

SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

FOR

NOVEMBER, 1930.



Sault Ste Marie Canels: Canadian and United States Locks:

5,129,889 tons of freight passed through the locks at Sault Ste. Marie during November, a decrease of 1,822,501 tons as compared with Movember, 1929. Shirments of wheat increased by 5,795,163 bushels and other grains by 6,922,952 bushels. Iron ore shirments showed a reduction of 1,675,843 tons and soft coal of 497,360 tons. The traffic through the Canadian canal was 52,070 tons heavier than in November, 1929.


Welland Canal:

November traffic on the Welland canal increased 135,757 tons over that of November, 1929. Gains were registered by wheat, petroleum and soft coal, while iron and steel and copper ore showed decreases. To November 30th the betterment in the Welland traffic, as compared with a similar period last year, was 1,297,247 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals:

Traffic through these canals during November was 40,148 tons heavier than in November, 1929. Shipments of wheat, corn, hard coal and petroleum increased while iron and steel, soft coal and sand recorded declines. The cumulative traffic of the St. Lawrence canals to the end of November amounted to 6,115,938 tons, an increase of 421,229 tons over the corresponding period in 1929.
