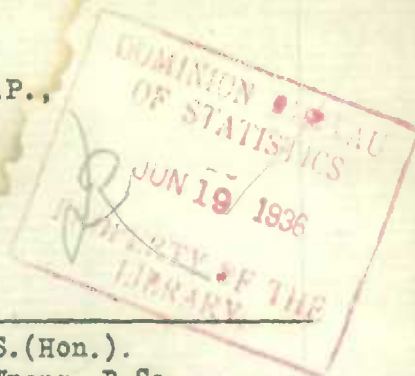

SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC

MAY, 1936

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Freight traffic through the canals during May was the heaviest since 1930, amounting to 7,064,039 tons as against 4,974,285 tons in May last year. Wheat shipments increased from 7,783,313 bushels to 28,938,415 bushels, other grains increased from 3,062,561 bushels to 11,622,446 bushels, iron ore from 3,562,336 tons to 4,955,413 tons, and soft coal from 1,623,651 tons to 2,000,660 tons.

Welland Ship Canal: Total freight tonnage using the canal amounted to 1,618,426 tons, an increase over last year's traffic of 496,675 tons. Wheat was heavier by 314,891 tons, or 208 per cent, barley increased from 4,622 tons to 59,217 tons, pulpwood increased by 29,545 tons, or 129 per cent, and soft coal was heavier by 173,436 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals: Large increases in barley, wheat, wood pulp and pulpwood were the main factors in increasing the total tonnage from 919,021 tons in May last year to 1,300,182 tons. Rye was lighter by 40,650 tons, corn by 21,958 tons and hard coal by 23,388 tons.
