SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC

SEPTEMBER, 1937.

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Continued heavy shipment of iron ore down the canal was the chief factor in increasing total traffic through the canals from 11,041,096 tons last year to 12,585,095 tons. Wheat shipments declined by 9,170,128 bushels, or 33 per cent, other grains increased by 2,787,220 bushels, or 43 per cent, and iron ore increased by 2,065,093 tons, or 26 per cent. Up-bound traffic, largely coal, declined from 1,925,315 tons to 1,581,775 tons.

Welland Ship Canal: Wheat shipments through the canal decreased by 144,060 tons, or 37 per cent, and flour declined by 13,358 tons, sugar by 16,059 tons, wood pulp by 14,653 tons and coke by 20,133 tons, but barley, corn and rye showed substantial gains. Also, gasolene and oil, iron, pig and bloom, iron and steel, coal and ores increased substantially. Total traffic amounted to 1,566,447 tons, as compared with 1,406,502 tons in September last year, and was the heaviest September traffic in the history of the canal.

St. Lawrence Canals: Total freight using the canals amounted to 1,303,993 tons which was the heaviest September traffic on record and October last year with a total of 1,385,546 tons is the only month to show a greater tonnage. The decrease from September, 1936, in wheat of 110,070 tons was more than offset by gains in barley of 87,024 tons, in corn of 36,331 tons and in rye of 14,301 tons. Soft coal also increased by 111,644 tons and iron ore, other ores, sand, gravel and stone were substantially heavier than last year.
