## PREFACE

Annual railway transport statistics in Canada are published in a series of six reports each of which covers specific aspects of the industry; services and equipment available, traffic handled, the labour force involved and the financial aspects of railways operating in this country.

Statistics on railways have been collected and published in Canada since 1875, first by the Department of Railways and Canals until 1918, and by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics since its inception in 1918. During this time the data have been published in varying degrees of detail. Until 1950 one volume contained all railway statistical data. In 1951 there were three; 1952-1957 there were five, and since 1958 six separate parts have been required to reflect these annual operations. The present report encompasses the following six parts which are not necessarily released in the order they are numbered.

- Part I. Railway Transport – Summary Statistics (Five years)
- II. Railway Transport – Financial Statistics
- III. Railway Transport – Equipment, Track and Fuel Statistics
- IV. Railway Transport – Operating and Traffic Statistics
- V. Railway Transport – Commodity Statistics
- VI. Railway Transport – Employment Statistics

Several other annual reports and three periodicals dealing with rail transportation are also available. A list of all titles published in this field is located on the inside cover of each report.

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics is indebted to the individual railway companies operating across the nation which have prepared and submitted their data for inclusion in this statistical series; to the Railway Association of Canada for its cooperation; and to the Railway Transport Committee of the Canadian Transport Commission, with which joint collection arrangements exist, for their promotion of the uniform accounting principles used for rail statistical purposes.

This report has been prepared by the Transportation Section of the Transportation and Public Utilities Division of Dominion Bureau of Statistics. Any inquiries or comments respecting data contained herein, or to unpublished detail, should be forwarded to this Section.

## PART II

### INTRODUCTION

Presented in this publication are financial details of railways operating in Canada reported in accordance with the "Uniform Classification of Accounts for Common Carriers by Railway" prescribed by the Railway Committee, Canadian Transport Commission.

For purposes of these accounting regulations, railways are grouped into the following four classes:

Class I—Canadian National Railways and the Canadian Pacific Railway Company.

Class II—Other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually from Canadian rail transportation operations.

Class III—Other carriers having average gross revenues of less than \$500,000 annually from Canadian rail transportation operations.

Class IV—Other railways such as terminal, bridge, tunnel and pullman companies.

Class II, Class III and Class IV carriers have the option of using a condensed classification of expenses provided for them. In Table 3 operating expenses for all railways are presented on this condensed basis for purposes of comparison, while in Table 3A, accounts of the CNR and CPR are shown separately in more detail.

A "common carrier", as referred to in this series refers to one which holds itself out to the general public to transport passengers and/or goods for compensation.

Continuing with this report statistical details relating to individual railways have been confined to those with gross operating revenues of \$8 million or more annually. The remaining railways are grouped under "other" within the respective accounting classes, described above. The latter companies, which in years prior to 1967 had been recorded in full detail, account for less than two and one half per cent of gross annual railway operating revenues. This change has enabled a new format to be introduced which, while reducing costs of processing has, it is hoped, resulted in a clearer presentation. Data pertaining to balance sheet accounts which heretofore had been limited to current assets and current liabilities are now

shown in their entirety in Table 7. Table 8 contains data pertaining to securities of railways leased by CPR not included in the comparative general balance sheet, Table 7.

While transportation and traffic statistics of the Cartier Railway Company are included in material appearing in Parts III, IV and V of this annual series, financial details relative to their railway operations are not available and thus do not appear herein or in Part VI.

To eliminate duplicate reporting and to uncover statistical gaps, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics uses the Canadian Standard Industrial Classification (S.I.C.) Catalogue No. 12-501, which provides a set of groups and classes suitable for the compilation of statistics related to different industries. The building block (reporting unit) which is fitted into the above structure is the "establishment". An establishment can be defined as the smallest unit which is a separate operating entity capable of reporting principal elements of input and output. While the establishment is typically a factory, mine, store or similar unit and in most cases is a separate firm, it may encompass two or more operating units which are not necessarily in the same location. It can also be an individual working on his own account.

Industry 506, Railway Transport, as classified in the S.I.C. includes establishments primarily engaged in operating railways. The kinds of activities normally carried on by railway establishments embraces the operation of commuter service (but not street railways), maintenance of way and structures, maintenance of equipment, (including that carried on in railway shops) dining car and sleeping car services, freight, express and the operation of railway terminal facilities. Road transportation services operated by railway establishments and providing pick-up and delivery for the freight or express services of the railway are included in this industry but long distance trucking owned by railway companies is usually set up as separate establishments classified to the trucking industry and included under S.I.C. Industry 507, Truck Transport.

Commercial communications facilities providing service to the general public as well as to the railway are treated as separate establishments and included in S.I.C. Industries 544 Telephone Systems and 545 Telegraph and Cable Systems.

