INTRODUCTION

The present publication represents one volume of a set of four, which comprise "The Motor Vehicle" report. These parts are sub-titled as follows:

	Catalogue number
Part I—"Rates and Regulations".....	53-217
Part II—"Motive Fuel Sales".....	53-218
Part III—"Registrations"	53-219
Part IV—"Revenues"	53-220

Part I—"Rates and Regulations" contains information available regarding private passenger and commercial motor vehicle regulations; tax and licence fee rates, reciprocal highway agreements; size, weight and safety regulations and current data on gasoline and other motive fuel taxes, by provinces.

Part II—"Motive Fuel Sales" contains gross and net sales of gasoline and net sales of diesel oil, by provinces and by months.

Part III—"Registrations" includes provincial registrations of the main classes of motor vehicles; a historical table of total registrations and registrations by place of residence.

Part IV—"Revenues" shows provincial government revenues derived from the main classes of motor vehicles and motive fuel taxes. Also provided is a historical table of these revenues and Provincial motor vehicle accident claims fund data.

Registrations

Table 1 is a historical summary showing the increase in registrations since 1903, when Ontario became the first province to require the registration of motor vehicles.

All motor vehicles which are licensed to operate on public highways and streets are included in Table 3 "Registrations of Motor Vehicles, Drivers, etc.". Motorcycles, including motor bicycles, are

classified as motor vehicles. Trolley coaches are registered as motor vehicles in Nova Scotia, Quebec and Ontario, but for licensing purposes Quebec does not distinguish them from motor buses. In other provinces, trolley coaches do not require provincial motor vehicle licences. "New" registrations are defined as vehicles registered for the first time in the reporting province and include used, as well as new vehicles.

New passenger automobiles registered in the province of Quebec, show a sharp decrease from the previous year. This is reportedly due to a change in the registration system following amendments to the Highway Code, effective July 1st, 1963.

Provincial licensing laws vary considerably on the definition of gasoline stations and garages. These refer not only to service stations which sell gasoline and garages which engage in the task of repairing motor vehicles but also to other outlets. For example, Ontario lists as a retail outlet any place having (a) a gasoline pump and (b) a licence to sell gasoline, while British Columbia includes new car dealers selling gasoline. In Ontario and British Columbia, the group "Garages" includes establishments which do not perform automotive repair work, such as used car lots, storage facilities for vehicles, parking lots, etc.

Motor vehicles licensed during the 1964 registration year increased 5.1 p.c. to 6,382,033 from 6,074,655 in 1963. Passenger car registrations were 5,037,861, 5.2 p.c. higher than the 4,788,896 licensed in the previous year, while registrations of commercial vehicles increased 3.9 p.c. to 1,297,039 from 1,248,573. Motorcycles, including motor bicycles increased to 47,133 from 37,186 reported in 1963.

At the end of the 1964 registration year, there were ten motor vehicles registered for every 30 Canadians. Saskatchewan and British Columbia had the largest number of motor vehicles in relation to population, with ten for every 24 persons. For passenger cars only, there were ten for every 38 Canadians. British Columbia and Ontario had the largest number of passenger cars in relation to pop-

ulation at ten per 30 and 33 persons, respectively. All regions showed increases over the previous year in the number of vehicles per capita except Prince Edward Island. Ontario, Saskatchewan and Alberta remained unchanged from 1963.

Gains in total registrations, which occurred in all provinces except Prince Edward Island, ranged from a low of 3.8 p.c. in Saskatchewan to a high of 10.8 p.c. in Newfoundland.

In Table 4, the totals represent the number of vehicles registered in each of the cities and counties

according to the home address of the owner, except for Quebec and British Columbia which are by place of issuance of the licence.

The data contained in Table 4 covering Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta have been made available through the courtesy of R.L. Polk and Co. (Canada) Ltd. of Toronto while the remaining information has been provided by provincial motor vehicle registration authorities.


