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NATIONAL ESTIMATES
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THE HISTORY OF THE UNITED STATES

The history of the United States is a complex and multifaceted subject, encompassing a wide range of political, social, and economic developments. This report aims to provide a comprehensive overview of the key events and trends that have shaped the nation's identity and trajectory over time.

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MOTOR TRANSPORT TRAFFIC - NATIONAL ESTIMATES

THIRD QUARTER, 1960

This quarterly publication has been designed to provide commodity detail which has become available from the sample surveys of commercial motor vehicles conducted in each of the ten provinces on a continuing quarterly basis. For a complete description of the design of the sample as well as the methods and procedures, reference should be made to the publication "Motor Transport Traffic - National Estimates, 1957," Catalogue No. 53-207.

The quarterly series covers the operation of intercity vehicles, both private and for hire, but it should be noted that urban services of these vehicles are necessarily included. The operations of vehicles classed as farm and urban are described in the annual Motor Transport Traffic reports but are excluded from this publication.

This report includes tables dealing with for hire vehicles and private intercity vehicles. For each class the data are broken down to show operations on trips up to and including 50 miles and on trips over 50 miles as well as total operations.

For purposes of comparison with other modes of transport, the Railway Freight Commodity Statistics Classification has been generally followed (see Appendix I). However, where sufficient descriptive detail was not reported for a particular item it was necessary to assign it to a N.O.S. (not otherwise specified) class. Also, mixed truckloads of goods which were within the same main commodity group, such as agricultural products, have been included with "other agricultural products". However, when the commodities reported for a mixed truckload belonged to more than one of the five main commodity groups, they have been assigned to the "N.O.S. general freight" group. Therefore the totals shown for individual commodities are understated in proportion to the amount of that commodity which, of necessity, was assigned to one of these general classes.

The results of the provincial sample surveys were expanded to represent the estimated truck population for the thirteen weeks of the quarter and combined for a Canada total. For purposes of comparison and continuity all commodities shown individually in the report for the fourth quarter of 1959 have been retained except those for which the number of trips recorded were very low. It should also be noted that the tonnage for some commodities shown has dropped below 100,000 tons which was the minimum requirement for the separate listing of a commodity in the 1959 reports.

Because of the method of selection, it has been possible to show more commodities individually for the for hire vehicles in tables 1 to 3 than for the private intercity trucks in tables 4 to 6. All other commodities not listed separately have been included in either the "other" figures of the five main commodity groups or in the N.O.S. general freight as previously explained.

Weight of goods carried, miles travelled with load, net ton miles and revenue have been rounded to thousands and average distance per ton has been rounded to tens. Averages were calculated before the figures were rounded. The data in this report are estimates subject to sampling error. As time has not permitted a study of the reliability of the detailed information, the data should be used with caution.

Glossary of Terms

Average distance per ton - average distance each ton was carried. Net ton miles divided by the total weight of goods carried.

Average weight carried per truck - total net ton miles performed divided by miles travelled with load.

For hire vehicles - those vehicles (common and contract) which were operated for compensation and, in most provinces, were identified by a distinct series of licence plate numbers, especially for public service vehicles.

Net ton miles - average weight of goods carried per trip multiplied by the number of loaded miles.

N.O.S. - not otherwise specified. (As a result of insufficient descriptive detail for some of the commodities recorded in the questionnaires, it has been necessary to assign these commodities to the N.O.S. classes rather than to a more specific class.)

Private intercity vehicles - privately owned trucks (both intercity and rural) which were operated beyond urban areas and were not used directly in connection with farm operations.

Weight of goods carried - total weight of goods loaded on the vehicles.

For Hire Trucks

In the third quarter of 1960, for hire trucks carried an estimated 47,099,000 tons of goods compared with 50,279,000 tons in the third quarter of the previous year, a decrease of 6 per cent. The average weight carried per truck remained at 10 tons and the average distance per ton was approximately 60 miles for both quarters. However, the net ton miles for these vehicles declined 1 per cent to 2,860,524,000 from 2,887,248,000. The revenue received for the transportation of goods decreased 2 per cent to \$189,575,000 from \$193,026,000 in the same quarter of 1959 and the revenue per ton mile declined to 6.6 cents from 6.7 cents.

For trips over 50 miles manufactures and miscellaneous products accounted for 56 per cent of the weight of goods carried, 50 per cent of the net ton miles performed and 55 per cent of the revenue for these for hire trucks.

Private Intercity Trucks

The private intercity trucks, in the third quarter of 1960, carried an estimated 40,183,000 tons of goods compared with 46,689,000 tons in the third quarter of 1959, a decrease of 14 per cent. The average weight of goods carried per truck remained at 4 tons but the average distance per ton increased to approximately 30 miles from 20 miles in the same quarter of the previous year. The net ton miles for these vehicles declined 5 per cent to 1,015,240,000 from 1,065,952,000.

For trips over 50 miles, manufactures and miscellaneous products accounted for 63 per cent of both the weight of goods carried and the net ton miles performed by these private intercity trucks.
