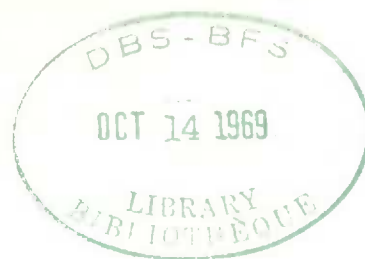

A "common carrier", as referred to in this series, means any railway which holds itself out to the general public to transport passengers and or goods for compensation.

The terms used in the column headings of this report reflect the following provisions of the instructions to the carriers:

"Originated or loaded" indicates: (a) Revenue freight originated directly on the road of the respondent, including that received from private, non-reporting industrial sidings; (b) freight not previously given line haul transportation, received from switching roads connecting with the respondent; (c) Imports at lake or ocean ports; (d) Freight reshipped following milling or fabrication at some point in transit.

"Received from U.S. Rail destined to Canadian points" means: Traffic destined to Canadian points received from United States rail connections or transported across the border by the respondent.

"Received from U.S. rail destined to U.S. points" means: Receipts from United States rail connections destined to points in the United States (overhead traffic).

"Terminated or unloaded" means: (a) Freight terminated directly on the road of the respondent, including that delivered to private, non-reporting

industrial sidings and grain unloaded at interior, lake and coastal elevators for export; (b) Freight delivered to switching roads connecting with the respondent where there was no further line haul; (c) Exports at lake or ocean ports; (d) Freight unloaded for milling or fabrication at some point in transit.

"Delivered to U.S. rail connections" means: (a) Traffic delivered to United States rail connections or transported across the border by the respondent; (b) Deliveries to United States rail connections of freight originated in the U.S. and moved overhead through Canada.

For purposes of this report railways operating between Canada and the United States consider that portion of their line south of the border a U.S. rail connection. Thus, freight crossing the International Boundary, whether received from or delivered to another railway at that point or transported by the respondent, is reported as receipts from or deliveries to U.S. rail connections. Freight interchanged between common carrier railways in Canada does not appear in these statistics since this traffic is included as loaded and unloaded on the respondents' line and would, if repeated, result in a duplication.

The net movement of commodities, as presented in Tables 14 and 15, is the difference between the total tonnage loaded in a given area and received from U.S. rail, and the total tonnage unloaded in Canada and delivered to U.S. connections. If, for instance, loadings and receipts in the Western Provinces exceed tonnages unloaded and delivered in that area, the difference must have been carried eastward, either for unloading in the other provinces or for delivery to U.S. rail connections at junction points east of Manitoba. A reversal of this situation would indicate a net movement into the area from points east.

Summary

The volume of freight handled by railway lines in Canada during 1968 reached an all-time high of 215,416,593 tons, an increase of 2.8 per cent over the preceding year and 0.5 per cent over the previous record established in 1966.

Increased movements were recorded in three of the five major commodity groups. Manufactured and miscellaneous items registered the largest increase at 7.4 per cent, while products of mines rose 6.7 per cent and products of forests 2.7 per cent. Decreases of 17.7 per cent were recorded for products of agriculture and 5.3 per cent for animals and products.

Less-than-carload freight continued its downward trend, dropping 47.3 per cent from the previous year. This decline in volume is due to the shift of l.c.l. traffic out of railway freight and into express operations.

Manufactures and Miscellaneous

Fertilizers — mainly potash was the largest single item in this category carried by rail in 1968, totalling 7,116,465 tons, an increase of 10.2 per cent over

1967. Other manufactured commodities moved in large volume were: fuel, road and petroleum residual oils, manufactured iron and steel, woodpulp, and newsprint paper.

Products of Mines

Carryings of iron ore at 47,203,411 tons were 13.1 per cent above those of 1967 and remained the largest single commodity, shipped in the mines category. Movements of iron ore accounted for 48.3 per cent of all mine products transported by rail, with the greatest portion of loadings taking place in Quebec, the main producing area.

Bituminous coal, 70 per cent of which originated in Eastern Canada, continued to rank second in tonnage although in 1968 rail carryings of this commodity declined 14.0 per cent from the earlier year to 8,262,897 tons. With the recent signing of contracts to supply Japanese steel mills with some 6 million tons of coal over the next three years substantial western movement of this commodity can be anticipated.

