SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC

NOVEMBER, 1926

Sault Ste. Marie Canals:
Canadian and United States Locks:

The traffic through the locks was 240,413 tons less than during November last year, due to decreases of 3,512,917 bushels of wheat, 5,368,521 bushels of other grains, 128,938 tons of 1ron ore and 137,988 tons of bituminous coal. Flour showed a gain of 168,180 barrels and anthracite coal a gain of 156,500 tons. Since the opening of navigation 84,294,866 tons have passed through the locks which is 4,259,957 tons greater than in 1925 for the same period.


Welland Canal:

The total traffic for November was lighter than in 1925 by 82,620 tons, the larger decreases being oats 24,823 tons, flax 4,973 tons, wheat 116,924 tons, oil 18,550 tons, pulpwood 17,761 tons and anthracite coal 2,200 tons; there were no cargoes of the last two commodities during November, 1926. Gains were made in barley of 17,342 tons, in corn of 15,607 tons, in iron and steel of 21,708 tons and in bituminous coal of 31,441 tons. The total traffic from the opening of the canal to November 30 was 5,150,532 tons which was 420,311 tons less than in 1925 but greater than for the entire season of any previous year.

St. Lawrence Canala:

The wheat traffic was 103,821 tons, or 3,460,700 bushels lighter than in November 1925, oats was lighter by 20,542 tons, rye by 7,113 tons, flax by 2,548 tons, flour by 1,338 tons, fruit and vegetables by 1,752 tons, pulpwood by 5,371 tons and ores other than iron by 6,215 tons. Increases were made by barley 20,310 tons, corn 14,186 tons, iron and steel 15,760 tons, oil 12,068 tons, merchandise 11,792 tons, bituminous coal 37,925 tons and sand 13,380 tons, the total traffic being 10,649 tons less than in 1925. The total traffic for the season to the end of November was 6,051,425 tons as against 6,120,432 tons for the corresponding period last year.
