## SUIDIARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC

## JUNE, 1935

# Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks:

With an exceptionally light movement of grain and decreases in iron ore and coal, total traffic through the canal decreased from 7,901,370 tons in June, 1934, to 7,057,730 tons. Only 10,816,725 bushels of wheat moved eastward as against 28,154,413 bushels last year. Not since 1921 has the movement been so light for the month of June. Iron ore decreased 119,070 tons and bituminous coal decreased 256,409 tons.

### Welland Ship Canal:

Total freight using the canal amounted to 1,071,997 tons as against 1,235,655 tons last year, a decrease of 163,658 tons, or 13 per cent. More than half the commodities showed decreases and the only large increases were: pulpwood 24,610 tons, barley 10,105 tons, wood pulp 9,341 tons, oats 2,463 tons and flaxseed 2,378 tons. Wheat decreased by 82,619 tons, rye by 32,609 tons and iron ore by 22,241 tons.

#### St. Lawrence Canals:

Total freight using the canals amounted to 882,062 tons as against 901,255 tons last year. Wheat decreased by only 639 tons, or 21,300 bushels, but both this and last year's June wheat chipments were the lightest since 1921; for 1922-1933 they averaged 358,000 tons and amounted to only 148,432 tons in 1934 and 147,793 tons in 1935. Anthracite coal was 20,033 tons lighter than last year, but bituminous coal increased by 17,008 tons.
