SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC

MAY, 1937

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Freight passed through the Canadian and United States locks at Sault Ste. Marie during May increased from 8,710,053 tons in 1936 to 14,109,494 tons in 1937, iron ore increasing from 4,955,413 tons to 10,417,307 tons and soft coal from 2,000,660 tons to 2,528,091 tons. Grain shipments were light, wheat dropping from 28,938,415 bushels to 12,752,437 bushels and other grains from 11,622,446 bushels to 5,646,040 bushels.

Welland Ship Canal: Increases in shipments of corn and flaxseed of 123,262 and 22,988 tons partially offset decreases of 48,717 tons of barley, 16,648 tons of oats and 105,018 tons of wheat. Iron ore was up by 69,950 tons, sand and gravel by 37,638 tons, coke by 11,433 tons, gasoline by 17,727 tons and the total of all freight by 4,707 tons, increasing from 1,618,135 tons in May last year to 1,622,842 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals: Shipments of soft coal were heavier than in 1936 by 73,922 tons, coke by 43,167 tons, corn by 135,255 tons, flaxseed by 24,106 tons and eight other commodities showed smaller increases but light shipments of other grains, especially wheat, and decreases in wood pulp, pulpwood, hard coal and other commodities reduced the total tons of freight from 1,300,182 tons in 1936 to 1,244,208 tons.
