SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

FOR

JULY, 1927

Sault Ste. Marie Canals:

Total traffic through the Canadian and United States locks was lighter than for July, 1926 by 1,949,736 tons. Iron ore decreased by 1,528,739 tons, anthracite coal by 207,583 tons, wheat was heavier by 355,444 bushels, but other grains were lighter by 10,093,171 bushels.



Barley, oats and rye showed large declines, viz. 57,666 tons, 60,497 tons and 61,771 tons respectively. Wheat increased by 67,310 tons, pulpwood by 18,940 tons, sand by 31,233 tons and merchandise by 8,972 tons. The total traffic was lighter than in July, 1926 by 34,647 tons, but the cumulative total for the season to July 31 was 717,693 tons above the corresponding total for 1926.

St. Lawrence Canals:

Total traffic was less than in 1926 by 70,704 tons, due to decreases of 57,182 tons of barley, 58,501 tons of oats, 60,645 tons of rye and smaller decreases in coal, iron and steel, and pig iron. Wheat was heavier by 64,258 tons, pulpwood by 31,694 tons, sand by 16,344 tons and merchandise by 6,942 tons; the cumulative total to July 31 was heavier than in 1926 by 671,208 tons.
