SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

FOR  
JUNE, 1927.

Sault Ste. Marie Canals: Grain traffic was considerably lighter than in June last year, wheat shipments being less by 19,713,426 bushels and other grains by 8,304,493 bushels. Iron ore was heavier by 67,270 tons and coal by 525,766 tons, but the total traffic showed a decrease of 296,712 tons.

Welland Canal: The total traffic was lighter than for May, but was heavier than for June, 1926 by 41,814 tons and the total for the season to the end of June was heavier than last year by 751,207 tons. Corn, oats and wheat were lighter than in 1926 by 3,377 tons, 66,242 tons, and 23,985 tons respectively, but coal was heavier by 22,089 tons and sand increased by 23,130 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals: Traffic on the St. Lawrence reached a new high record, exceeding the May, 1927 tonnage by 117,257 tons. Rye showed an increase over last year of 111,753 tons, pulpwood an increase of 30,553 tons, bituminous coal an increase of 41,701 tons, and sand, an increase of 35,514 tons, the total being heavier by 151,005 tons.
