## Sault Ste. Marie Canals:

C-1

Traffic through the Canadian and United States locks showed a decrease from June, 1924 of 136,071 tons. Wheat cargoes were lighter by 6,665,087 bushels or 199,952 tons; other grains fell off 3,228,162 bushels but iron ore showed a gain of 196,823 tons and soft coal, an increase of 60,051 tons.

## Welland Canal:

Total traffic showed a decrease of 65,195 tons from that of June, 1924. Wheat was lighter by 169,272 tons; barley,by 3,091 tons; rye, by 16,926 tons; oil, by 6,990 tons; and sand,by 15,445 tons. Oats were heavier by 33,041 tons; pulpwood, by 22,623 tons and soft coal by 79,469 tons.

## St. Lawrence Canals:

Wheat shipments were lighter than a year ago by 175,137 tons and since the opening of navigation show a decrease from 1924 of 405,839 tons or 13,527,960 bushels. Rye was lighter by 22,497 tons and hard coal, by 13,823 tons. Merchandise showed an increase of 10,432 tons; pulpwood, an increase of 57,857 tons; soft coal, an increase of 69,804 tons and sand, an increase of 14,502 tons. Oats were also heavier by 34,924 tons and the total of all cargoes showed a net decrease of 5,427 tons.
