SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

FOR

JUNE, 1928


Sault Ste. Marie Canals: The total traffic through the Canadian and United States locks at Sault Ste. Marie was heavier than in June, 1927, by 19,534 tons. ore was heavier by 160,429 tons, wheat increased by 16,367,010 bushels and other Iron grains increased by 5,306,248 bushels, but bituminous coal was lighter by 931,223 tons.

Welland Canal: Total traffic on the Welland canal for the first time in June was over a million tons, amounting to 1,037,051 tons which was 45,264 tons heavier than in June, 1927. Wheat increased by 59,198 tons, oats by 51,270 tons but rye declined by 89,426 tons and flax by 1,682 tons. Bituminous coal also decreased by 11,883 tons. The cumulative total from the opening of navigation was 2,087,004 tons which was 267,201 tons less than for the same period in 1927.

St. Lawrence Canals: There was a decrease from the June, 1927, traffic of 67,868 tons, the largest decreases being, rye 93,679 tons, pulpwood 27,503 tons, ore (other than copper and iron) 6,240 tons, bituminous coal 4,505 tons, anthracite coal 3,700 tons and iron and steel 4,386 tons. Oats increased by 43,168 tons, wheat by 7,557 tons, merchandise by 6,778 tons, copper ore by 4,025 tons and iron ore by 2,700 tons.