Volume increases were recorded for copper-nickel (nickel) ore and concentrates, gravel and sand, and crude gypsum. Stone and rock movements registered a decline.

Products of Forests

Pulpwood continued to predominate a category, the total movement of which declined 0.4 per cent from 1967 to 9,763,690 tons. Ontario and Quebec together accounted for more than half of the pulpwood movement. Lumber, timber and plywood shipments increased 7.2 per cent to 6,738,662 tons from 6,284,206 with the greater portion of this traffic originating in British Columbia.

Products of Agriculture

Agricultural products as a whole were down 17.7 per cent to 24,207,660 tons with wheat dropping 19.2 per cent to 12,950,508 tons. There was a decrease in tonnage movements of grain mainly due to a grain handlers' strike between July 18 and September 13 and a decrease in grain exports. Saskatchewan continued to be the principal originating province for wheat accounting for 56.4 per cent of the total handled, while Alberta provided 26.4 per cent of the wheat aggregate.

Animals and Products

Livestock movements by rail in 1968 declined 14.0 per cent to 297,305 tons, cattle and calves was the largest of the livestock classes shipped by rail in 1968 accounting for 231,794 tons or 78.0 per cent of the animal and products total. Products of animals carried in large volume also included fresh meat (485,040 tons as compared with 510,668 in 1967) and hides, skins and pelts (101,428 tons in contrast to 111,238).

Commodity Ratios

A percentage breakdown by weight, of total rail freight tonnages hauled in 1968 shows that products of agriculture accounted for 11.2 per cent of all rail

carload traffic: animals and products 0.6 per cent; products of mines 45.4 per cent; products of forests, 9.9 per cent; manufactures and miscellaneous, 32.7 per cent and l.c.l. freight 0.2 per cent.

Seasonal Patterns

The greater volume of traffic moves by rail between April and October as shown in Chart 2. However, increased vessel movements from St. Lawrence River ports (Montreal and below) during recent winter months have aided the railways in maintaining a fairly high level of traffic during the November-March period.

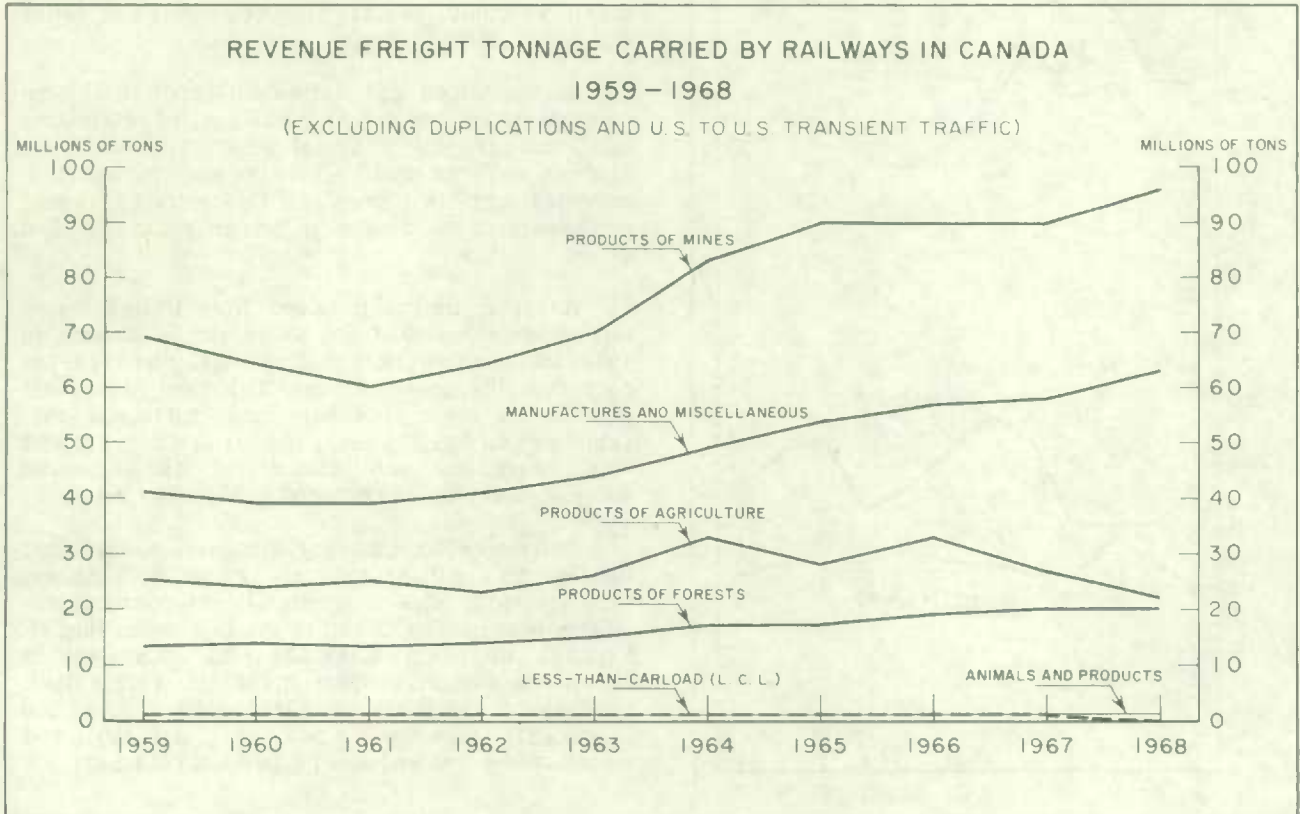
Note: The above commodity ratios are based on data containing United States to United States traffic moving through Canada while Chart 1 shows a ten-year ratio pattern of commodity movements by rail excluding these overhead intransient movements. Duplications resulting from traffic interchanged between Canadian carriers are also excluded in the chart.

