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# RAILWAY OPERATING STATISTICS <br> (Operating Rovonueq, Expenses and Statistics of 17 Rallways malnly with Amenal Operatiog Rovenues over $\$ 500,000$ ) 

TOTAL - 17 RAILWAYS:
The rail transportation industry had a 9 p.c. drop in revenue from $\$ 1,194,711,157$ in 1953 to $\$ 1,087,062,332$ in 1954 . The 17 railways whose statistics are included in this report are listed in the August, 1954 report at which time the Quebec, North Shore and Labrador Railway was added. The revenue decline resulted mainly from a $\$ 100$ million decrease in frei ght revenues to $\$ 865,570,274$. Operating expenses dropped 7.1 p.c. to $\$ 1,013,914,299$ fram $\$ 1,091,518,257$ with reductions of $\$ 39$ million to $\$ 475,530,776$ in transportation expenses and of $\$ 26$ million to $\$ 225,765,970$ in maintenance of equipment. (On the basis of 16 railways for both 1954 and 1955, excluding the Q.N.S. \&L.R., revenues dropped 9.4 p.c. and expense fell $7.5 \mathrm{p.c}$. ) Net operating revenue declined $29.1 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. to $\$ 73,148,033$ from $\$ 103,192,900$ while operating income amounted to $\{34,150,474$, down 39.2 p.c. from $\$ 56,132,302$. Revenue freight carried was off 7.4 p.c. to $156,739,694$ tons from $169,239,163$ and freight ton miles fell 10.7 n.c. to $58,053,053,000$. Passen rers carried at $28,188,777$ were down 1.1 D.C. from $2 ?, 508,939$ and passenger rijles declined 4.2 p.c. to 2,857,872,000. Emplovees numbered 184,469 as against 199,937 one vear uarlier and payroll amounted to $6630,364,767$ and $6651,519,990$ respectively. The average freight hall during 1954 was 14 rjles shorter at 370 miles and the averag passenger journey was down from 105 to 101 miles

CAIIADIAN NATIONAI, RAIL*AYS:
Canadian Lines: Oneratin; revenues decline 9.2 , c. to $\$ 565,551,866$ from $\$ 616,015,772$ and operating expenses dropped $5.2 \mathrm{n} . \mathrm{c}$. to $5662,688,494$ from $359,864,147$. The result was a $\$ 19$ million drop from $\$ 2,151,625$ to $82,863,372$ in net opergting revenue and a decline of $\$ 15 \mathrm{million}$ from $\$ 16,353,815$ to $\$ 1,586,046$ in onerating income.

The system includin? Tnited Stater Lines: Revenues at $\$ 540,637,280$ were down 8.0 p.c. from $\$ 696,622,451$ and expenses dronped 4.9, c. to $\$ 626,465,374$ fron $2659,049,086$ leaving a net of $314,171,906$ compared with $\$ 37,573,365$ in 1954. Operating income amounted to $\$ 639,487$ versus $120,156,985$.

CANADIAN PACIFIC RAILITAY CO!PANY:

Operating revenues at $422,642,423$ was down 10.2 p.c. from $470,571,371$ and operating expenses declined 10.6 o.c. to $\$ 376,219,898$ from $\$ 420,754,959$. Net operating revenue anounted to $\$ 46,422,525$ e tainst $\$ 49,806,412$ one year earlier and operating income anounted to $\$ 27,032,926$ versus $\$ 28,884,572$. Revenue freight carried declined 8.5 p.c. to $54,205,877$ tons and freight ton miles dropped 13.8 p.c. to $23,668,342,000$. Passengers carried numbered 9,528,589, an increase of 1.1 p.c. but passenger miles fell 2.9 p.c. to 1,282,242,000.
