INTRODUCTION

Coverage

Presented in this publication are revenue freight commodity statistics reported by the undernoted class 1 and 2 common carrier railways operating in Canada:

The terms used in the column headings of this report reflect the following provisions of the instructions to the carriers:

"Originated or loaded" indicates: (a) Revenue freight originated directly on the road of the respondent, including that received from private, non-reporting industrial sidings; (b) freight not previously given line haul transportation, received from switching roads connecting with the respondent; (c) Freight feceived from other modes of transport for initial fail haul (except where joint rates on through billing); (d) Freight reshipped following milling or fabrication at some point in transit; "Received from U.S. Rail

destined to Canadian points" means: Traffic destined to Canadian points received from United States rail connections or transported across the border by the respondent.

"Received from U.S. rail destined to U.S. points" means: Receipts from United States rail connections destined to points in the United States (overhead traffic).

"Terminated or unloaded" means: (a) Freight terminated directly on the road of the respondent, including that delivered to private, non-reporting industrial sidings and grain unloaded at interior, lake and coastal elevators for export; (b) Freight

delivered to switching roads connecting with the respondent where there was no further line haul; (c) Freight delivered to other modes of transport (except where a subsequent rail line-haul is indicated or where movement is at joint rates on through billing); (d) Freight unloaded for milling or fabrication at some point in transit.

"Delivered to U.S. rail connections" means: (a) Traffic delivered to United States rail connections or transported across the border by the respondent; (b) Deliveries to United States rail connections of freight originated in the U.S. and moved overhead through Canada.

For purposes of this report railways operating between Canada and the United States consider that portion of their line south of the border a U.S. rail connection. Thus, freight crossing the International Boundary, whether received from or delivered to another railway at that point or transported by the respondent, is reported as receipts from or deliveries to U.S. rail connections. Freight interchanged between common carrier railways in Canada does not appear in these statistics since this traffic is included as loaded and unloaded on the respondents' line and would, if repeated, result in a duplication.

The net movement of commodities, as presented in Tables 14 and 15, is the difference between the total tonnage loaded in a given area and received from U.S. rail, and the total tonnage unloaded in Canada and delivered to U.S. connections. If, for instance, loadings and receipts in the Western Provinces exceed tonnages unloaded and delivered in that area, the difference must have been carried eastward, either for unloading in the other provinces or for delivery to U.S. rail connections at junction points east of Manitoba. A reversal of this situation would indicate a net movement into the area from points east.

Highlights

Total volume of revenue freight handled by railways in Canada declined 4.0 per cent to 206,863,829 tons in 1969. This is the lowest tonnage handled in one year since 1965 and reflects a sharp drop in iron ore tonnage due to a major strike in Quebec and Labrador.

Tonnage loaded by railways in Canada accounted for 183,370,405 tons out of the above total traffic handled, down 4.7 per cent from 1968. The balance consisted of receipts from United States connections which showed a slight increase in 1969.

On a commodity basis, three of the five major commodity groups showed increases with forest products up 5.6 per cent, manufactures and miscellaneous up 3.0 per cent, and agricultural products up 1.5 per cent. The small animal products group was lower by 15.3 per cent, however the really significant decrease occurred in the huge mine product group which dropped by 11.8 million tons

or 12.1 per cent. This reflects mainly the drop in iron ore and copper-nickel ore shipments due to the effect of strikes. Volume of L.C.L. freight was off sharply for a decrease of 55.2 per cent as recent changes in the patterns of handling small package shipments diverted traffic from this area.

Products of Mines

As already mentioned iron ore showed the largest change here dropping to 38.6 million tons from 47.2 million tons, followed by copper-nickel ore down to 3.8 million tons from 5.4 million tons, and bituminous coal down at 7.5 million tons from 8.3 million tons in 1968. Despite the above decrease, iron ore is still by far the largest single commodity, accounting for 18.7 per cent of all tonnage handled. Quebec with 15.1 million tons and Newfoundland (Labrador) with 13.0 million tons were the main originators of iron ore traffic.

The most significant increase among the mine products was shown by "stone and rock: broken, ground and crushed" which rose from 5.1 million to 5.7 million tons.