Seasonal patterns in rail freight traffic in Canada are most evident with respect to products of mines, but also normally occur in the patterns of agricultural and manufactured movements. Unusually heavy exports of grain such as occurred in 1963, 1964 and 1966 however, have tended to push monthly rail shipments higher than usual during the autumn.

Regional Synopsis

Geographically, rail freight traffic increased in eight of the eleven designated area. In Newfoundland movements increased 21.0 per cent; in the Yukon and Northwest Territories 6.2 per cent; in Ontario 6.0 per cent; in Manitoba 5.2 per cent; in British Columbia 3.7 per cent; in Nova Scotia 1.8 per cent; in New Brunswick 0.9 per cent and in Quebec 0.8 per cent. Freight traffic moved by rail in Saskatchewan declined 13.1 per cent; in Prince Edward Island it was down 8.0 per cent; and in Alberta a 3.6 per cent decrease was registered.

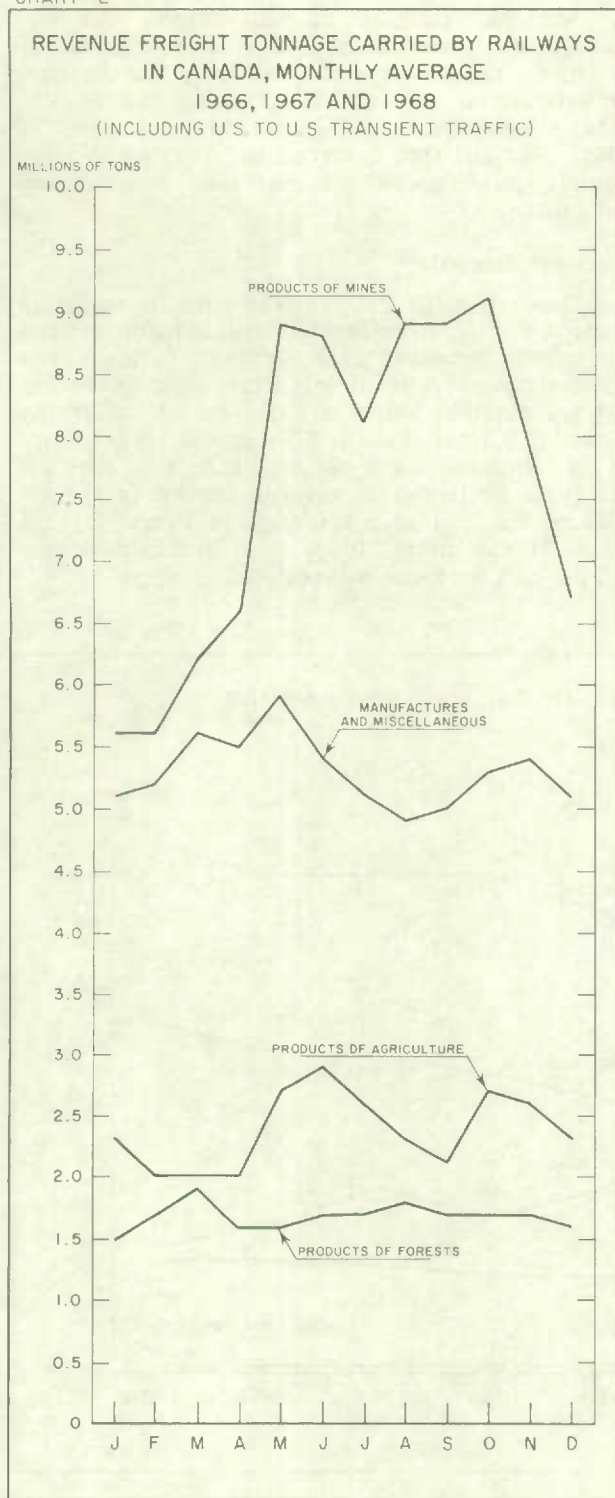

Tonnages originated in the Atlantic Region, which comprises Newfoundland (including Labrador), Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick and which comprises loadings from local industry, receipts from waterborne carriers and U.S. rail connections, aggregated 35,553,373 tons, an increase of 11.3 per cent over the previous year. Tonnages terminated during the same period in the

Atlantic Region (including unloadings for domestic consumption, waterborne exports and deliveries to U.S. rail connections) dropped 2.3 per cent to 17,743,002. As a result, a net outward movement of 17,810,371 tons was recorded. Iron ore was the main commodity outbound from the Atlantic area with bituminous coal and woodpulp ranking second and third, respectively.

In the Central Region (Quebec and Ontario) Quebec traffic increased 0.8 per cent to 46,938,167 tons with manufacturers and miscellaneous showing the greatest increases. Ontario rail traffic rose 6.0 per cent to 70,579,845, with mine products and manufactured items contributing the heaviest volume. Tons terminated in these two provinces totalled 66,442,671 tons in Quebec and 79,862,475 tons in Ontario.

