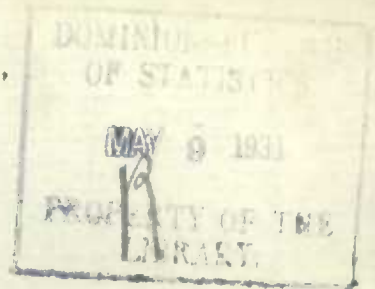

SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC

FOR

APRIL, 1931

Historical File Copy

Traffic started through the Sault Ste. Marie canals on the United States side on April 10th and on the Canadian side on April 13th, or 11 days earlier than in 1930, through the Welland canal on April 9th, or 12 days earlier, and through the St. Lawrence canals on April 17th, or 5 days later than in 1930. The large upper lake vessels are not yet allowed through the Welland Ship Canal and the maximum draft allowed is 18 feet.

Below is a summary of the traffic on the various canals which were open in April, 1931.

Consular Affairs

The Department of State is pleased to announce that the Bureau of Consular Affairs has been reorganized to provide more efficient service to the public. The new organization will be effective on October 1, 1954. The Bureau will continue to be headed by the Assistant Secretary for Consular Affairs, who will also be the Director of the Bureau. The Bureau will be divided into three main divisions: the Division of Consular Administration, the Division of Consular Operations, and the Division of Consular Services. The Division of Consular Administration will be responsible for the general administration of the Bureau, including the management of personnel, budget, and facilities. The Division of Consular Operations will be responsible for the day-to-day operations of the Bureau, including the processing of visas, passports, and other consular documents. The Division of Consular Services will be responsible for providing consular services to the public, including the issuance of visas, passports, and other consular documents. The Bureau will continue to be a part of the Department of State and will continue to be responsible for the protection and promotion of the interests of the United States abroad.
