 per cent to 18,162,620 tons. As a result, a net outward movement of 13,787,330 tons was recorded. Iron ore was

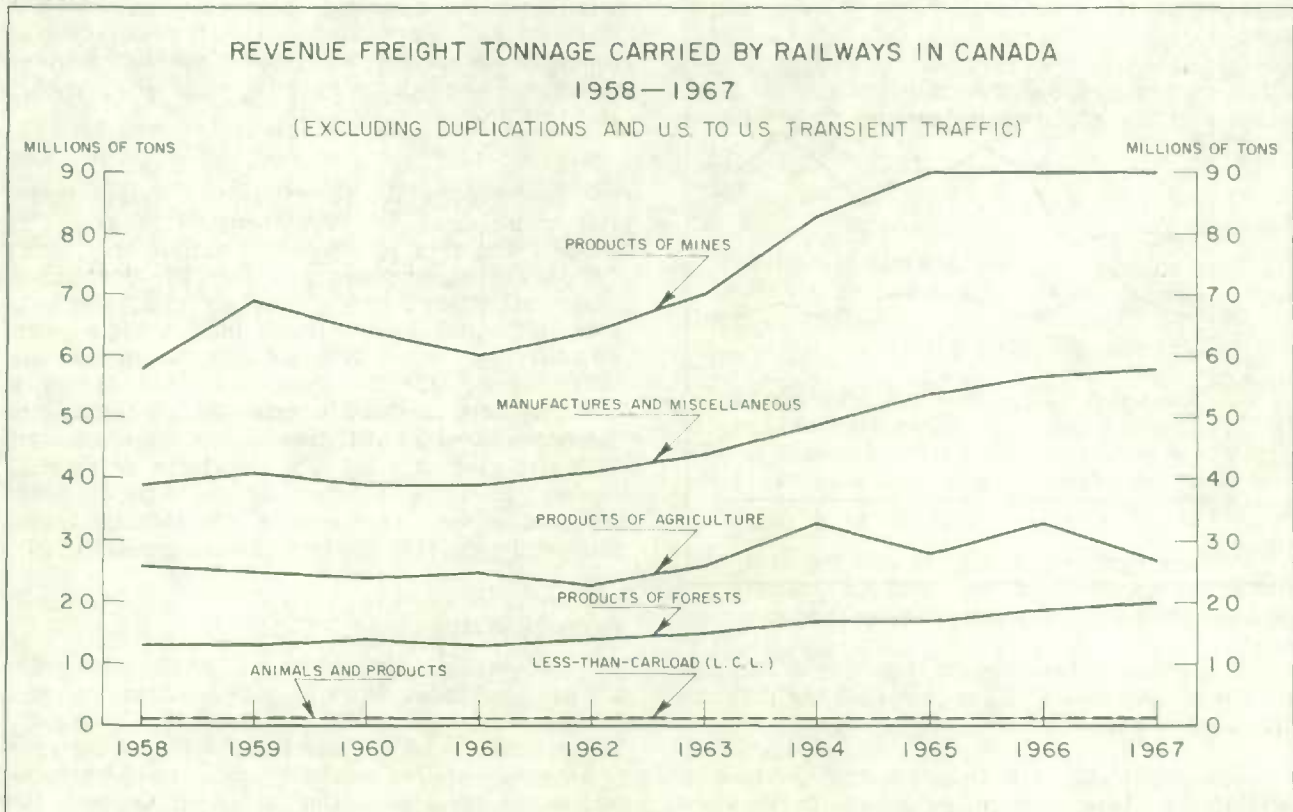
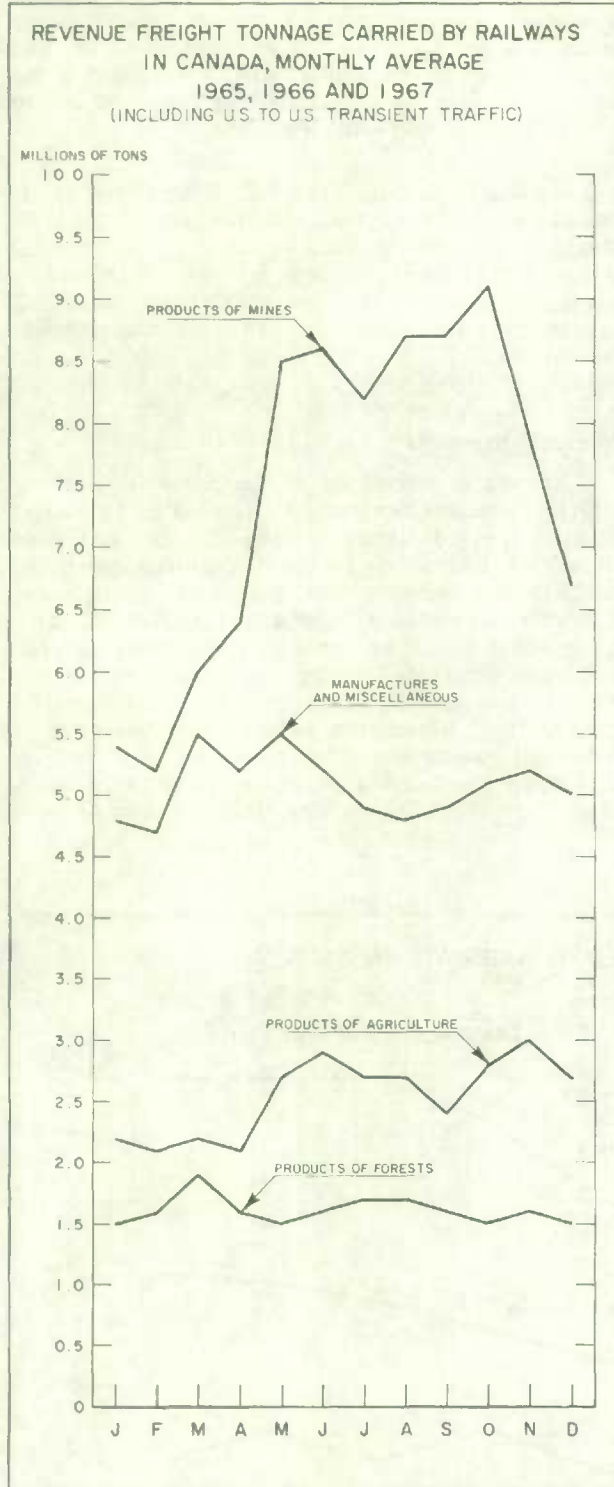

