Sault Ste Marie Canals

The traffic through the Canadian and American Locks at Sault Ste Marie showed a decrease from July of 640,138 tons and from August 1920 of 4,927,616 tons. The decrease from last year was principally due to the light from ore shipments which decreased 4,399,872 or over 50 per cent while the soft coal shipments were 788,922 tons less than during July. Wheat showed an increase of 2,290,887 bushels and other commodities showed little change from last year. The passenger traffic showed a decrease of 2,481 passengers from last year but was 1,483 passengers over July.

Welland Canal

The traffic on the Welland Canal shows an increase over last year of 99,422 tons due to increases in grain. The grain cargoes constitute over 63 per cent of the traffic. Soft coal shows a decrease of 171,550 tons.

St. Lawrence Canal
There was a decrease in the traffic from July of 50,600 tons. The largest decrease was in the American corn which decreased 118,507 tons. Other grains show considerable increases over July and also over August 1920.

During the last two months there have been large quantities of American grain exported via Montreal which is shipped via Georgian Bay ports and rail to Montreal and also all water via the Welland and St. Lawrence Canals. The premium on American currency and the elevation charges at New York make the all water Canadian route from Chicago, Duluth and Milwaukee about 23 cents per bushel less than via Buffalo and New York. Both the lake and rail and the all rail rate from Port Arthur and Fort William to Montreal is over 5 cents per bushel less than to New York. The payment in Canadian currency reduces this still further and more than offsets the heavier insurance rates from Montreal.
