## SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC

## APRIL, 1936


Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: The Canadian canal opened for navigation on April 28 and the United States canal on April 29, whereas last year the United States canal was opened April 16 and the Canadian canal on May 2.

Welland Ship Canal: The Welland Ship canal opened April 17, three days later than in 1935, and the freight using the canal decreased from 484,481 tons to 94,691 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals: The St. Lawrence canals opened on April 17, as against April 10 last year, but, despite this difference of seven days, the total traffic was heavier than in 1935 by 30,308 tons, increasing from 157,119 to 187,427 tons.

The Ottawa, Chambly, Murray and St. Peter's canals were also opened for navigation in April.