the main commodity outbound from the area with bituminous coal and potatoes ranking second and third respectively.

In the Central Region, Quebec traffic declined 0.9 per cent to 46,556,397 tons with mine products showing the greatest decrease. Ontario rail traffic decreased 3.9 per cent to 66,589,892 tons, with manufactured items and mine products contributing the heaviest volume declines. Freight terminated in these two provinces totalled 63,094,108 tons in Quebec and 80,007,833 tons in Ontario.

In the Prairie and Pacific Region (comprising Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta, and British Columbia) rail shipments were lower by 4.0 per cent at 63,487,280 tons, and freight terminated increased 1.9 per cent to 47,775,322 tons. As in the past, the net movement of goods (15,711,958 tons) was out-bound from this area for export, for delivery to Central and Eastern Canada or for delivery to U.S. rail connections. Wheat was the principal outward movement in 1967 with a net movement of 7,995,068 tons. Other significant net movements from the area included: lumber, shingles and lath, 2,330,277 tons (2,222,322 tons in 1966); barley, 1,869,157 (1,383,332 tons) fertilizer, 1,606,382 (1,290,424 tons) and woodpulp, 880,089 (773,602 tons).

In the Yukon and Northwest Territories, mine products accounted for 92.4 per cent of rail tonnages originated. The principal commodities moved were: zinc ore and concentrates, lead ore and concentrates, asbestos and other ores and concentrates. Manufactured products were the main goods moved into this area.

Revenue freight received from United States rail connections in 1967 destined to points in Canada amounted to some 11.0 million tons, down 3.0 per cent from the previous year. The most significant rail imports were: phosphate rock, 1,662,118 tons; industrial sand, 842,421 tons; vehicle parts, 695,607 tons; coke, 582,263 tons; scrap iron and scrap steel, 424,311 tons; clay and bentonite, 376,143 tons; anthracite coal, 322,012 tons and bituminous coal 330,647 tons.

