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
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MOTOR CARRIERS - FREIGHT 1956

In 1941, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics began the collection, compilation and publication of annual statistics on motor carrier companies engaged in the "for hire" passenger bus, freight and warehousing industries. Freight operators whose annual gross revenues did not exceed \$8,000 were excluded. In 1944 returns from the companies operating public warehousing or storage facilities were used to produce a separate annual report of the "Warehousing Industry". In 1947, the "Motor Carrier" report was then expanded to include "for hire" operators with annual gross revenues of less than \$8,000 in order to obtain broader coverage.

With the publication of this report "Motor Carriers — Freight 1956" recognition is given for the first time to the distinctly different characteristics of the freight and passenger bus industries. The "Motor Carriers; Freight-Passenger" series has now been split into two series, one on passenger bus operations and the other on motor carriers — freight.

The current publication deals with the operations of freight carriers, divided into four groups according to annual gross revenues: group I consist of carriers having annual gross revenues of \$500,000 or more: group II includes firms with gross revenues of from \$100,000 to \$499,999; group III firms with annual gross revenues of from \$20,000 to \$99,999; and group IV those with less than \$20,000 per annum.

The continued cooperation of provincial authorities, trucking associations and other interested parties has resulted in gradual improvement in the statistical quality of this report although much still remains to be done. As a further step in the direction

of improved quality and more effective utilization of resources a new method was instituted in 1955 for the collection of statistics from freight carriers in the less than \$20,000 revenue group. In 1954, carriers in this group (Group IV) comprised almost 65 per cent of firms reporting but earned only slightly more than 6 per cent of total revenues. As a result a disproportionate amount of time and effort was being expended on firms which contributed little to overall industry statistics but which nevertheless were essential in order to present a true industry picture. It was therefore decided to survey firms in this group on a sample basis.

Considerations of minimum size precluded sampling the Atlantic Provinces. Sampling was also ruled out for the provinces of Saskatchewan and British Columbia where motor carrier reports are required under provincial regulations and are filed by all firms on a joint provincial - D.B.S. reporting form. The sampling technique was therefore confined to the provinces of Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba and Alberta. Use of the sampling technique permitted a more extensive follow-up procedure with the result that response was almost 100 per cent. Estimates for these provinces are obtained by blowing up sampling results by the inverse of the sampling ratio and adding data secured from new firms which fall into Group IV. The accuracy, of the data, while satisfactory, does not extend to equipment and accident data which do not appear in sufficient frequency to obtain reliable estimates and in some cases these data have been omitted from this report. Data presented in Group III have been adjusted to provide for firms which formerly appeared in Group IV but which now report revenues in excess of \$20,000.

SUMMARY - ALL CARRIERS

Table 1 presents selected data for the years 1956, 1955 and 1954 for all "for hire" freight carriers. Throughout the report it should be noted that these data are not necessarily comparable since they are based upon reports from a continually changing number of reporting firms. In addition, the total does not always include the same firms from year to year because of the rapid turnover of carriers engaged in the trucking industry. A further important reason for the changing number of reporting firms from year to year is the practice of discarding unsatisfactory reports in an attempt to improve the quality of these data. A considerable number of construction firms, contract carriers, urban transit companies, etc. have been removed from the mailing lists. Proper discarding procedures present a problem because a great many freight carriers do not adequately describe their business operations, and provincial registration records do not provide sufficient information to identify the type of business carried on by each firm.

This report is therefore produced from satisfactory returns received from 2,531 freight carriers as compared with 2,681 in 1955 and 2,411 in 1954.

The total cost of property, vehicles, etc. amounted to \$162.4 million, an increase of \$18.1 million or 12.6 per cent over the 1955 total of \$144.3 million and \$46.0 million or 39.5 per cent above 1954. Total revenue rose to \$233.5 million as compared with \$220.0 million in 1955 and \$181.5 million in 1954 while total operating expenses climbed to \$215.2 million against \$203.5 million and \$169.1 million respectively. As a result net operating revenue increased to \$18.3 million from \$16.5 million in 1955 and \$12.5 million in 1954. The average number of employees engaged by the four freight carrier groups totalled 24,733 whose earnings grossed \$84.4 million. In 1955 the number of employees averaged 23,518 with earnings of \$78.2 million and 20,284 with wages and salaries of \$65.0 million in 1954. Working proprietors decreased in number to 2,342 in 1956 from 2,477 in 1955 but increased from the 1954 total of 2,177.

SUMMARY - GROUPS I, II AND III CARRIERS ONLY

A total of 871 Canadian freight carrier firms whose gross annual revenues were \$20,000 or more during 1956 reported a total cost of property, motor vehicles, etc., amounting to \$152.6 million. In comparison 912 carriers reported an investment figure of \$132.7 million in the previous year. Operating revenues of groups I, II and III carriers rose 7.8 per cent to \$222.4 million in 1956 from \$206.3 million in the preceding year while operating expenses increased to \$207.0 million from \$192.7 million. As a result, net operating revenues increased 14.2 per cent to \$15.5 million from \$13.5 million.

The number of tons of freight carried in 1956 aggregated 22.6 million tons in contrast to 24.0 million tons a year earlier. The carriers consumed 61.0 million gallons of gasoline, 11.6 million gallons of diesel oil and 0.5 million gallons of liquefied petroleum gases. This compares with fuel

consumption of 61.9 million gallons of gasoline, 8.7 million gallons of diesel oil and 0.5 million gallons of liquefied petroleum gases in 1955.

An average of 23,828 persons were employed during the year 1956 and earned wages totalling \$83.1 million for an average of \$3,487 per annum. A year earlier an average of 22,338 earned a total of \$76.5 million or an average annual wage of \$3,422.

Equipment in the service of the freight operators consisted of 6,678 trucks, 6,323 road tractors, 10,579 semi-trailers, 379 full trailers and 53 buses. Ninety-four trucks, 1,355 road tractors and one bus were equipped with diesel engines.

Accidents involving freight carriers in Canada resulted in the death of 58 persons and injury to another 565 during 1956.
