
SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC AUGUST, 1938

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Freight through the canals increased to 6,236,574 tons from 5,551,693 tons in July, but was 55 per cent lighter than in August last year. The main factor in this large decrease was a drop of 7,781,110 tons in iron ore. Wheat shipments increased from 6,993,481 bushels last year to 10,495,851 bushels and other grains from 3,430,382 bushels to 10,920,699 bushels.


Welland Ship Canal: Total freight traffic decreased from 1,612,075 tons in 1937 to 1,587,958 tons, only a few commodities showing increases. Corn was heavier by 179,183 tons, barley by 37,994 tons, and iron ore by 16,851 tons, but wheat declined by 27,638 tons, soft coal by 111,002 tons, and petroleum and oils by 28,131 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals: Due mainly to decreases in wheat shipments of 62,853 tons and soft coal of 96,757 tons the total freight tonnage declined from 1,332,778 tons in August, 1937, to 1,214,526 tons. The only large increases were barley, 37,058 tons, and corn, 132,110 tons.
