



MOVING AND STORAGE HOUSEHOLD GOODS

1964

This publication presents the statistics of firms engaged primarily in the moving and storage of household goods. In 1960, firms in this category were removed from the "Motor Carrier-Freight" (Catalogue No. 53-205) and the "Warehousing" (Catalogue No. 53-212) Reports and allocated to this new report.

Anyone desiring to obtain a complete picture of the warehousing and cartage industry, including the moving and storage of household goods, should use the material in Tables 2, 3, and 6 of this report, in conjunction with the "Warehousing, General Merchandise and Refrigerated Goods Report" (Catalogue No. 63-212). Special note should also be made of Table 5 of the Warehousing report, which shows the amount of storage service provided by firms primarily engaged in motor carrier-freight operations.

As this publication is intended to cover the operations of firms engaged primarily in the moving and storage of household goods in Canada, the following are excluded:

- (a) Firms whose predominant source of revenue is from some other activity and that cannot provide separate data for their household goods moving and storage operations;
- (b) Firms operating predominately in the U.S.A., that cannot provide separate data on their Canadian operations.

Among the factors which account for fluctuations in the data and the number of firms reporting, are the following:

- (a) Amalgamations,
- (b) Births and deaths in the industry,
- (c) Expansions and contractions due to business conditions,
- (d) Improvement in response due to the intensive follow-up and tracer programme.

It should be noted that the allocation of inter-provincial carriers according to their headquarters location can distort provincial totals to some extent.

SUMMARY

The number of firms reporting increased from 227 in 1963 to 228 in 1964. Increases in the number of firms were obtained for Quebec, Manitoba and Saskatchewan. Alberta and British Columbia, however, showed a decrease of 1 and 3 firms, respectively.

The total property account (after depreciation) decreased 6.0 per cent. This is attributed to the

drop in revenue equipment in operation at the close of 1964, despite an increase in the overall number of firms reporting. Total operating revenues decreased 0.6 per cent, and total operating expenses declined by 1.5 per cent. However, the operating ratio, which is the proportion of total operating revenues absorbed by operating expenses, improved by 0.8 per cent, from 96.0 per cent in 1963 to 95.2 per cent in 1964, reflecting a 19.9 per cent increase in net operating revenues.

Household goods storage space decreased 6.7 per cent. This change is reflected in the 6.0 per cent decrease in the total property account. Although the total storage space available decreased, the average occupancy increased 1.7 per cent in 1964.

The Comparison Table above gives an indication of how a matched group of firms progressed in the past year. It compares the statistics of 168 firms that reported in both 1963 and 1964. The 2.6 per cent increase in household goods storage facilities and a 2.3 per cent increase in the percentage of occupancy (average for the year) can be attributed to the 2.7 per cent increase in the total property account (after depreciation), also, there was an increase in the revenue equipment operated by these firms at the end of 1964. Operating revenues increased considerably—especially the local cartage of household goods and household goods storage revenues. They

showed an increase of 14.8 per cent and 7.3 per cent, respectively, and total operating revenues showed an increase of 8.8 per cent. The net operating revenues also showed an increase of 19.6 per cent, and the operating ratio improved by 0.4 per cent. The 168 firms reporting in both years accounted for 29.9 million cubic feet, or 88.3 per cent of the total household goods storage space available, while the other 60 firms contributed slightly under 4.0 million cubic feet.

The average number of employees increased by 1.6 per cent, while total salaries and wages paid increased 7.1 per cent.

Based on depreciated property values, the net operating revenue per investment dollar of the 168 firms increased from 10.7 cents in 1963 to 12.5 cents in 1964.
