SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC



Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Down-bound iron ore through the canals decreased from 7,641,262 tons in October last year to 7,064,571 tons, wheat dropped from 30,412,717 bushels to 10,503,591 bushels, but other grains increased from 5,374,114 bushels to 10,503,591 bushels. Coal and other up-bound freight also decreased and the total in both directions declined from 10,789,338 tons to 9,841,735 tons.

Welland Ship Canal. Despite a decrease in wheat shipments of 87,688 tons, or 2,922,933 bushels, and of 35,002 tons of corn, 31,795 tons of coke, 36,266 tons of other ore, 13,432 tons of wood pulp, and small decreases in several other commodities, the total traffic using the canal during October increased from 1,645,246 tons last year to 1,697,098 tons. This was the largest tounage to date handled by the canal in a month, the October 1936 tonnage being the previous high record. The large increases over last year were: barley, 63,463 tons; soft coal, 81,854 tons; and iron ore, 88,636 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals; Total traffic using the canals dropped from 1,385,546 tons in 1936 to 1,212,795 tons. Barley increased by 35,267 tons and rye by 6,994 tons, but all other grains decreased, wheat by 210,516 tons, corn by 56,412 tons, flaxseed by 7,854 tons, and oats by 597 tons. Pulpwood was heavier by 20,876 tons, but wood pulp decreased by 15,268 tons. Soft coal, gasolene and other oils were heavier by 48,932 tons, 19,214 tons, and 25,009 tons respectively.
