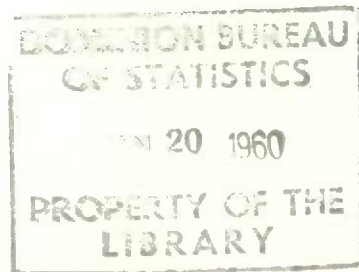

Presented in this publication are financial statistics of railways operating in Canada reported in conformity with the September 1955 issue of the "Uniform Classification of Accounts for Class 1 Common Carriers by Railway." This Classification was prescribed, effective on January 1, 1956, for Canadian National Railways and Canadian Pacific Railway Company, and on January 1, 1957 for all other roads.

Supplementary regulations provided that all railways (excepting C.N.R. and C.P.R.) were to report operating expenses in accordance with a prescribed condensed classification of expense accounts. In table 3 the accounts of all railways have been presented on this basis, while in table 3A those of the C.N.R. and C.P.R. are shown separately in the expanded form.

Earnings

Railway operating revenues in 1958 declined 7.9 per cent to \$1,163,735,417 from \$1,263,147,930 and operating expenses were down 5.9 per cent to \$1,132,277,504 from \$1,203,530,146. The resultant net operating revenue of \$31,457,913 was 47.2 per cent below the \$59,617,784 of 1957. For every revenue dollar earned by the railways during the year, 97.3 cents were expended. This compares with an operating ratio of 95.24 per cent a year earlier.

Total rail revenues, comprising railway, express, commercial communications and highway transport (rail) operations amounted to \$1,269,607,264 in 1958, down from \$1,365,464,639. Rail expenses aggregated \$1,232,387,115 in contrast to \$1,302,028,581 and the net rail income was \$37,220,149 as against \$63,436,058.

Operating Revenues

All principal categories of railway operating revenues declined in 1958. Freight revenue, which accounted for 85.6 per cent of the total, was down by \$84,199,460, or 7.8 per cent to \$995,853,940 from \$1,080,053,400 in 1957, thus accounting for about 85 per cent of the total revenue decrease of \$99,412,513. Passenger revenue showed a decline of 11.0 per cent to \$77,318,387 from \$86,851,789 and mail revenue was down 1.5 per cent to \$15,171,791 from \$15,397,282. Express revenues received by the railways was off 0.3 per cent to \$22,348,264 from \$22,408,506 and all other receipts,

collectively, fell 9.2 per cent to \$53,043,035 from \$58,436,953. The average revenue per ton-mile fell to 1.50 cents in 1958 from 1.52, while the average revenue per passenger-mile rose to 3.11 cents from 2.97.

Express, commercial communications, and highway transport (rail) services, which are operated as separate companies or departments of the railways, produced revenues of \$58,240,392, \$43,300,230, and \$4,331,225 respectively, comparing with \$57,722,575, \$39,313,027, and \$5,281,107 a year ago.

Operating Expenses

All railway operating expenses, except those classified as general, were reduced during the year 1958. Road maintenance costs declined 6.2 per cent to \$248,593,455 from \$265,104,802, mainly as a result of lower road property depreciation charges. Equipment maintenance outlays of \$253,744,614 were 1.1 per cent lower than the \$256,689,993 of 1957. An \$8.3 million increase in rolling stock and vessel depreciation charges was more than offset by a \$9.0 million reduction in locomotive repair costs. Transportation expenses were down \$38.3 million or 8.0 per cent to \$440,116,687 from \$478,428,123 with the greatest decrease occurring in train locomotive fuel and power expenditures. All other operating expenses combined, including traffic, miscellaneous, general, rents and taxes, dropped 6.6 per cent to \$189,822,748 from \$203,307,228.

Express expenses amounted to \$57,621,879 (\$57,282,373 in 1957); communications, \$38,180,878 (\$36,176,925); and highway transport (rail), \$4,306,854 (\$5,039,137).

Income Account

The net earnings from rail operations for the year ended December 31, 1958 totalled \$37,220,149 versus \$63,436,058 in 1957 and the net rail income (net earnings plus other income minus deductions from income and fixed charges) dropped to a deficit of \$21,865,346 in contrast to a credit of \$15,863,563 a year earlier.

Pullman, Bridge and Tunnel Companies

Operating revenues of pullman, bridge and tunnel companies declined 20.3 per cent to

\$1,885,576 from \$2,366,477 and expenses were down 21.4 per cent to \$2,590,394 from \$3,297,716. The net corporate income amounted to \$61,678, down from \$67,927 a year ago. During 1958 the Pullman Company reported contract settlement credits totalling \$723,340 and were thus able to offset an operating loss of \$700,527.

Tax Accruals

A reduction in railway tax accruals to \$49,003,526 from \$53,522,504 was mainly the result of lower income and excise taxes which declined \$4.6 million. Provincial and municipal taxes remained higher during 1958 totalling \$3,230,381 and \$13,096,864 respectively, as compared with \$2,832,852 and \$12,985,615 in 1957. Unemployment insurance accruals decreased to \$4,814,286 from \$5,163,275 and other special taxes dropped to \$2,218,962 from \$2,335,592.

