## SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC

## NOVWEBER, 1938

<u>Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks</u>: Total freight traffic through the canals for November increased to 4,466,103 tons from 3,938,979 tons in 1937. Wheat increased from 27,075,960 bushels to 38,715,927 bushels, iron ore from 1,583,752 tons to 1,651,167 tons, soft coal from 773,955 tons to 957,803 tons, and oil and gasolene from 89,504 tons to 106,726 tons.


Welland Ship Canal: Total freight traffic amounted to 1,651,241 tons which, although below October tonnage, was the heaviest November traffic on record. Last year 1,226,950 tons used the canal. Corn, wheat, iron and steel, and soft coal all showed substantial increases over last year, especially wheat which was up by 278,184 tons, or 9,272,800 bushels. Without the December traffic, a new record for a year has been established at 12,449,543 tons. Last year the total for the season was 11,747,950 tons.

<u>St. Lawrence Canals</u>: Due mainly to heavy wheat shipments, total freight using the canals increased from 989,456 tons in November last year to 1,064,788 tons. Wheat was heavier than in 1937 by 150,761 tons, corn by 21,211 tons, other grains by 12,240 tons, and flour by 12,136 tons. Barley, oats, rye, and flaxseed all showed decreases. Wood pulp was down by 9,966 tons, pulpwood by 24,810 tons, soft coal by 49,369 tons, and iron ore by 24,451 tons.
