

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# MOVING AND STORAGE HOUSEHOLD GOODS

# 1963

This publication presents the statistics of firms engaged primarily in the moving and storage of household goods. In 1960, firms in this category were removed from the "Motor Carrier-Freight" (Catalogue No. 53-205) and the "Warehousing" (Catalogue No. 53-212) Reports and allocated to this new report.

Anyone desiring to obtain a complete picture of the warehousing and cartage industry, including the moving and storage of household goods, should use the material in Tables 2, 3, and 6 of this report, in conjunction with the "Warehousing, General Merchandise and Refrigerated Goods Report" (Catalogue No. 63-212). Special note should also be made of Table 5 of the Warehousing report which shows the amount of storage service provided by firms primarily engaged in motor carrier-freight operations.

As this publication is intended to cover the operations of firms engaged primarily in the moving and storage of household goods in Canada, the following are excluded:

- (a) Firms whose predominant source of revenue is some other activity and who cannot provide separate data for their household goods moving and storage operations;
- (b) Firms operating predominately in the U.S.A., that cannot provide separate data on their Canadian operations.

Among the factors, which account for fluctuations in the data and the number of firms reporting, are the following:

- (a) Amalgamations.
- (b) Births and deaths in the industry,
- (c) Expansions and contractions due to business conditions,
- (d) Improvement in response due to the intensive follow-up and tracer programme.

It should be noted that the allocation of interprovincial carriers according to their headquarters location can distort provincial totals to some extent.

#### SUMMARY TABLES

#### SUMMARY

Because of the co-operation we have received from the industry as a whole and our own efforts to extend the coverage and improve response, the number of firms reporting has increased from 193 in 1962 to 227 in 1963.

Although increases in the numbers of firms were obtained for the Atlantic Provinces, Quebec, Ontario and British Columbia, the net increases in the valuation of the industry's assets and gross revenues were only 22.1 per cent and 19.2 per cent

respectively. Despite the increases in the numbers, assets and gross revenues of the firms reporting, net operating revenues declined by 7.5 per cent between 1962 and 1963, while the operating ratio of the 173 firms reporting in both years fell slightly from 94.9 to 95.7, reflecting the 13.7 per cent decrease in net operating revenues. Although total storage facilities available increased by 16.3 per cent, 2.4 million cubic feet or 47.5 per cent of the increase can be attributed to the expansion of the storage facilities of the 173 firms reporting in both years, with the 34 added firms contributing only slightly more than an average of 100,000 cubic feet each.

The Summary Table, on page 5, shows that, although the total operating revenues of the 227 reporting firms increased by 19.2 per cent from the 1962 total for 193 firms, operating expenses showed an even greater increase of 20.6 per cent, producing a decline in the net operating revenues of 7.5 per cent and a fall in the operation ratio from 94.9 to 96.0. On a firm average basis, an average gross operating revenue increase of 1.3 per cent was offset by a 2.5 per cent increase in average operating

expenses, producing a drop of 21.3 per cent in average net operating revenues.

The Comparison Table, on page 6, which presents a more precise picture of developments in the industry, since it compares the statistics of the 173 firms reporting for both years, indicates that although operating revenues rose by 2.8 per cent the 3.7 per cent increase in operating expenses produced a less favourable operating situation, with the operating ratio changing slightly from 94.9 in 1962 to 95.7 in 1963, Between 1962 and 1963, these same 173 firms representing 76,2 per cent of firms reporting, earning 81.4 per cent of reported revenues and operating 82.9 per cent of the reported property and equipment, increased their net investment in land, buildings and equipment by 6.1 per cent. At the same time their storage space available rose by 8.0 per cent, although the percentage of occupancy fell slightly from 72.2 to 71.0 per cent.

Based on the depreciated value of their property, the net operating revenue per investment dollar of the 173 firms fell from 13.3 cents in 1962 to 11.0 cents in 1963.
