



### INTRODUCTION

Annual statistics of intercity and rural passenger carriers are presented here as a separate report for the first time. These data refer to the "for-hire" segment of the industry and include only companies whose annual gross revenues exceed \$6,000.

Prior to this report certain annual intercity and rural passenger bus statistics were contained in the annual summary of monthly Transit Reports which also contained urban transit data. Other statistics appeared in the annual "Motor Carriers, Freight — Passenger" series which contained statistics of urban operations as well. It was apparent, from a review of these series in 1954, that these reports dealt largely with three distinct and separate types of operation; intercity and rural passenger bus, urban transit, and motor carrier freight.

As a result of the 1954 review, companies reporting 1954 statistics for the monthly Transit Report were divided into two groups on the basis of predominant type of operation, i.e., either urban transit or passenger bus (intercity and rural) and commencing with January 1955, separate monthly reports were produced for each of the "Urban

Transit" and the "Passenger Bus" series. For the year 1955 annual passenger bus statistics were contained in the annual report "Motor Carriers, Freight — Passenger". Included in this report were companies engaged in passenger bus operations, both urban and intercity. The operations of these companies are now being reported in either the urban transit series, or in the passenger bus (intercity and rural) series depending upon the predominant characteristics of their operations.

With the 1956 report the two main divisions of the "Motor Carriers, Freight — Passenger" report are completely separated and published independently. The passenger statistics are released under the title of "Passenger Bus Statistics" while the freight statistics appear as "Motor Carrier Freight Statistics".

Tabulations of intercity and rural passenger bus statistics are presented in the three following groups classified according to gross annual revenue: group I being those carriers earning over \$100,000, group II \$20,000 to \$100,000 and group III \$6,000 to \$20,000.

#### Review of 1956 Operations

#### Financial

Cost of property, vehicles etc. reported by 149 passenger bus operators amounted to \$57.1 million. Depreciation accrued to December 31, 1956 totalled \$33.6 million leaving a book value of \$23.5 million. In 1955, 201 companies reported a total cost of property, vehicles etc. of \$57.5 million, depreciation of \$34.7 million and a book value of \$22.8 million.

Total operating revenues of \$47.7 million were received during 1956 of which \$39.9 million were received from regular passenger intercity and rural service, and the balance from urban operations, freight and other services. Operating expenses totalled \$43.9 million, 25.8 per cent of which was spent on maintenance and garage expenses, 22.4 per cent on wages and bonuses to drivers and helpers, 11.5 per cent on fuel, oil and other transportation expenses, 3.5 per cent on insurance, safety expenses, claims etc., 9.2 per cent on depreciation, 8.5 per cent on operating taxes and licences and 19.1 per cent on rents and other operating expenses. The net operating revenue amounted to \$3.8 million. In the previous year total operating revenues were \$47.7 million, operating expenses \$45.0 million and net operating revenue \$2.7 million.

#### Traffic

The number of revenue passengers carried totalled 77.2 million of which 65.3 million were carried in regular intercity and rural service. A total of 2.7 million were carried in chartered intercity and rural service and 9.1 million in regular urban transit operations. The average revenue per passenger in regular intercity and rural service amounted to \$0.61. In 1955, 92.2 million passengers were carried, 72.9 million in regular intercity and rural service, 13.8 million in urban transit service and 5.3 million in intercity and rural chartered service. Average revenue per passenger in regular intercity and rural service was \$0.55.

#### Mileage, Equipment and Fuel Consumption

99.8 million revenue vehicle miles during 1956 were performed by 2,198 buses for an average of 45,400 miles per bus. This compares with 1955 figures of 102.7 million by 2,629 buses for an average of 39,056 miles per bus. Gasoline amounting to 10,017,975 gallons and dieseloil totalling 5,025,200 gallons were consumed. In 1955, 13,138,869 gallons of gasoline and 4,248,191 gallons of dieseloil were consumed.

### Employees, Salaries and Wages

Total wages and salaries of \$19.1 million were paid to 5,481 employees, an average of \$3,492 per employee, or 6.7 per cent over the 1955 average of \$3,274. Salaries and wages amounted to 43.6 per cent of the total operating expenses in 1956. Of the 5,431 employees 50.4 per cent were drivers and helpers while 24.2 per cent were maintenance workers. In 1955 salaries and wages amounted to 42.9 per cent of total operating expenses. Of the total em-

ployees 51.1 per cent were drivers and helpers while 24.0 per cent were maintenance workers.

#### Accidents

Accidents during 1956 resulted in the deaths of 19 persons and injuries to 780 while 365 accidents involved only property damage of over \$100. In 1955 there were 30 persons killed, 1,123 injured and 991 accidents resulting in only property damage of more than \$100.


