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
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
# GROSS SALES OF GASOLINE IN CANADA SHOWING TAXABLE AMOUNTS PURCHASED

### MOTIVE FUEL SALES

#### INTRODUCTION

The present publication represents one volume of a set of four which comprise "The Motor Vehicle" report. These volumes are subtitled as follows:

Part I—"Rates and Regulations" ....	53-217
Part II—"Motive Fuel Sales" .....	53-218
Part III—"Registrations" .....	53-219
Part IV—"Revenues" .....	53-220

Part I—"Rates and Regulations" contains information available regarding private passenger and commercial motor vehicle regulations; tax and licence fee rates, reciprocal highway agreements; size, weight and safety regulations and current data on gasoline and other motive fuel taxes, by provinces.

Part II—"Motive Fuel Sales" contains gross and net sales of gasoline and net sales of diesel oil, by provinces and by months.

Part III—"Registrations" includes provincial registrations of the main classes of motor vehicles; a historical table of registrations, by province, and registrations by place of residence.

Part IV—"Revenues" shows provincial government revenues derived from the main classes of motor vehicles and motive fuel taxes. Also provided is a historical table of these revenues and data on the revenues, payments and limitations of the provincial motor vehicle accident claims funds.

#### Motive Fuel Sales

In this part of the "Motor Vehicle" report, the objective is to provide estimates of the total amount of motive fuel purchased in Canada for use in motor vehicles operating on public roads and highways. As information is not available precisely in accordance with this concept, it has been necessary to obtain estimates by eliminating from gross sales the amount of motive type fuels used for other purposes, wherever possible. The resulting net sales data are considered to approximate the actual amount of motive fuel purchased for use on public roads and highways.

#### Gross and Net Sales

Gasoline sales figures include motor and tractor grades of gasoline, marked gasoline and liquefied petroleum gases. For the years prior to 1960 aviation fuels are included. Diesel oil sales include both No. 1 and No. 2 grades of diesel oil.

Net sales data are obtained by deducting the following from gross sales:

- (a) Tax exempt sales to the Federal Government,
- (b) Tax exempt sales to Other Consumers,
- (c) Sales on which refunds were paid.

Net sales are thus defined as sales on which a tax or taxes have been paid in full.

Among the problems associated with the obtaining of exact, rather than estimated, figures for this report are:

- (a) No separation in Ontario, prior to April 1, 1963, between sales of aviation fuels and other types of gasoline,
- (b) No data on diesel oil sales in Nova Scotia, prior to 1964, and
- (c) No information on the percentage of federal purchases of motive fuels that is used on public roads and highways.

However, with the co-operation of federal and provincial agencies and the increasing refinement of the reporting form and of the data available, the quality of this report is being steadily improved.

#### Comparability of Data

Despite the apparent relationship between the net sales figures contained in the Industry Division report Refined Petroleum Products (Catalogue No. 45-204) and the gross sales data in this report, the difference in concepts makes a comparison difficult.

The Refined Petroleum Products report provides total refinery sales figures for all finished petroleum products, while the Motive Fuel Sales report gives the gross sales of gasoline sold for motive purposes and net sales of gasoline and diesel oil used only as motive fuel on public roads and highways.

In the Refined Petroleum Products report, total refinery sales of finished petroleum products are broken down into fifteen classifications covering broad ranges of petroleum distillates. The names assigned to these classifications are in some instances indicative of their main use, such as aviation gasoline, motor gasoline and aviation turbo fuel. Although some of the other twelve classifications include certain amounts ultimately sold for motive purposes, it is not possible to segregate these quantities and arrive at a comparable total.

### Summary

The charts, on page 4, illustrate the growth in the consumption of gasoline and diesel fuel in Canada over the past 30 years.

Gross sales of gasoline in all regions, except Saskatchewan, were greater in 1969 than in 1968; net sales of gasoline showed a decrease in Saskatchewan over the previous year. Prince Edward Island was the only reporting authority to show a decrease in the net diesel oil in 1969 as compared with 1968.

An unusual situation exists in Newfoundland which causes the net sales of gasoline to be understated and the net sales of diesel fuel to be overstated. The reason for this is that all motive fuel for tax purposes is described as "gasoline" in the Newfoundland gasoline Tax Act. The province reports gross sales of both gasoline and diesel. However, when refunds on gasoline tax are made, the number of gallons of fuel related to the refund

is deducted from the gross sales of gasoline only rather than from both fuels according to the proportion on which refunds of tax were made. The addition of the Newfoundland gross sales of diesel fuel to the net sales of gasoline as shown on the tables in the publication gives the actual approximation of motive fuel sales for consumption on public roads and streets. The proportion of net gasoline sales to net diesel sales is more like 13.6 gallons to 1, or approximately 67.5 million gallons to 4.9 million gallons. This problem has not been solved as yet. When the facts are better known the historical data on fuel sales in Newfoundland will be revised.

Tables 5 and 7 respectively, show net sales of gasoline and diesel oils, by month. It should be noted that, since net monthly sales are calculated by subtracting tax refunded sales during a particular month from taxed sales made during that month, a slight distortion of monthly net sales figures is possible.
