INTRODUCTION

This publication presents the statistics of firms earning a gross annual operating revenue of \$6,000 or more primarily from intercity and rural passenger bus operations. These companies provide common and contract passenger service (apart from school bus service) outside of the following designated urban areas:

- (1) Major urban and metropolitan areas.
- (2) Cities with a population of 5,000 or more.
- (3) Towns and adjoining areas within a range of three miles containing a combined total of 5,000 or more inhabitants.

Firms having both intercity and rural passenger bus and urban transit operations are allocated either to the "Passenger Bus" report or to the "Urban Transit" report, Catalogue No. 53-216, according to the predominant source of their gross annual operating revenue.

Intercity and rural passenger bus operators are allocated to a class according to gross annual operating revenues as follows:

Although not all firms deriving revenue from intercity and rural passenger bus activities are included in this report, the coverage is considered representative of the industry. Factors accounting for incomplete coverage are:

- Carriers which gross an annual operating revenue of less than \$6,000 per year are excluded.
- (2) Carriers engaged predominantly in urban transit, school bus and airport servicing operations or some other industry which cannot provide separate statistics for their passenger bus operations are excluded.
- (3) Firms operating primarily in the U.S.A. which cannot provide separate statistics for their Canadian operations are excluded.

In addition to this lack of total coverage, other factors account for fluctuations in the data from previous years. These include:

- (1) Amalgamations.
- (2) Births and deaths in the industry.
- (3) Changes from one revenue class to another due to business conditions.
- (4) Irregular events such as strikes, severe climatic conditions, etc.
- (5) Improvements in response due to the intensive follow-up and tracer programme.

It should also be noted that the necessity of allocating inter-provincial carriers according to the location of their head office distorts provincial totals to some extent.



Equipment Changes

Buses powered by diesel engines and having seating capacities between 40 and 49 passengers are the most widely purchased types. They accounted for 838 of the 2,622 units reported by Classes 1, 2 and 3 firms as being in service in 1964. The increase from 791 to 824 in the number of diesel powered units with this seating capacity, operated from Class 1 firms, was the most significant equipment change between the years. Major purchases of diesel equipment were made in the Atlantic Provinces (23), Ontario (30) and in the Prairie provinces (47), the majority of the units being in excess of 40 passengers.

Traffic Statistics

The decrease report in number of passengers carried and revenue vehicle miles run, is accounted for by the bus drivers strike in the province of Quebec from June 11 to June 28, 1965. This decline is also reflected in the fuel consumption reported in the 1965 report.

Although Class 1 carriers represented a minority of the total number of firms in the industry, they accounted for most of the revenue earned. The following table illustrates this for both 1964 and 1965.

Property Account

The large decrease in the 1965 property account is attributed to the re-organisation of one of the larger firms in the Province of Quebec and an increasing trend in that province toward leasing equipment. A total of 554 units is recorded for

1965 of which 236 units are reported as leased diesel equipment. The following table reflects the continuing shift from gasoline to diesel powered buses and the preference for units with more seating capacity. Firms disposing of older equipment are generally purchasing larger diesel engined buses.
