SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC OCTOBER, 1939.

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Traffic through the locks at Sault Ste. Marie during October increased from 7,140,573 tons last year to 12,352,986 tons, iron ore increasing from 3,817,015 tons to 9,432,877 tons. Wheat shipments declined from 46,216,958 bushels to 22,568,318 bushels and other grains from 12,233,446 bushels to 8,997,761 bushels.

Welland Ship Canal: Light grain shipments reduced the traffic through the Welland Ship Canal from 2,029,660 tons in 1938 to 1,748,034 tons, a decrease of 281,626 tons. Wheat declined by 404,855 tons, barley by 42,413 tons, corn by 71,450 tons and oats by 18,972 tons. Wood pulp decreased by 36,895 tons but pulpwood increased by 34,104 tons and soft coal was heavier by 132,798 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals: Total traffic using the canals for October declined to 1,215,467 tons from 1,429,242 tons in 1938, a decrease of 213,775 tons. Wheat shipments dropped from 613,644 tons to 178,024 tons, barley declined by 42,547 tons, oats by 16,177 tons, gasolene by 21,562 tons, wood pulp by 22,733 tons and hard coal by 27,717 tons. Corn increased by 56,806 tons, other grains by 39,923 tons, pulpwood by 40,435 tons and soft coal by 210,990 tons.
