
SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC FOR APRIL, 1928



Although the Welland canal was opened for traffic on April 16, the same date as in 1927, and the St. Lawrence opened also on April 16, two days earlier than in 1927, the canals at Sault Ste. Marie were not opened until May 1st and consequently the traffic, especially grain, through the Welland and St. Lawrence canals was considerably lighter than for April last year. The Welland canal traffic was lighter by 269,201 tons and the St. Lawrence canal traffic by 184,139 tons.
