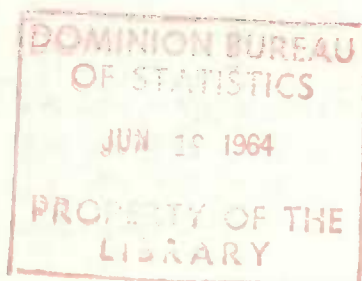

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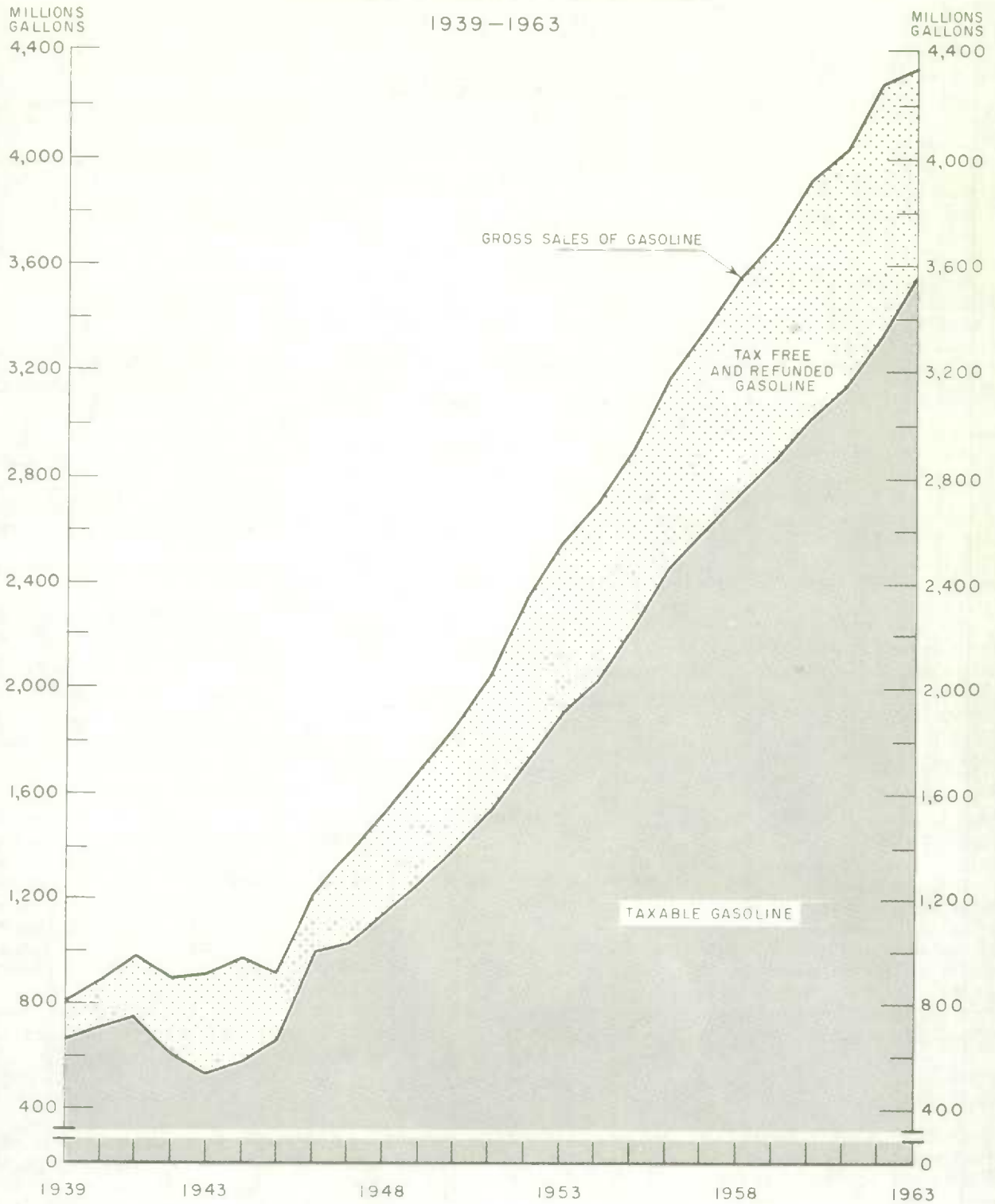

PART II

INTRODUCTION

The present publication represents one volume of a set of four which comprise "The Motor Vehicle" report. These volumes are subtitled as follows:

Part I—"Rates and Regulations"	53-217
Part II—"Motive Fuel Sales"	53-218
Part III—"Registrations"	53-219
Part IV—"Revenues"	53-220

Part I—"Rates and Regulations" contains all information available regarding commercial motor vehicle regulations; tax and licence fee rates, reciprocal highway agreements; size, weight and safety regulations and a current review of gasoline and other motive fuel taxes, by province.

