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

MOVING AND STORAGE HOUSEHOLD GOODS

1968

This publication presents the statistics of firms engaged primarily in the moving and storage of household goods. In 1960, firms in this category were removed from the "Motor Carrier-Freight" (Catalogue No. 53-205) and the "Warehousing" (Catalogue No. 63-212) reports and allocated to this new report.

Anyone desiring to obtain a complete picture of the warehousing and cartage industry, including the moving and storage of household goods, should use the material in Tables 2, 3, and 6 of this report, in conjunction with the "Warehousing, General Merchandise and Refrigerated Goods Report" (Catalogue No. 63-212). Special note should also be made of Table 5 of the Warehousing report, which shows the amount of storage service provided by firms primarily engaged in motor carrier-freight operations.

As this publication is intended to cover the operations of firms engaged primarily in the moving and storage of household goods in Canada, the following are excluded:

- (a) Firms whose predominant source of revenue is from some other activity and that cannot provide separate data for their household goods moving and storage operations;
- (b) Firms operating predominately in the U.S.A., that cannot provide separate data on their Canadian operations.

Among the factors which account for fluctuations in the data and the number of firms reporting, are the following:

- (a) Amalgamations,
- (b) Births and deaths in the industry,
- (c) Expansions and contractions due to business conditions,
- (d) Improvement in response due to the intensive follow-up and tracer programme.

It should be noted that the allocation of inter-provincial carriers according to their headquarters location can distort provincial totals to some extent.

SUMMARY

The number of firms included in this report increased by 29 to 316 from 287 in 1967. Increases were: Atlantic (3), Quebec (6), Ontario (7), Manitoba (2), Saskatchewan (4), and British Columbia (9). Alberta decreased by (2) firms.

The total property account (after depreciation) increased 11.0 per cent. Total operating revenues increased 3.9 per cent and total operating expenses increased 4.2 per cent from 1967. The operating ratio, which is the proportion of total operating

revenues absorbed by operating expenses for all firms, rose slightly by 0.3 per cent from 96.4 in 1967 to 96.7 in 1968. Net operating revenues decreased by 3.5 per cent.

Owned warehouse storage space available for occupancy during 1968 as reported, increased by 12.6 per cent from 1967, and leased warehouse storage space decreased by 11.3 per cent. Household goods storage space increased 2.2 per cent, while the average occupancy decreased 3.4 per cent from 72.9 per cent in 1967 to 68.9 per cent in 1968.

Diesel Equipment and Diesel Fuel Consumption

Table 7 shows that diesel engine trucks decreased to 45 in 1968 from 62 in 1967. Diesel engine tractors owned or leased during the year increased to 245 units from the 203 units reported in the previous year. Diesel fuel consumption, as indicated in Table 5, increased to 1,248 thousand gallons from 1,038 thousand gallons in 1967.

Comparison Table

The Comparison Table on page 6 gives the progress of 237 firms from 1967 to 1968. Operating revenues increased by 3.9 per cent, with long distance movement of household goods decreasing by 2.7 per cent and local cartage increasing by 8.7 per cent. Household goods storage revenues increased by 4.4 per cent. All other operating revenues were

up by 10.5 per cent from 1967. Although operating revenues rose by 3.9 per cent, the 4.2 per cent increase in operating expenses produces a less favourable operating situation as indicated by the operating ratio which changed from 96.4 in 1967 to 96.7 in 1968. The 237 firms that reported in both years accounted for 42.7 million cubic feet, or 85.1 per cent of the total household goods storage space reported in 1968; the remaining 79 firms reporting in 1968 accounted for 7.5 million cubic feet.

The average number of employees decreased by 0.5 per cent and the total salaries and wages paid during 1968 increased 5.5 per cent.

Based on depreciated property values, the net operating revenue per investment dollar of the 237 firms declined from 10.5 cents in 1967 to 9.1 cents in 1968.
