SUMMARY OF CAMAL STATISTICS FOR OCTCRER, 1928

Sault Ste. Marie Canals: Canadian and United States Locks:

Historical File Copy Total traffic was heavier than for October, 1927, by 2,372,110 tons. Iron ore increased by 1,817,020 tons, wheat by 13,081,732 bushels, or 392,452 tons, other grains by 2,232,849 bushels and coal by 136,775 tons.

Welland Canal:

There was a decrease of 15,087 tons of freight using the canal as compared with the October, 1927, traffic. Sand decreased by 35,176 tons, bituminous coal by 23,671 tons, wheat by 22,467 tons, rye by 16,568 tons, corn by 10,570 tons, flax by 5,263 tons and pulpwood by 4,061 tons.


For the season to October 31, the total traffic amounted to 6,321,341 tons as against 6,339,731 tons last year. The largest decreases were 381,183 tons of rye, 136,239 tons of sand and 46,939 tons of bituminous coal.

St. Lawrence Canals:

Total traffic including both through and way freight, or freight traversing the entire length of the canal and freight using only a part of the canals, amounted to 1,270,051 tons which was an increase over the October, 1927, traffic of 71,099 tons. Bituminous coal was heavier by 43,266 tons, barley by 22,647 tons, iron and steel by 10,536 tons, and netrolaym and cils by 11,752 tons. Wheat decreased by steel by 19,886 tons and petroleum and oils by 11,752 tons. Wheat decreased by 18,348 tons, or 611,600 bushels, corn by 10,136 tons, rye by 9,049 tons, flax by 5,393 tons and anthracite coal by 8,135 tons.

For the season to October 31, the total traffic was heavier than in 1927 by 293,199 tons. Wheat increased by 198,107 tons, oats by 147,532 tons and bituminous coal by 200,758 tons. Rye decreased by 375,058 tons, pulpwood by 63,495 tons, corn by 42,029 tons and cement brick and lime by 20,136 tons.