Part II—"Motive Fuel Sales" contains gross and net sales of gasoline and net sales of diesel oil, by province.

Part III—"Registrations" includes provincial registrations of the main classes of motor vehicles; a historical table of total registrations and registrations by county and municipality.

Part IV—"Revenues" shows provincial government revenues from the main classes of motor vehicles and from motive fuel taxes together with a historical table of these revenues as well as unsatisfied judgment fund data.

Motive Fuel Sales

In this part of the "Motor Vehicle" report, it is the objective to provide estimates of the total amount of motive fuel purchased in Canada for use in motor vehicles operating on public roads and highways. As information is not available precisely in accordance with this concept, it has been necessary to obtain estimates by eliminating from gross sales the amount of motive type fuels used for other purposes, wherever possible. The resulting net sales data are considered to approximate the actual amount of motive fuel purchased for use on public roads and highways.

Gross and Net Sales

Gasoline sales figures include motor and tractor grades of gasoline, marked gasoline, aviation fuels and liquefied petroleum gases. Diesel oil sales include both No. 1 and No. 2 grades of diesel oil.

Net sales data are obtained by deducting the following from gross sales:

- (a) Tax exempt sales to the Federal Government,
- (b) Tax exempt sales to Other Consumers,
- (c) Sales on which refunds were paid,
- (d) Exports.

Net sales are thus defined as sales on which a tax or taxes have been paid in full.

Among the problems associated with the obtaining of exact, rather than estimated, figures for this report are:

- (a) No separation in Ontario, prior to April 1, 1963, between sales of aviation fuels and other types of gasoline,
- (b) No separation, in Quebec, between sales of diesel oil for "Motive" and "Other" purposes,
- (c) No data on diesel oil sales in Nova Scotia, and
- (d) No information on the percentage of federal purchases of motive fuels that is used on public roads and highways.

However, with the co-operation of federal and provincial agencies and the increasing refinement of the reporting form and of the data available, the quality of this report is being steadily improved.

For example, Alberta has now provided a breakdown of liquefied petroleum gas sales by "use". This has enabled us to remove, from the 1963 report, sales of 127,586,126 gallons of liquefied petroleum gases used for industrial, manufacturing and domestic heat and power. As a result, gross gasoline sales in Alberta have shown a sharp decrease, although the net sales figures are unaffected because sales for these purposes were never taxed and therefore were not included in previous net sales figures.

Comparability of Data

Despite the apparent relationship between the net sales figures contained in the Industry Division report Refined Petroleum Products (Catalogue No. 45-204) and the gross sales data in this report, the difference in concepts makes a comparison difficult.

The Refined Petroleum Products Report provides total refinery sales figures for all finished petroleum products, while the Motive Fuel Sales Report gives the gross sales of gasoline sold for motive purposes and net sales of gasoline and diesel oil used only as motive fuel on public roads and highways.

In the Refined Petroleum Products Report, total refinery sales of finished petroleum products are broken down into fifteen classifications covering broad ranges of petroleum distillates. The names assigned to these classifications are in some instances indicative of their main use, such as aviation gasoline, motor gasoline and aviation turbo-fuel. Although some of the other twelve classifications include certain amounts ultimately sold for

motive purposes, it is not possible to segregate these quantities and arrive at a comparable total.

Summary

The chart, on page 4, illustrates the growth in the consumption of gasoline in Canada over the past 24 years.

The following table presents a concise comparison of the sales of motive fuels in Canada between 1962 and 1963. Data inclusive and exclusive of liquefied petroleum gases sold for industrial, manufacturing and domestic uses in Alberta are presented in order that the series may be linked at the year of change.

Gross sales of gasoline in most regions were greater in 1963 than in 1962; exceptions were Alberta, the Yukon and the Northwest Territories. Net sales also showed increases, except in New Brunswick which recorded a slight decline of sales. The relatively large increase in net diesel oil sales is due primarily to the continuing increase in the numbers of diesel-powered units being put into service by motor carriers of freight and by bus operators.

Tables 5 and 7 respectively, show net sales of gasolines and diesel oils by month. It should be noted that, since net monthly sales are calculated by subtracting tax refunded sales during a particular month from taxed sales made during that month, a slight distortion of monthly net sales figures is possible.
