SMUIT Ste Maria Canal

The total traffic through the Canadian and American Canals at Sault Ste. Marie amounted to 3,263,542 tons as against 9,420,086 tons for November 1920. The decrease was in iron ore and soft coal. Wheat increased over 16,000,000 bushels and other grains increased 3,500,000 bushels. Since September 1st there has been 123,000,000 bushels of shipped through the canals.

Welland Canal

The total traffic increased over last year by 20,988 tons. There was a slight decrease in shipments of barley but shipments of all other grains increased. Pulpwood and soft coal show considerable decreases. The total soft coal down the canal this season was 674,302 tons as against 1,379,261 last year a decrease of 704,959 tons.

St. Lawrence Canal

Although the grain shipments were considerably heavier than last year the large decreases in the coal and pulpwood shipments caused a decrease in the total freight of 18,8 94 tons. The total shipments for the season for hard and soft coal were 227,396 and 756,899 tons respectively as against 257,873 and 1,401,284 tons for the sorresponding period in 1920.