Manufactures and Miscellaneous

The best performers in this commodity group were vehicle parts, n.o.s. up to 2.6 million from 2.1 million tons; woodpulp up to 5.3 million from 4.5 million tons and newsprint paper higher at 5.4 million from 4.9 million tons. Most notable areas of weakness were fertilizers, n.o.s. lower at 6.7 million tons compared with 7.1 million last year, and cement down to 1.7 million tons from 1.9 million tons in 1968.

Products of Agriculture

While in total, agricultural products rose only 1.5 per cent, there were a number of individual commodities which showed substantial fluctuations. Wheat, the second largest commodity, after iron ore, dropped from 12.95 million tons to 12.01 million but was largely offset by an increase in barley shipments from 2.02 million to 2.77 million tons. Oranges and grapefruit nearly doubled to 253,000 tons from 146,000 tons, while flaxseed soared to 668,000 tons from 251,000 tons the year before.

Products of Forest

The 5.6 per cent increase in tonnage under this group may be traced to increases in pulpwood from 9.8 million tons to 10.7 million tons and in logs, butts and bolts from 2.66 million to 2.84 million tons. Lumber also showed a small increase to 6.86 million tons from 6.74 million in 1968.

Animals and Products


This small group continued its decline of recent years dipping 15.3 per cent, with most commodities contributing to this drop. Fresh meats were down to 368,000 tons from 485,000 tons and cattle and calves dropping to 200,000 tons from 232,000 tons the year before. The largest increase here was for hides, skins and pelts which reached 105,000 tons from 101,000 tons the previous year.

Commodity Ratios

The breakdown of total freight handled by major commodity group shows the effect of last year's mining strikes as products of mines constituted 41.5 per cent of total traffic compared with 45.4 per cent in 1968. Other percentages of total traffic with 1968 figures shown in brackets are as follows: manufactures and miscellaneous 35.1 (32.7); products of agriculture, 11.9 (11.2); products of forest 10.9 (9.9); animals and products 0.5 (0.6); and L.C.L. freight 0.1 (0.2).

Note: The above commodity ratios are based on data containing United States to United States traffic moving overhead through Canada while Chart 1 is based on data which excludes this overhead traffic. In both the percentages and Chart 1, traffic carried by more than one Canadian rallway is counted only once.





Seasonal Trends


Chart 2 shows the seasonal distribution of major groups of commodities over the past three years. Products of mines show the most pronounced seasonal fluctuation with the effect of reductions in seaway and other connecting water traffic a major factor along with the normal difficulties in surface excavation during the winter months. The slight drop in June and July reflects the iron ore strike. However it should be noted that there is a growing tendency towards year-round operation in many sectors of the economy which has reduced the magnitude of seasonal fluctuations over the years and will likely continue to do so.

Agricultural products show two seasonal peaks per year in the early summer and late autumn.

Regional Analysis

Six of the 11 provincial regions showed decreases in traffic handled with Newfoundland being the hardest hit with a 25.5 per cent decline to 14,576,824 tons. This reflects the effects of the iron ore strike in Labrador. Ontario showed the next largest decline with a drop of 5.0 per cent to 66,947,258 tons. This was almost entirely attributable to a decline in mine products, with coppernicted one showing the largest drop due to a strike.

Major increases were registered by New Brunswick which rose 8.6 per cent to 5,475,835 tons; Manitoba, which rose 6.2 per cent to 8,563,542 tons; and by British Columbia which was higher by 5.9 per cent at 20,716,303 tons. The New Brunswick and British Columbia rises were mainly due to higher movements of pulpwood and other forest products, while the Manitoba rise was attributable to several commodities.

The Atlantic Region (Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick) showed a net outward movement of freight to other provinces of 12,878,105 tons, down sharply from 17,810,371 tons in 1968. This decline may be entirely attributed to a reduction in Labrador iron ore shipments.

The four Western Provinces showed a higher net outward movement of freight at 12,468,308 tons versus 11,192,946 tons in 1968. This increase is mainly attributable to higher movements of barley and flaxseed.

Traffic received from U.S. Rail Connections for Canadian destinations rose to 11,752,035 tons from 10,579,020 tons in 1968. The bulk of this increase was represented manufactures and miscellaneous products brought into Ontario with vehicle parts the largest single contributor, although many commodities were higher.

Deliveries to U.S. Rai! Connections rose slightly to 39,359,682 tons from 38,170,386 tons the previous year. Major contributors to this increase were bituminous coal, iron ore and lumber.




