SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC

AUGUST, 1936

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and Universitates Locks: Continued heavy shipments of iron ore and coal through the locks more than offset declines in wheat and total traffic increased from 7,731,060 tons last year to 10,698,836 tons in August this year. Iron ore downbound increased from 4,801,324 tons to 7,774,249 tons and wheat decreased from 38,722,817 bushels to 14,541,920 bushels. Total traffic from the opening of navigation amounted to 40,231,539 tons, as against 29,164,925 tons for the corresponding period in 1935.

Welland Ship Canal: Wheat shipments during August declined by 46 per cent, or 121,716 tons, and corn declined by 28,428 tons, but gasolene increased by 73,085 tons, oils by 21,341 tons, wood pulp by 10,685 tons, iron ore by 47,011 tons and other ore by 29,172 tons, bringing the total up to 1,366,387 tons as against 1,333,873 tons in 1935.

St. Lawrence Canals: Total traffic using the canals amounted to 1,060,225 tons, or 36,541 tons more than in August 1935. All grains recorded decreases, corn leading with a decline of 24,344 tons. Pulpwood was also down by 27,450 tons, but gasolene increased by 13,118 tons, coke by 22,517 tons, iron ore by 16,171 tons and other ore by 15,926 tons. Up to the end of August, 1936 traffic was heavier than 1935 traffic by 762,807 tons, or 19 per cent.
