SUMMARY OF CAMAL TRAFFIC

JULY, 1935.

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks:

Despite a heavy movement of wheat through the canals total traffic amounting to 7,503,013 tons was slightly less than the total of 7,522,124 tons for July 1934. Wheat increased from 16,668,150 bushels to 26,224,372 bushels, and iron ore increased from 4,705,363 tons to 4,836,613 tons but other grains declined from 5,714,490 bushels to 1,407,782 bushels and soft coal declined from 1,775,071 tons to 1,359,275 tons.

Willand Ship Canal:


All grains recorded decreases compared with 1934 shipments and total freight decreased from 1,334,376 tons to 1,128,021 tons. Wheat decreased from 258,439 tons to 243,695 tons, or by 491,466 bushels, rye decreased by 18,312 tons, soft coal by 54,879 tons, coke by 50,313 tons and iron ore by 58,360 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals:

Although wheat decreased by 38,538 tons or from 242,766 tons to 204,228 tons, corn increased by 46,481 tons, and total traffic increased from 977,261 tons in July 1934 to 1,007,428 tons. Hard coal was up by 40,036 tons and soft coal by 19,288 tons.
