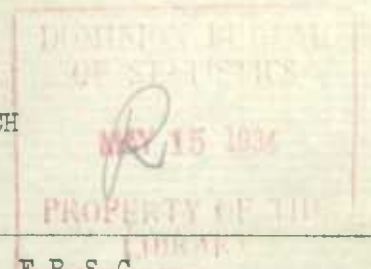

SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC

APRIL, 1934

Navigation on the Great Lakes opened much later than in previous years. The United States locks at Sault Ste. Marie opened on April 29th as against April 19th last year and the first passage through the Canadian lock was on May 1st. The Welland Ship Canal opened on April 17th as against April 4th last year and the St. Lawrence Canals on April 18th, or four days later than in 1933. Consequently the freight passed through these canals during April was considerably lighter than during April 1933.
