SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC


JULY, 1937

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Freight passing through the locks during July increased from 10,950,758 tons in 1936 to 14,137,093 tons due largely to a heavy movement of iron ore which increased from 7,591,085 tons last year to 11,208,235 tons. Shipments of wheat dropped from 13,338,352 bushels to 5,822,967 bushels and other grain from 5,155,213 bushels to 1,757,710 bushels.

Welland Ship Canal: Total traffic using the canal amounted to 1,633,591 tons as against 1,320,511 tons in 1936. The increases in corn of 294,432 tons more than offset decreases in barley, cats, wheat, other grains and flour. Other large increases were iron - pig and bloom, 24,274 tons, iron and steel 15,996 tons and soft coal 125,524 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals: Total freight using the canals increased from 997,153 tons in July 1936 to 1,285,873 tons. Wheat was lighter than last year by 36,120 tons, flour by 12,130 tons, wood pulp by 14,733 tons, pulpwood 14,384 tons, hard coal by 32,536 tons and iron ore by 21,236 tons, but corn increased by 294,671 tons, gasoline by 18,234 tons, iron - pig and bloom, by 19,407 tons, iron and steel, other, by 14,338 tons and soft coal by 64,216 tons.
