SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC


JUNE, 1936

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Heavy shipments of iron ore, grain and coal raised the total tonnage through the canals during June to 7,805,299 tons as against 5,708,966 tons in 1935. The increase in iron ore was 2,531,549 tons, or 58 per cent, wheat increased by 1,333,093 bushels, or 12 per cent, and soft coal by 111,461 tons, or 6 per cent.

Welland Ship Canal: Total traffic using the canal in June amounted to 1,443,765 tons, or 371,724 tons over the June, 1935, traffic. Wheat shipments increased from 146,732 tons to 306,397 tons, or by 109 per cent, wood pulp increased from 36,305 tons to 65,424 tons, soft coal from 390,023 tons to 414,293 tons, and iron ore from 50,433 tons to 103,339 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals: Freight traffic using the canals during June increased from 882,062 tons in 1935 to 1,207,134 tons, wheat being heavier by 192,643 tons, wood pulp by 22,513 tons, pulpweed by 28,018 tons, soft coal by 35,808 tons, and iron ore by 13,573 tons.
