Traffic started through the Canadian and United States locks at Sault Ste.

Marie on April 17th. This was four days later than last year for the Canadian
lock and seven days later for the United States locks. The Welland Ship canal
opened April 7th, two days earlier than last year, and the St. Lawrence canals
opened on April 14th, three days earlier.

The Welland Ship canal showed an increase of 94,665 tons, but traffic through the Sault Ste. Marie locks declined by 553,336 tons and through the St. Lawrence canals by 40,133 tons. The wheat shipments were light through all three canals.
