Sault Ste. Marie Canals:

Traffic through the locks at Sault Ste. Marie during July continued light amounting to only 7,612,657 tons which was 4,754,837 tons less than in 1930. Wheat shipments decreased by 10,034,384 bushels and iron ore was lighter by 3,703,869 tons although heavier than in June this year by 1,034,989 tons Historical File Copy

Welland Canal:


Despite a decrease from July, 1930 of 249,525 tons or 8,314,160 bulber of wheat the total traffic was heavier by 20,595 tons amounting to 871,513 tons. The increases were largely in traffic to Lake Ontario ports, bituminous coal increasing by 135,915 tons and iron ore by 68,011 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals:

Total traffic amounted to 716,991 tons as against 929,886 tons in July, 1930 and 919,649 tons in June, 1931. Wheat decreased from last year by 265,586 tons, or 8,852,860 bushels, pulpwood, west bound, decreased by 71,624 tons, ore other than copper and iron by 9,112 tons and sugar by 8,791 tons.

Gasoline and oils increased by 24,640 tons, sand by 27,290 tons, barley by 48,079 tons and oats by 19,320 tons.