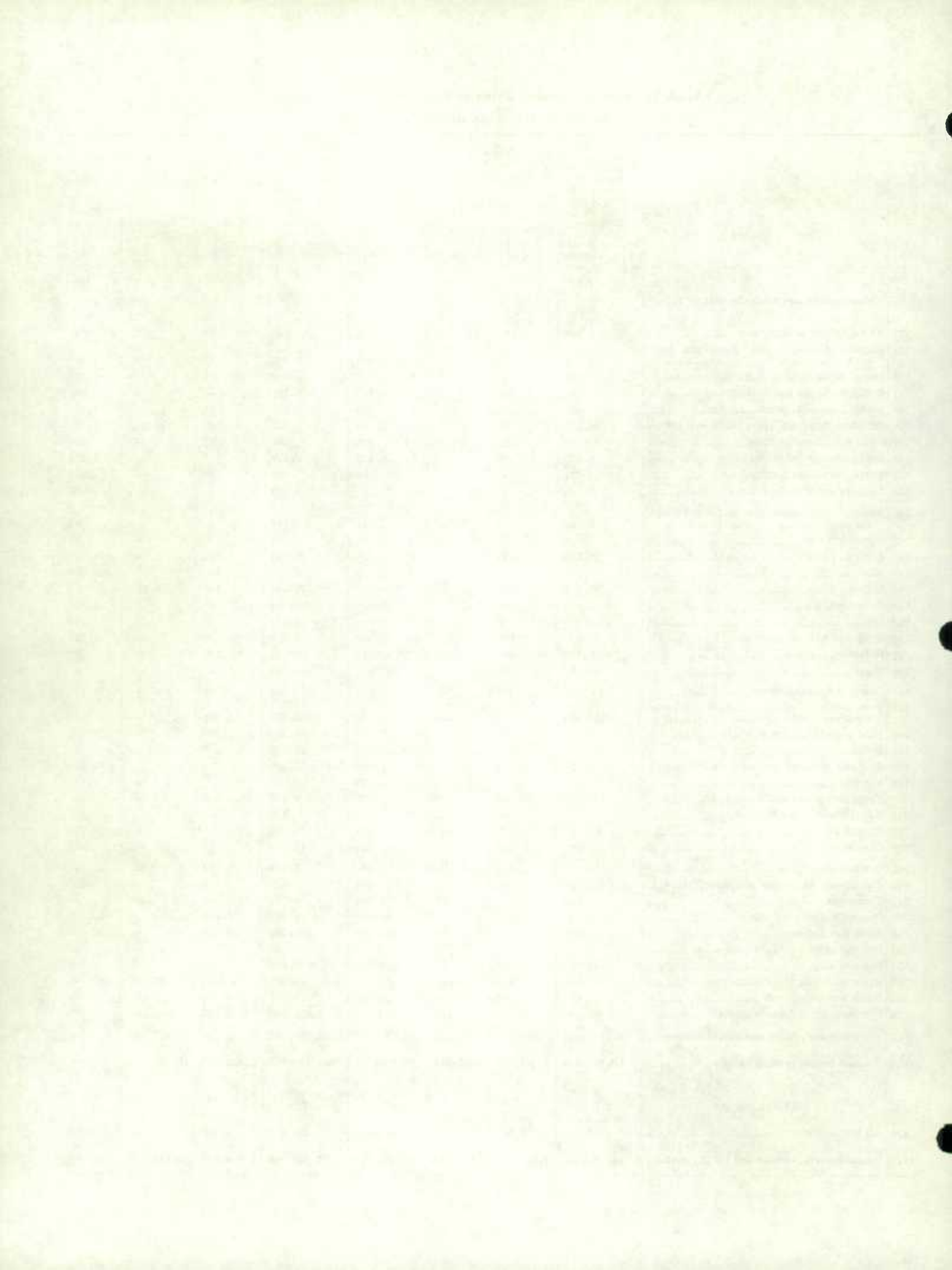
