PRELIMINARY REPORT

ELECTRIC RAILWAYS OF CANADA

For Year ended December 31

1930

Electric railways in Canada were also affected by the business depression in 1930, only 5 out of 53 railways showing increased earnings and 13 of them failing to earn operating expenses as against 9 reporting losses in 1929.

During the year the railways carried 792,701,493 passengers, which was a decrease of 44,028,358 passengers, or 5.3 per cent. The traffic in Montreal decreased by 11,818,076 and in Toronto by 3,142,337 passengers. These two systems carried 56.6 per cent of the total passengers, but their decreases amounted to only 34.0 per cent of the total decrease. The British Columbia Electric Railway showed a decrease of 2,146,391 passengers and the Winnipeg Electric a decrease of 7,241,333 passengers. These two systems carried 16.3 per cent of the total passengers and their decrease was 21.3 per cent of the total.

Of the electric railways carrying ten million passengers or more, which were 12 in number and carried over 90 per cent of the total passengers, only one, the Nova Scotia Light and Power Company in Halifax, showed an increase over 1929. The Sandwich, Windsor and Amherstburg railway, operated as the Essex Division of the Hydro Electric Railways, showed a decrease of 3,424,157 passengers, or 20.4 per cent, and the net result for these 12 systems was a reduction of 33,050,439 passengers, or 4.4 per cent. There were 15 railways carrying between two and ten million passengers each in 1929. These 15 railways carried 59,546,265 passengers in 1930 which was a decrease of 5,706,086 passengers, or 8.7 per cent, compared with 1929. The remaining 26 railways which carried only 2.2 per cent of the total traffic showed a decrease of 5,271,833 passengers, or 23.5 per cent, and 6 of them ceased operating during the year.

The Chatham, Wallaceburg and Lake Erie, which had partially ceased operation the previous year, ceased all operation on March 1, 1930. The Kingston, Portsmouth and Cataraqui railway had a serious fire destroying practically all its rolling stock and it ceased operation on March 1. The Niagara, Welland and Lake Erie ceased operation on

June 30, the Toronto Radial, operated by the Toronto Transportation Commission, also ceased operation on March 15, the Pictou County Electric Company substituted buses for electric cars and removed their tracks, and the Calais Street railway did not operate during the year. With some small increases, the net decrease in track mileage was 130.09 miles, which was by far the largest mileage withdrawn in any year.

Gross revenues of all electric railways amounted to \$54,719,259, as against \$58,268,980 in 1929, and net operating revenues amounted to \$15,593,744, as against \$18,183,840 in 1929. After paying taxes and other deductions from income, 22 railways showed deficits amounting to \$1,066,087 and 31 railways showed a profit of 11,073,164, making the total net income \$10,007,077. Reserves and special charges amounted to \$6,764,556 and 7 railways paid dividends amounting to \$3,402,261, as against dividends of \$3,325,248 paid in 1929. The total number of employees was reduced from 18,801 in 1929 to 18,340 and the salaries and wages amounted to \$26,954,994, or a decrease of \$29,117.

During the year 8 passengers, 26 pedestrians, 18 motorists, 2 persons riding in other vehicles, 6 employees and 4 other persons were killed in electric railway accidents. This was a total of 64 fatalities as against 103 in 1929. Only one person was electrocuted, 52 were killed in collisions and 11 died from other causes. The number of persons injured also showed a decrease from 5,380 in 1929 to 5,062. These included 2,790 passengers, 471 pedestrians, 342 persons riding in motor vehicles, 16 persons riding in other vehicles, 149 motormen and conductors, 16 motor bus drivers and conductors, 838 other employees and 440 other persons, the last two items including some of the other classes which were not distributed by the railways. Thirty-five of the railways had no fatal accidents and ten reported only one each. The Brandon Municipal, Brantford Municipal, Cornwall Street Railway, Light and Power Company, Nelson Municipal, Sarnia Street, Shawinigan Terminal and Sudbury and Copper Cliff Suburban railways reported no accidents during the year. The Sarnia Street railway operated only part of the year, but the other six railways operated throughout the year.

The data for the Montreal Tramways, which operates on a cost-of-service agreement with the city of Montreal, have been adjusted in this report to make the accounts comparable with those of other railways.