Capitalization

Net railway capital at the close of 1958 stood at \$4,599,774,523, an increase of \$269.6 million over the total of \$4,330,219,893 recorded at December 31, 1957. The value of outstanding stocks increased 3.2 per cent to \$2,646,659,697 from \$2,565,559,683; bonded debt rose 29.1 per cent to \$1,376,921,349 from \$1,066,585,544; miscellaneous funded debt was down 19.7 per cent to \$510,152,477 from \$635,048,666; and equipment trust obligations increased 4.8 per cent to \$66,041,000 from \$63,026,000.

Current Assets and Liabilities

Current assets in 1958 totalled \$401,437,913, just slightly below the \$401,722,041 reported in the preceding year. Current liabilities aggregated \$218,439,141, up from \$212,042,310 in 1957.

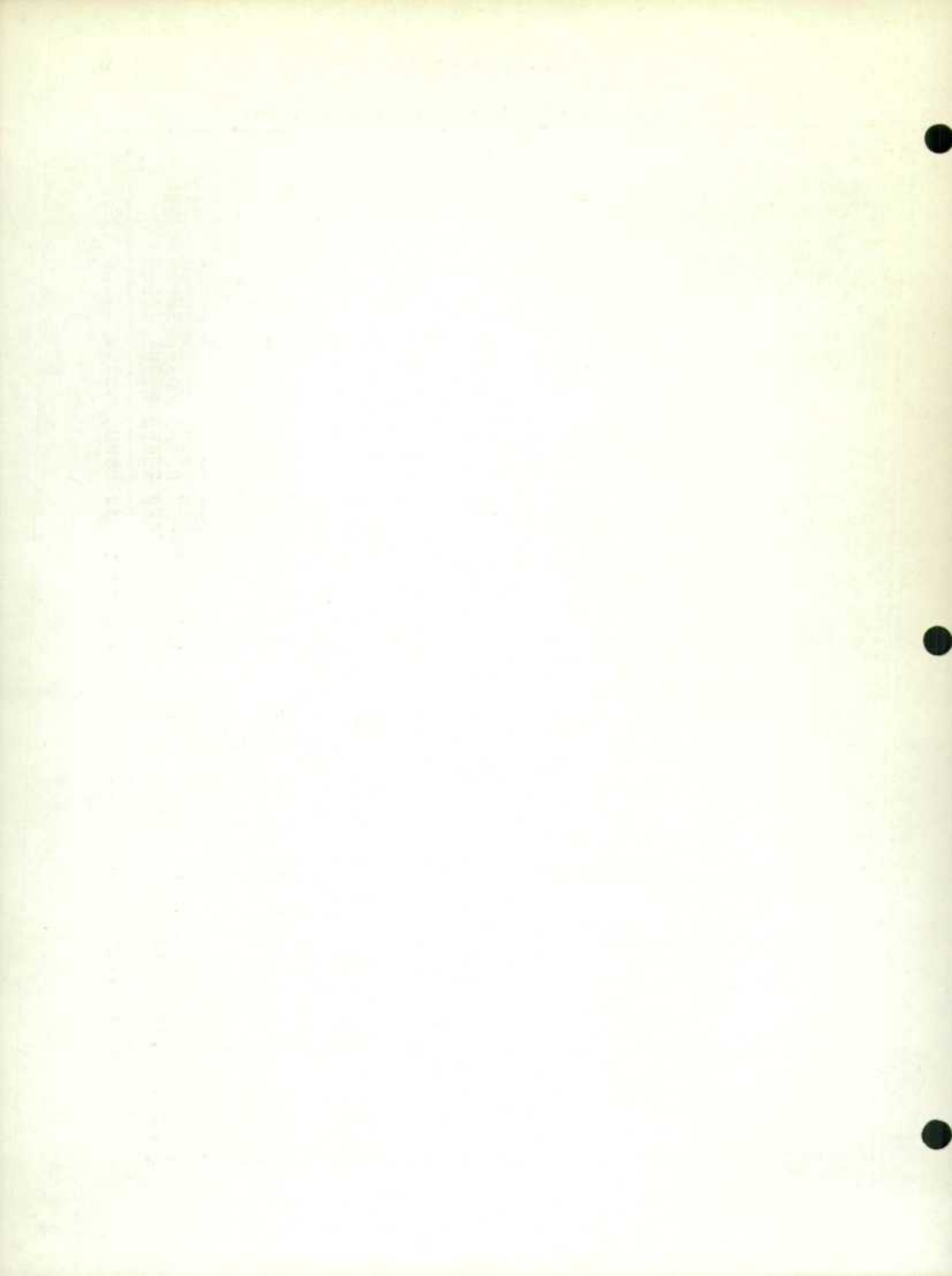
