Sault Ste. Marie Canals: Canadian and United States Locks:

C.

Freight using the Sault Ste. Marie locks during October amounted to 7,154,293 tons, or almost twice the 1932 traffic. Heavy shipments of iron ore were the chief factor in the improvement, this tonnage increasing from 904,521 tons in October 1932 to 4,782,866 tons in 1933. Wheat shipments were lighter by 22 per cent and other grains were also slightly lighter. Up to October 31st 37,117,026 tons of freight had passed through the locks, as against 17,388,745 tons for the same period in 1932.


Welland Ship Canal:

Total traffic was slightly lighter than in September, but at 1,352,644 tons it was 100,815 tons heavier than the October 1932 total. Wheat was heavier than in 1932 by 30,438 tons and rye increased by 15,368 tons, but all other grains were lighter. Pulpwood was heavier by 25,908 tons, paper by 17,078 tons, merchandise by 41,737 tons, coke by 45,723 tons and iron ore by 42,289 tons. The totals to October 31st were 7,994,579 tons this year and 7,304,173 tons last year.

St. Lawrence Canals:

Total traffic for October amounted to 1,040,854 tons as against 1,013,729 tons in 1932. Rye and flaxseed were heavier than in 1932, but other grains were lighter, wheat decreasing by 62,621 tons or 2,087,300 bushels, oats by 24,042 tons, corn by 15,341 tons and barley by 16,028 tons. Both hard and soft coal showed increases, pulpwood was heavier by 73,185 tons, paper by 14,525 tons, gasolene by 9,378 tons and merchandise by 24,466 tons. The totals up to October 31st were 6,170,652 tons in 1933 and 5,891,364 tons in 1932, an increase this year of 279,288 tons.
