

SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC


OCTOBER, 1936

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Total freight through the locks increased by 45 per cent, or from 7,453,671 tons in October, 1935, to 10,789,338 tons. Down-bound iron ore increased by 2,757,716 tons, or 56 per cent, and up-bound soft coal by 878,763 tons, or 129 per cent. Grains were considerably lighter and so were flour and lumber down-bound and hard coal, oil and gasolene up-bound.

Welland Ship Canal: Heavy shipments of wheat and soft coal down the canal were the principal factors in raising the total freight from 1,153,023 tons in October, 1935, to 1,645,696 tons, the greatest tonnage for any month in the history of the canal. Total freight tonnage using the canal since the opening of navigation to October 31st was 8,897,049 tons, or 1,424,035 tons greater than in 1935.

St. Lawrence Canals: Total traffic using the canals increased from 992,490 tons last year to 1,385,546 tons, wheat shipments increasing by 230,911 tons or 7,697,033 bushels. Corn was heavier by 65,263 tons, paper by 67,346 tons, pulpwood by 45,496 tons and soft coal by 67,470 tons.
