

OPERATING REVENUES, EXPENSES & STATISTICS RAILWAYS IN CANADA WITH ANNUAL OPERATING REVENUES OF \$500,000 OR OVER

For Twelve Months ended December 51, 1949

A new maximum for railway operating revenues was attained in 1949 when the total reached \$885,555,527, up 2.2 p.c., or \$18,804,878 over the previous high established in 1948. The year was one of relatively high employment and industrial activity. Coupled with increased freight, express and passanger rates and the addition of Newfoundland lines on April 1st, the upward tread in revenues was sustained. The monthly report covers railways with operating revenues of \$500,000 or over annually and represents nearly 99 p.c. of the total steem railway revenues in Landa each year; thus, the national total fer 1949 for all railways should exceed \$885,000,000, whereas the 1950 revenues had been \$507,179,095. The current estimate is 2.44 times that of 1959. In a similar comparison, the Net National Income of Canada for 1949 was just double that for 1959. The gain of 2.2 p.c. over 1948 in operating revenues of Canadian railways contrasts with a decrease of 11.9 p.c. shown for Class I railways in the United States where strikes reduced freight receipts and passanger traffic was down sharply. Operating expenses again outsped the gain made in revenues, climbing \$24,180,888 or 5 p.c. over the 1948 total of \$798,411,148 to a new high of \$022,571,051. However, tax accrumis eased \$1,005,998 to \$17,550,055 and hire of equipment was reduced \$700,295 to \$11,978,880. Joint facilities rents were \$86,792 lighter. The net result was an operating income of \$51,468,615 for 1949, a decrease of \$5,505,527 from the previous year's revised total of \$54,972,140.

As in 1948, Canadian railways again failed by a considerable murgin to earn sufficient operating income to most interest and other obligations despite near record isvals of activity and peak earnings.

The addition of Hewfoundland lines to the Mational System from April to December meant operating revenues of some \$7,756,500 and operating expenses of \$10,500,500, a deficit of \$2,584,000, to which must be added taxes and other charges.

Reviewing the year's operating revenues, each account registered an increase over 1948. Preight earnings rose 1.5 p.c. or \$4,856,952 to \$701,090,852 - a new record - while parasines fares were up 1.6 p.c. or \$1,505,240 from 1948 to \$84,791,645 compared with the record of nearly \$150,935,000 earned in 1944. Mail receipts rose 1.5 p.c., while express gained 10.7 p.c. or \$3,464,379 to \$35,758,631 - an ell-time high. Other parasenges train earnings increased 14 p.c., and the miscellaneous accounts 9.5 p.c. Operating expenses show increases of \$1 p.c. or \$4,948,745 in maintenance of way and structures which required \$162,086,525 during 1949, while maintenance of augment advanced \$11,564,477 or 6.7 p.c. over 1948 to \$164,705,062. Traffic expenses were up 5 p.c. to \$17,561,552. Transportation account at \$402,556,240 was increased \$2,901,508. General expenses were 8.8 p.c. heavier at \$41,161,457.

"All Sailways" statistics of operation, which do not include Newfoundland data, reveal a decrease of 8.6 p.c. from 1948 volume in the tomnage of revenue freight carried, which declined 14,307,780 toms to 155,135,726 toms for the year. However, ton mileage eased only 4.8 p.c., indicating a rise in average length of haul from 547 to 561 miles. Revenue passengers numbered 32,198,686 compared with 35,555,230 one year earlier, a decrease of 9.7 p.c., while passenger miles were down 9.5 p.c., with average journey little changed. Loaded freight car miles were reduced 2.8 p.c. or over 60,080,000, and empty mileage rose 52,876,000 or 5.7 p.c., Total pay roll for 176,625 emiloyees was \$491,738,641, an average of \$2,784.10 compared with \$2,734.70 in 1948 (up 1.8 p.c.) when 178,549 employees earned \$487,730,197 including retroactive jay not shown in the monthly reports. Average freight receipt per revenue ton mile was 1.251 cente against 1.176 centa in 1948, and passenger receipt per passenger per mile advanced from 2.404 to 2.698 cente.

CANADAN MATICAL RAILWAYS: Revenues from relively operations climbed to a record \$4.58,407,779 for 1949, up 5.6 p.c., or some \$15,005,000 bvar 1948, while expenses rose \$16,741,777 or 4.1 p.c. to \$4.24,761,819 - an all-time high. Tax accruals were \$5.66,152 heavier at \$7,087,041. Here of equipment was up but rents credit improved. The resulting operating income at \$5,521,047 for the year compares with \$5,034,024 in 1948. Without the loss on Revfoundland operations some improvement would have been shown on Canadian lines over the previous year. Operating income for 1949 was also reduced on Entited States lines of the system from \$5,111,606 to \$2,025,770, leaving a system total of some \$5,546,817 with which to meet interest requirements of over \$4.6,100,000 in addition to other non-operating debits. All revenue accounts were higher with freight receipts up 2.1 p.c. or \$7,013,097 to \$559,474,614. Passenger fares responding to fare increases rose 4.5 p.c. to \$4.004,646. Mail and express revenue improved with the latter advancing \$5,075,789 or 15.5 p.c. to a record \$26,102,256. "All other" account was 15.4 p.c. better than in 1948 at \$24,054,643. Similarly every expense item increased over the preceding year. Maintenance charges on way and structures required nearly \$2,552,000 more to total \$77,500,514, while equipment took \$95,952,250, an increase of 10.5 p.c. or \$9,101,955. Transportation expenses advanced from \$214,700,659 to \$217,571,177, up 1.5 p.c., and general eccount climbed 8.1 p.c. to \$20,480,220. CANADIAN PACIFIC NAILMAY COMPANY: The Canadian Pacific reported operating revenues at a peak of \$565,252,004 for 1949, up 2.5 p.c. or \$8,002,592 over 1948. Operating expenses were limited to an increase of \$7.468,056 at \$355,646,592. Tax accruals were reduced \$1,408,985 to \$6,615,660 and equipment hire and joint rentals were lighter. Consequently, operating income improved \$2,212,805 at \$20,650,850,860 for the year. The interest charge on funded and infunded dath is placed at some \$12,500,000 against the railway company in 1949. With the credits from non-operating income, less non-operating axpenses, a minor betterment was anticipated in net corporate income. Preight receipts improved £2 p.c. or \$6,178,627 over 1948 to \$292,002,977. Passenger farse were down slightly as were sell earnings. Express mined nearly \$665,000 and other passenger train receipts, \$669,541.

Revenue freight townage totalled 56,445,684 toms, down 6 p.c. or \$,591,148 toms, but ton nileage declined crip 5.8 p.c., as length of haul was 420 mines. Freight receipts per revenue ton mile were 1.804 cents compared with 1.156 cents in 1948, thi.e passenger receipts averaged 2.72 cents per mile against 2.484 cents one year earlier. Total pay rell reached \$195,401,427, up 2.7 p.c. or \$5,009,545 and employees numbered 68,820 or pared with 67,696 in 1948.