In the Prairie and Pacific Region (comprising Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia) rail shipments were lower by 3.3 per cent at 61,421,308 tons, and freight terminated increased 5.1 per cent to 50,228,362 tons. As in the past, the net movement of goods (11,192,946 tons) was outbound from this area for export, for delivery to Central and Eastern Canada or for delivery to U.S. rail connections. Wheat was the principal outbound item in 1968 with a net Eastward movement of 5,222,394 tons. Other significant commodity shipments from the area included: lumber, shingles and lath, 2,199,264 tons (2,330,277 tons in 1967); fertilizer (mainly potash), 1,620,357 (1,606,372 tons); woodpulp, 895,319 (880,089 tons) and barley 854,590 (1,869,157 tons).

In the Yukon and Northwest Territories, mine products accounted for 91.2 per cent of originating rail tonnages. The principal minerals moved were: zinc ore and concentrates, lead ore and concentrates, asbestos and other ores and concentrates. Inward movements to the area were primarily manufactured goods.

Revenue freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada in 1968 amounted to 10.6 million tons, down 4.0 per cent from the previous year. The most significant rail imports were: phosphate rock, 1,476,426 tons; vehicle parts 883,445 tons; industrial sand, 820,687 tons; scrap iron and scrap steel, 482,982; coke 403,692; and clay and bentonite, 375,074 tons.

Deliveries to United States rail connections totalled 38.1 million tons as against 35.9 million tons in 1967. The more significant commodities, volume-wise, moved by rail to the U.S. were: lumber, shingles and lath 4,388,800 tons (3,594,430 in 1967); newsprint paper 3,748,516 (3,738,816); fertilizers 3,531,477 (3,229,504); woodpulp 3,352,060 (3,019,527); iron ore, 1,507,717 (1,619,460); and manufactured iron and steel 1,069,324 (954,842).