### "GO" Transit Rail Commuter Service

On 23rd May 1967 the Government of Ontario in conjunction with the Canadian National Railways introduced an expanded commuter service in the Toronto area over lines previously serviced by the CNR. Financial responsibility was assumed by the Province although the railway retained operating responsibility. Available financial data in respect of these operations are:

### Financial Results

Operating revenues of railways serving Canada, excluding the Government of Ontario Transit "GO" Rail Commuter System (see paragraph of Introduction) totalled a record \$1,529 million in 1968, 0.6 per cent higher than in the previous year. By comparison, Canada's gross national product in current prices increased 8.5 per cent during the same period.

Railway operating expenses, amounted to \$1,438 million or slightly less than the \$1,444 million of 1967. Net railway operating revenues, after taxes and rents, but before fixed charges (and excluding commercial communications, highway transport (rail) operations, express and ancillary non-rail services) rose 20.9 per cent to \$91.2 million. The net rail income after adding receipts from sources other than railway operations and after deducting fixed charges aggregated \$22.8 million, up from \$9.0 million a year earlier.

### Operating Revenues and Expenses

Freight revenues, which excluded "normal payments"<sup>1</sup> received from the Government of Canada, were up \$45.0 million to \$1,267 million. The aver-

<sup>1</sup> Under the National Transportation Act of 1967 a number of specific subsidies for services provided in the national interest were replaced by payments to the railways of transitional subsidies, or "normal payments", beginning in 1967 and continuing in diminishing amounts each year until 1974. Such payments in 1967 aggregated \$108.9 million while in 1968 they were reduced to \$95.1 million.

age amount received by the railways in 1968 for hauling a ton of freight one mile was 1.33 cents compared with 1.30 cents in 1967.

Passenger revenues, declined sharply to \$64.0 million from \$78.7 following centennial year and Expo 67. These data do not take into account commuter revenues of "GO" Transit. Revenue earned per passenger mile in the year under review remained the same as the previous year at 2.51 cents.

Express revenues (which represent the railways' receipts from express companies and departments of the railway for the carriage of small package freight) declined 9.6 per cent to \$15.8 million and mail revenues fell from \$16.6 million to \$14.6 million.

Total railway operating expenses in 1968 were down \$7.0 million despite increases in wages, rents, taxes and general costs.

Expenditure on road maintenance was 2.0 per cent less than in 1967, due mainly to reductions in roadway, track and ancillary structures. Equipment maintenance disbursements were down 0.4 per cent whilst those incurred in advertising, soliciting and securing traffic were down 4.0 per cent. Transportation costs, which accounted for 38 per cent of all operating expenses, decreased 1.8 per cent during 1968 chiefly because of a 17.4 per cent reduction (representing \$16.5 million) in payments for station employees.

Taxes (primarily income tax) rose by 8.0 per cent to \$101.2 million, and general expenses increased 5.6 per cent to \$139.2 million.

Revenues and expenses of express organizations operated as separate companies or departments of the railways totalled \$77.1 million and \$75.9 million, respectively in 1968. For an analysis of these operations see DBS Catalogue No. 56-204 "Railway Express". Commercial communications systems, which are covered fully in Catalogue No. 56-201, recorded revenues of \$89.6 million in 1968 and expenses aggregating \$77.4 million. Highway transport services, such as bus lines connecting with rail points or completing a rail haul thus forming an integral part of the rail business of a carrier, showed revenues of \$8.1 million and expenses of \$7.8 million in the year under review. These services are covered in Catalogue Nos. 53-222 and 53-223. In aggregate, therefore, total rail revenues, (which include over-the-rail operations plus the three services noted immediately above), were \$1,704 million, 1.6 per cent more than in 1967 while total rail expenses amounted to \$1,599 million, up 0.6 per cent over the earlier year.

### Income

Net rail income before fixed charges aggregated \$124.6 million in 1968, compared with \$103.4 million in 1967. The \$101.9 million required to cover fixed charges was \$7.5 million more than in the previous year. Net rail income after deducting

fixed charges amounted to \$22.8 million and this added to a net of \$23.3 million from non-rail establishments (hotels, steamships, etc.) produced a corporate income of \$46.1 million, 53 per cent above the \$30.1 million recorded for 1967.

The size of the retained income account was reduced during the year from an opening balance of \$797 million to a closing figure of \$784 million. Dividend appropriations of \$58 million were fractionally less than in 1967. The total of tax accruals rose from \$94 million in 1967 to \$101 million in

1968. Income and excise and "municipal" tax payments were each ten per cent higher than in the previous year.

The value of total assets at \$9,582 million was 2.9 per cent more than in 1967 due principally to higher investments in non-rail affiliated companies (Air Canada) and in properties, both rail and non-rail. The commensurate change in total liabilities was mostly accounted for by a 21 per cent rise in current liabilities and a 6 per cent increase in depreciation reserves.


